THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Warner in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L. s.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Warner on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the purpose of publicizing the natural advantages of the Town, in connection with the other towns in Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust in the Town, in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the expenses of observing the Home Coming of our Veterans.

6. To see what action the Town will take to permit the showing of Moving Pictures after two o'clock in the afternoon on Sunday in accordance with Chapter 448 Section 5 of the Revised Laws as amended Chapter 49, Section 1, Laws of 1943.

7. To see if the Town will vote to rescind that part of the motion passed at the March 1944 Town Meeting, relative to the \$1,000.00 set aside for the improvement of Kearsarge St. Extension.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or appropriate from existing Capital Funds, the sum of \$1,000.00, in addition to the amount previously appropriated for the purpose of reconstructing the Town Highway which is the entrance to Pine Grove Cemetery.

9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in re-appraising the taxable property in the Town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the Town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money on notes of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

11. To hear reports of Officers of the Town heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

From the above it will be seen that the average membership has increased by about 26 pupils, the percent of attendance has improved and the amount of tardiness diminished. One of the greatest needs of the district at the present time is a place for teachers to live. Several of the teachers of the district have told me that they will accept no position here unless they are certain of a good place to live. Conditions in this respect are more acute in Warner than in other nearby towns. If the district wants teachers it would do well to take definite action at the annual March meeting to provide living room for its teachers next year. In addition to this teachers as well as others are affected by the sharp increase in the cost of living. In at least one town of the state there was talk of a strike. In other districts teachers have demanded special meetings for the purpose of raising money for a bonus to be paid each teacher. In general a bonus of \$200-\$400 has been asked, and in some places already paid. The teachers of this district are willing to wait until the annual meeting in March for action of the voters in alleviating their financial situation.

If these conditions are met as they should be there will of necessity be a considerable increase in the school budget. The only hope of avoiding a much higher tax rate than the already very high rate in Warner lies in the passage of a law for increased state aid to school districts. A bill for such a law is now before the Legislature. According to the plan submitted by Commissioner Fuller the share for Warner under last year's conditions would be \$7,406.49. The amount recommended by the Interim Commission of the Legislature is considerably larger than this. Everyone interested in the welfare of the district should use whatever influence he has to get one of these plans for adequate State Aid made into a law.

FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES—IT PAYS !

Prevention is one of the most important phases of all fire effort. This is particularly true of forest fire control work. Preventing forest fires preserves valuable forest growths and other property, conserves man power and permits their use in productive channels, saves taxpayers' money and conserves fire fighting equipment.

The prevention of forest fires is the most important and difficult part of the work of your forest fire warden who heads a local organization set up primarily for the security of your community's forest property. Appointed by the State Forester, upon recommendation of the Selectmen, he is charged by law with the responsibility of local administration of forest fire laws, fire prevention and suppression. In his work he is aided by deputy forest fire wardens who, in emergency, may assume his power and authority. The warden is guided in his work by instructions received from the State Forester and by the District Fire Chief who represents the State Forester.

The importance and value of the work of the forest fire warden and his deputies is, perhaps, best appreciated during hazardous periods when fire danger is greatest. The public, however, looks to him at all times for speedy and economical suppression of going fires.

To properly fulfill his mission, the warden needs the generous and understanding cooperation of the public at large. He attempts to secure this cooperation by the posting of caution notices, news items and by word of mouth, always carefully explaining the necessity of restrictions imposed. In the matter of giving cooperation, however, the public often fails. The record shows that an average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned over by forest fires in New Hampshire each year. Analysis of fire causes reveal the fact that more than 98 percent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable.

The careless smoker fails to properly extinguish his cigar, cigarette or pipe ashes or thoughtlessly throws them from the car window; the debris burner fails or refuses to consult the warden, as the law requires when the ground is not covered with snow, before attempting to burn; campers fail to properly extinguish their fires or frequently build fires when conditions are unfavorable.

The elimination of human causes from the forest fire problem is the answer. This is not as difficult of accomplishment as it might appear at first glance. Let each one who reads this—

1. Use ordinary common sense with fire in and near woodland.
2. Comply with requirements on the use of fire in and near woodland and when the ground is not covered with snow, secure written permission to burn from the forest fire warden.
3. Be careful when smoking in or near woodlands. Don't throw lighted material from moving vehicles.
4. Cooperate with and assist the warden and urge others to do so.
5. HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES—his efforts are only as effective as is the cooperation you give him!
