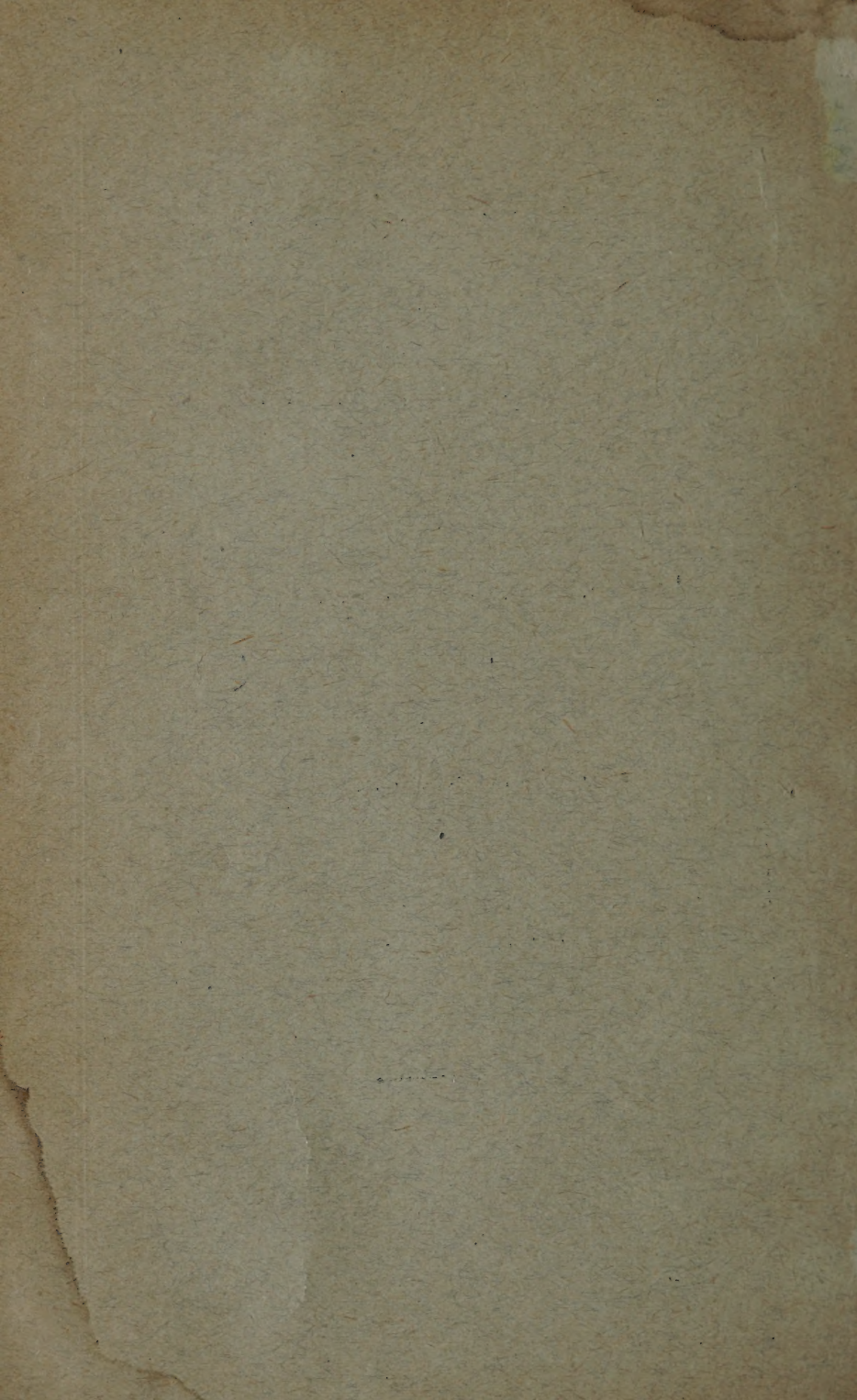

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

{ L.S. }

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third. To choose three Trustees to administer the Trust Funds of the town. One for one year, one for two years, and one for three years, agreeably to the provisions of Chapter 162, laws of 1915, of the state of New Hampshire.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town or act thereon.

Eighth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Ninth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital, or act thereon.

Tenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association, or act thereon.

Eleventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

Twelfth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of "An Act to provide for State Aid and for the permanent improvement of Main Highways throughout the State" approved February 24, 1905, or act thereon.

Thirteenth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of "An Act in Amendment of Section 8, Chapter 35 of the Laws of 1905 and Section 20 of Chapter 155 of Laws of 1909 relating to maintenance of Highways," approved April 15, 1911, or act thereon.

Fourteenth. To determine the division of the school money.

Fifteenth. To hear the reports of the Auditors and the Town School Board.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground, or act thereon.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars to hire a playground at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

Eighteenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Nineteenth. To see if the town will vote to direct and instruct its officials to construct and build a sidewalk during the year 1916, on the west side of Hanover street from its junction with Summer street to a

point opposite the front entrance of the residence of Alfred Densmore and to raise money therefor, or act thereon.

REPORT OF PROBATION OFFICER

August 1915 to February 1916

Appointed as required by state law under the provisions of Chapter 125, Laws of 1907, Public Statutes of New Hampshire, commonly called the Juvenile Court Act, and working under the supervision and direction of the State Board of Charities and Correction and under the jurisdiction of the Court.

Eight girls and nine boys under seventeen years of age were placed under observation without being brought before the Court for examination.

Five girls and fourteen boys under seventeen years of age were brought before the Court for juvenile delinquency and were investigated according to the Juvenile Court Law.

Five girls and nine boys have been placed upon Probation by the Court.

Six delinquent and neglected children from twelve to sixteen years of age were placed in private families; one in Enfield, one in Lyme, one in Lebanon, one in Brattleboro, one in Bardon and one in Sharon.

Two boys sent to the State Industrial School after a hearing upon petition of their parents.

In connection herewith I have arrested one minor for being drunk and two adults for furnishing liquor to a minor. I have visited pool rooms and moving picture theaters and notified them of the law regarding the age of minors not permitted in such places. I have presented nineteen petitions, served nineteen summons and eight subpoenas; traveled 26 miles to place a homeless and neglected child and made my monthly report to the State Board of Charities and Corrections as required by the Juvenile Court Law. In all these matters I have first consulted the State Board of Charities and Corrections and acted on their advice.

REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH

During the past year there has been the usual small number of contagious diseases in Lebanon. In Lebanon village seven cases of scarlet fever were reported, also two mild cases of infantile paralysis. In West Lebanon there were three cases of diphtheria.

The town has been remarkably free from typhoid fever, only one mild case having been reported. Frequent analyses of the water used in Lebanon have been made and they show our water supply to be one of the best in the state.

To that fact probably can be attributed the freedom from gastro-intestinal diseases which the entire town has enjoyed.

Many complaints have been made during the past year regarding hog pens and sewer connections. During the coming year more stringent rules will be adopted regarding the keeping of hogs in the compact portions of the town. Also whenever it is possible all houses and water closets must be connected with the sewer.

Complaints have been made against the use of the common drinking cup in society halls. The attention of the officers of all societies is called to the law regarding the matter and they should do away with the common cup and if possible substitute a supply of sanitary drinking cups for use in their halls.

Beginning with the school term in September the law regarding vaccination will be rigidly enforced in both High and Grammar Schools. At the present time there are pupils attending school who have not complied with the law. The State Board of Health allows all such pupils until Sept. 1, 1916 to attend to the matter,

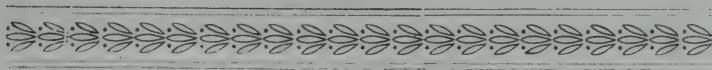
