

BRISTOL TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bristol in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Bristol on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee, and raise and appropriate the sums set forth therein to be raised by taxation.
- 4. To choose a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
- 5. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this Town?"
- 6. Shall the Town of Bristol continue to maintain its existing Municipal Court so long as its present Judge remains in office?

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to file in behalf of the Town an application (in form and manner required by the United States and in conformity with P.L. 560, 83rd Congress) and do whatever else may be required for an advance in the amount of \$39,000.00, to be made by the United States to the Town of Bristol, New Hampshire, to aid in defraying the cost of final plan preparation for sewerage and sewage treatment facilities for the Town of Bristol, New Hampshire, and further, to see if the Town will make the necessary arrangements to provide such additional funds as may be required to defray the cost of final preparation.
- 8. T₄ see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available in the construction of a sewerage disposal system; and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$326,000, for the purpose of financing and constructing a municipal sewage disposal system, including sewerage, interceptors, pumping stations, treatment works, and such other related facilities inclusive of land acquisition, easements and rights of way as are required, such sum to be raised by the issuance of \$326,000 in Serial Bonds under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 33 of the New Hampshire Statutes Annotated 1955 and any amendments thereto) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds and to determine the rate

of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds, as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Bristol, and pass any vote relating thereto, provided, however, that no bonds shall be issued and no portion of the appropriation hereinbefore made shall be committed or used until a Federal grant in aid equal to not less than fifty percent of the cost of the sewage disposal project, other than the cost of acquiring land or other interests in land, shall have first been received by the Town or agreed upon between the Town and the United States of America or any agency thereof.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$15,000 for the purchase of a new tank truck, pumper and associated equipment for the use of the Fire Department, to raise said sum by borrowing on the credit of the Town through the issuance of serial notes or bonds, said notes or bonds to be signed by the Selectmen, countersigned by the Treasurer and sealed with the Town Seal, and delegate to the Selectmen the discretion of fixing that date, maturities, denominations, interest or discount rate, the place of payment, the form and other details of said bonds or notes and providing for the sale thereof.
- 11. If the Town votes to purchase a new tank truck, pumper and associated equipment as contemplated by article 10 in its present or any amended form, to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or otherwise dispose of the 1929 Seagrave Pumper now in the service of the Fire Department for such terms as the Selectmen shall deem to be in the best interests of the Town.

- 12. To see if the Town will vote to employ the State Tax Commission to make the annual audit of the Town's Accounts; to dispense with the services of the Town Auditors. This vote to stand until rescinded.
- To see if the Town will vote to use the accumulated interest of the Proctor Capital Reserve Fund to improve the Parking facilities at the Town Lot.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- To transact any other business that may legally come before said Meeting. Polls close six P.M.

We now have our share of the Shieling books on the shelves. We are still in the buying group with Franklin, Tilton, Belmont and Canterbury which gives us an additional six percent buying power. We hope you approve and appreciate the new interior paint job and tiled floor. The exterior woodwork now needs paint and we are asking for a modest amount to cover this cost. We have used library money to install a telephone and refinish two chairs and a table. Also we have had to renew some of the electrical wiring.

BRISTOL MUNICIPAL COURT

During the year 1963 there were 160 criminal cases entered in Bristol Municipal Court. One was a felony and probable cause was found to hold the defendant for Superior Court. One hundred fifty-nine misdemeanors made up the remainder of the criminal cases. Five of these were town ordinance and stop sign violations. Five were fish and game violations, and four were prosecuted by the Employment Security Division. The remainder were traffic violations.

Ten civil cases were entered in court and disposed of. Nine Juvenile cases were entered and two were disposed of, seven cases are pending.

The 1963 Legislature passed the District Court Bill which will make a radical change in the New Hampshire municipal courts. Under this new set up Bristol residents will have to go to Plymouth, as Bristol is in the Plymouth District.

The Legislature made the provision that the towns could vote at the 1964 annual Town Meeting to retain their Municipal Court until the retirement of its present Judge.

Once again I must turn to all sections of the Newfound Region when the list of recreation supporters is compiled. Without the continued faith of our many friends, volunteers, churches, industry, service organizations, school departments and administrators, the task of providing a large and varied program of recreation would be unsurmountable. Credit must be extended to all individuals and organizations who frequent the Community Center for various events. Because of their willingness to cooperate, close scheduling can be accomplished with a minimum of hardship to all concerned.

Because of their annual contributions of land and equipment, we tend to forget the wonderful cooperation we receive from N. H. Morrison & Sons; Mr. and Mrs. Morton Cavis for the water-front property; the Slim Baker Fund for Outdoor Living, Inc. for the 125 acres of land to conduct the summer day camp program; Curtis Mooney, Raymond Morrill, and Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Huntoon, for the Turnpike Ski Area. To these people go the deepest appreciation from not only the Recreation Department, but from all friends of recreation in the Newfound Region.

Each year a record is kept of meetings held at the Community Center. They are divided into two categories consisting of department sponsored events and those sponsored by clubs and organizations. During 1963 recreation sponsored meetings totaled 979 and non-recreation schedulings added up to 891. These figures compare with 893 and 836 for 1962. Forty different groups met at the Community Center during the twelve month period with the majority scheduled from September to May. Total participant attendance has climbed to over 36,000 which is the third consecutive substantial increase.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to present this brief report, the last of a Superintendent to the Bristol School District, as such. The voters of the District are to be congratulated on the spirit which has made the Newfound Area a truly cooperative School District.

Several improvements have been made in the schools during the past year. Curtains have been hung at the south windows of the High School gymnasium. Fluorescent lights have been installed in the last classroom in the Elementary School. We have painted more rooms in this building and replaced old water pipes and toilet flushing mechanisms. A small lot adjacent to the Elementary School has been purchased but has not yet been developed.

We have introduced a new method of teaching reading. Based on phonics, but with a new approach, this system can be used with any series of reading books. Our experience so far indicates that pupils will have larger vocabularies, will read faster and understand better that which they read.

Modern mathematics is now being taught in the first three grades and is being included in the content of the high school curriculum.

The situation at Memorial High School is a trying one. The school is badly overcrowded, with rooms too full and substandard areas being used for classrooms. The noise and confusion of construction adds no little to the problems of teachers and pupils alike. We can only say with some sports fans, "Just wait until next year."

I want to thank the members of the School Boards with whom I have worked. Their cooperation and devotion to the welfare of the children of the community are deeply appreciated.
