WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Warren, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1st—To choose by ballot and Major. vote, a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

2nd—To choose by ballot and Major. vote, a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

3rd—To choose by ballot and Major. vote, three Selectmen for the ensuing year.

4th—To choose by ballot and Major. vote a Road Agent or Agents for the ensuing year.

5th—To choose all other necessary Town Officers and Agents.

6th—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges.

7th—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of highways and bridges, and how appropriate the same.

8th—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of cemeteries in Town.

9th—To see if the Town will vote to distribute the inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.

10th—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of public library.

11th—To hear the reports of committees or agents here-to-fore chosen.

12th—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for town hall and street lights.

13th—To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid in building highways.

14th—To see if the Town will vote to raise one hundred dollars for supplies for the fire department in said Town.

15th—To see if the Town will vote to sell a lot on the easterly side of highway near the tomb to any party desiring to build a family vault, and to choose a committee to sell and deed the same.

16th—To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money not exceeding fifty (\$50.) dollars, the same to be expended under the direction of the Warren Board of Trade, for the purpose of advertising the natural attractions of the Town and inducing new business enterprises to locate here.

17th—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Warren Board of Trade to promise exemption from taxation for a term of ten years to such new business enterprises as may contemplate locating in the Town of Warren.

18th—To see if the Town will vote to throw up the Warren and Woodstock road from the dwelling house of William McVetty to the town line.

19th—To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

THE SCHOOLS

TO THE CITIZENS OF WARREN SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Your School Board has worked faithfully and to the best of their ability for the interest and advancement of the schools in town. Have maintained schools at Warren Summit, East Warren, Ore Hill and Warren Village. The school at the village will have thirty-six weeks, the others thirty-one.

We were pleased that we succeeded in our efforts to have our two years' course of High School approved by the State Superintendent, believing that it is a long step in the right direction and means much for the best interests of our young people and our town. State Superintendent H. C. Morrison was very kind and helpful in advising about the work. The state program of studies is being followed in the four rooms at the Village school, making the work uniform in all the grades, and is also used in the other schools as far as practical.

We wish to thank the Womans' Club for their generous donation of five dollars toward the purchase of a typewriter for the High School; Mr. F. C. Clement for adding books to the library for the High School; Mr. C. E. Caswell who gave five dollars, and others who helped to get a new up-to-date dictionary for the school; and last but by no means least, Rev. W. A. Loyne for his interest in and kindly visits to all the schools in town.

Another thing of importance accomplished this year was the building of new sanitary closets at the Village school house.

CLAUSE FROM THE SCHOOL LAWS, IN REGARD TO STATE AID:—"When any district shall employ graduates from a New Hampshire Normal School, or any Normal School in another state of equivalent grade, or persons holding a permanent New Hampshire State Teachers' Certificate, it shall receive a further sum of two dollars per week for every teacher so employed." We have three teachers holding such certificates and expect to have more next year.

The roof of the Village school house must be repaired. (See article in Warrant.) The building, including new closets, should be painted inside and out, to keep it in good condition.

We would be glad if parents would visit the schools, and as far as possible see that the children attend regularly.

CLAUSE FROM SCHOOL LAWS, IN REGARD TO SCHOOL MONEY:—"The School Board of each district, in their annual report, shall state in detail the sums of money which will be required during the ensuing fiscal year for the purchase of text books, scholars supplies, flags, appurtenances, and for the payment of tuition of scholars of the district in High Schools and Academies, and for the payment of all other statutory obligations of the district."
