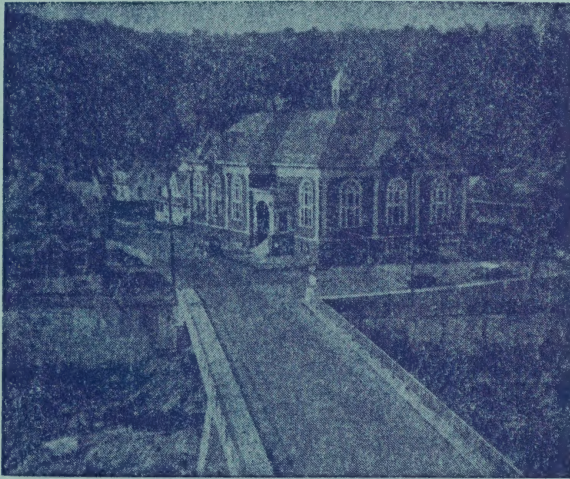

# TOWN MEETING WARRANT

## The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lisbon Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the tenth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects, all except 1, to be considered at seven-thirty in the afternoon.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To hear reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriation for the same as set forth in the following budget.

5. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan service in any class or classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid such service is less than \$50.00.
6. To see if the Town will vote to repair the footbridge over the Ammonoosuc River and raise and appropriate the amount of \$15,000.00 for this purpose, said sum to be raised by borrowing said \$15,000.00 by the issuance of serial notes to be paid over a period to exceed five (5) years.
7. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Oregon Road from the Perch Pond turn to the Lyman town line and from the Lyman town line to the drive leading to the Hucksoil residence. This road to be discontinued subject to gates and bars.
8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from the former Sweeney Place to the Littleton town line. This road to be discontinued subject to gates and bars.
9. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road from the former Pike place to the Landaff town line. This road to be discontinued subject to gates and bars.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 (Five Hundred Dollars) to be used clearing and building additional lots in the Grove Hill Cemetery.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1,500.00 (Fifteen Hundred Dollars) to purchase a new police cruiser.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not exceed \$6,400.00 (Sixty-four Hundred Dollars) to purchase a new truck and snow attachment.
13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a one-half interest in a dump truck from the Grove Hill Cemetery Association and to expend from surplus funds an amount not to exceed \$500.00.
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,000.00 (One Thousand Dollars) for a road-side mowing machine.
15. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 (Six Hundred Dollars) to be used toward the operation of the Information Booth in the Town of Lisbon to be sponsored by the Lisbon Chamber of Commerce.
16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dismantle and remove the footbridge.
17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT

The department was called upon 57 times this past year, of which 18 calls were general alarms.

We gave assistance to other departments three times, under the Mutual Aid Program and two calls were made to Landaff.

Calls included the following:

- 21 house or building fires
- 3 chimney fires
- 8 brush or grass fires
- 3 oil burner fires
- 1 automobile
- 1 trailer fire
- 5 cleaning hydrants
- 7 truck maintenance
- 3 truck repair
- 5 investigations & building inspections

Property and household losses amounted to approximately \$36,200.00 in the Town of Lisbon.

In responding to any alarm the fear of personal injury is always present. It is with our deep regrets that we have to report on death this past year due to fire.

Your department members, this past year again participated in a course offered by the State of New Hampshire in fire service training under the direction of the Board of Fire Control.

This makes a total of eight courses that have been taken since 1964. A total of 196 hours are represented in these eight courses.

This past year the department purchased 8 new pair of fire boots, a few hundred dollars worth of hose, a 1000 gallon portable fold-a-tank, high pressure fog nozzles and a few small tools.

The Lisbon department extends its fire protection to the towns of Landaff, Lyman and to parts of Sugar Hill and Bath. Both Sugar Hill and Bath are members of the Mutual Aid system while Landaff and Lyman are billed for these calls.

The fire fighting service is becoming a more scientific operation as the years progress, and the members of your department are trying to keep us with the changes and adapt themselves to the present trend. The courses offered by the State of New Hampshire in fire service training have played a major role in adapting the members to these situations. We know that the new piece of apparatus that we are receiving will play an important part in our fire defences.

Destructive fires took a toll of 12,100 lives in the United States in 1968, of which residential fires were responsible for an estimated 6,600 persons. One third or approximately 2,200 of these being children. Eight hundred of these children were alone or without proper supervision at the time fire struck. Property damage due to fire in 1968 is estimated at 2.25 billion dollars, this being the second year in a row that fire losses totaled over 2 billion dollars.

Fires in the nation totaled 2,400,000 in 1968. The number of fires per one thousand population is 12, and the fire deaths per million population is approximately 60. These figures were released by the National Fire Protection Association.

Again as in the past the Lisbon Fire Department wishes to extend a thank you for the help and goodwill by the townspeople when we sponsor the annual horse show.

With the funds received from this summer project we have purchased and repaired equipment and are now saving the money to go towards a new fire station.

We thank you all for the cooperation we have received.

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1969 fire season was a quiet one in this area. Frequent rains kept the danger to a minimum and there were few violations. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

### Fire Permit

A **fire permit** is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be **prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.**

### Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

### Penalties

1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland maximum fine of \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.
