You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the 4th day of March, next at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to fix the compensation of all town officers as recommended by the Selectmen.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1,000.00 for the Chichester Library Building Fund, and to transfer said sum to Capital Reserve Fund.

5. To see if the Town will vote to join the Concord Regional Visiting Nurse Association for the purpose of providing nursing and therapeutic services at home and other health programs for all residents of the Town, and to raise and appropriate not more than \$1,500.00 therefor. (Based on \$1.25 per capita)

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$2,000.00 as the Town's share of the cost of hiring two men to operate the Center Barnstead ambulance during daytime hours only. (At the request of the Barnstead Fire Department.)

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$742.80 for the continuation of services



to the low-income residents of Chichester through the Suncook Area Center of the Community Action Program, Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc. *Yes*

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$446.00 for support of the Concord Hospital. (At the request of the Hospital.) *Yes*

9. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the non partisan ballot system in Town elections. *Yes*

10. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a filing fee of \$10.00 per candidate for any office should Article 9 be passed. *Passed not yet*

11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt absentee voting at any annual or special Town Meeting. *passed over*

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of current year taxes. *Yes*

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$20,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a tax map as required by State law. *Passed over*

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$20,000.00 and authorize the Selectmen to issue serial notes, payable in equal installments in the years 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979 and 1980. This sum to be used for the construction of a tax map as required by State law. *passed over*

15. To see if the Town will vote to designate Blackman Road, so called, as a scenic road under RSA:586, Laws of New Hampshire. *Yes*

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for study of refuse disposal alternatives. *Yes*

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$15,000.00 and transfer this

sum to Capital Reserve, to be known as the Refuse Disposal Fund.

REPORT TO TOWNS

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT 1974-1975 CHICHESTER, NEW HAMPSHIRE

We are now settled in our new Supervisory Union No. 53 which includes Pembroke, Allenstown, Deerfield, Epsom, and Chichester. Mr. Gerald Croteau, our Superintendent of Schools, and his staff have shown interest in solving problems relating to us. Our principal and teaching staff are receiving assistance they have not had which gives your school board a more positive feeling about our ever changing educational system.

A great deal of effort has been put into improving our reading program. This year we have a much more concentrated program in grades one, two and three. Reports to us are positive and this has come about mainly because of a staff that is interested in our students and the extra dollars you have been willing to spend.

We are hoping to have a speech therapist one day a week next year. This person will work with students who have a problem in sounding certain letters. There is a need for this service and we are assured that students will benefit from such a program.

We were sorry to lose our head cook, Mrs. Carol Anderson, who resigned during the summer to take a full-time job. Interested people in town applied for the position and Mrs. Pauline Reed was hired. Both Mrs. Reed and Mrs. Mabel Stevens are trying to put a nutritious meal out daily for the lowest possible cost to each student. With the rising cost of food today we are sure their effort is appreciated by many.

Mr. Fowler and the teaching staff are most appreciative for allowing us to hire a part-time secretary. Interested people applied for the position and Mrs. June Hatch was hired. She works four hours per day for one hundred eighty days.

We are fortunate to have such a well kept school building. We have observed other school buildings and ours rates very well in all respects. Many thanks to our custodian, staff members, and interested students for trying to take good care of our investment.

Our budget has increased and much of the increase is beyond our control. We have tried to hold the line or even do with less in certain areas. Your school board members are concerned about the taxes and we are very much aware of what the school budget means to our tax rate.

With regret, the School Board accepted the resignation of one of its members, Roger V. Nelson in August 1974, he was a conscientious member and we thank him for his services.

The Board appointed Richard Jackson to finish the remainder of the 1974-1975 term.

School opened in September with an enrollment of 199 students. All teachers returned and were assigned the following grades.

The primary grade children were broken up into four achievement levels in reading and math. This allows for greater personal contact with the teacher and therefore more acceleration. This program utilizes all four primary teachers in the morning. In the afternoon, the children are grouped into three grade levels. The fourth teacher then works with small groups and individuals, tutoring in math, reading, gross and fine motor coordination or testing for special learning problems.

For many years we have had a great need for evaluation of special students. Presently we have three good primary evaluators on the staff. Mrs. Sanborn, school readiness; Mrs. St. Germain, learning disabilities and Miss Hassett for general intelligence. By utilizing test-

ing results we hope to learn of any learning problems that a child may have at a younger age.

Three days a week, part of the afternoons are devoted to music, art and physical education. These subjects are taught by the current faculty at no extra cost.

The Title I program in Chichester is devoted to children with learning disabilities. Mrs. Elaine Coffey is the instructor and has helped several children.

The 5th and 6th Grade basketball team won the championship in the Merrimack Valley League last year. The success of our teams is a reflection upon the time and effort of Mr. Farnum, coach.

The school library is being utilized almost full time due to the staff of volunteers, Mrs. Sibbi Dane, chairman.

Mrs. June Hatch has been doing an excellent job of handling the school office which allows me more time to work with the staff and students.

Mrs. Dorris Grace was hired as school nurse to replace Mrs. Merrill, who resigned last June. The school health program has continued as in the past under her capable guidance.

In September, Mr. Farnum was selected by the School Board as Assistant Principal to cover supervision in my absence.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

While I have been associated with the Chichester School District for several years, this is my first report as Superintendent of Schools.

The latter part of the Spring term was given over to the usual activities involved with the closing of another school year. It was also a period in which we were quite busy with the organization staffing and the relocation of the new supervisory union office. Mrs. Sylvianne Martel, who has worked with me for the last several years as my secretary has remained in that capacity and proved to be of invaluable assistance in making the transition. The new bookkeeper and payroll clerk are Mrs. Claire Butler and Ms Louise Fanny respectively, Mr. Edmond Duchesne is the new Business Administrator. The office was moved from 100 Granite Street in Hooksett to Pembroke Street in Pembroke during the last week of June.

Since the beginning of school, we have been occupied with normal activities that are with us during every school year. We have continued to refine the budget preparation system in order that we might have more data to better account for the expenditures and efficient use of tax monies.

There are many areas wherein we need to improve our performance such as communication, curriculum revision, special services, student personnel services, etc. The longer that we are able to work together as a unit, the better will be our chances for success in the above-mentioned areas.

It is essential that we not lose sight of our basic duty to teach the essential skills of Reading, Writing and Arithmetic.

We must teach these skills in relation to the complex society that children will be entering; and must update the curriculum and teaching methods to keep pace with the ever changing requirements of children if they are to live and compete in our fluid society.

We must help children to become more independent learners. We must be more concerned with helping them to learn the thought process in order that they might be better equipped to solve occupational and personal problems. Children today are going to be faced with a society that will change even more rapidly than the one that we are presently living in if that is possible to even imagine. If they are going to be able to cope with this type of rapid change they must be independent and secure. The idea that the teaching of the thought process is one of the basic responsibilities of education is not a thought that has been brought to us by the progressive educational movement rather it is an idea as old as the Classical Greek and Roman Educators.

It is most essential that we not lose sight that we must help the individuals. This is not only a problem in Education. It is a problem in American society. We constantly talk about the rights and needs of the individual, and yet we seem to be constantly moving toward a society that is extremely impersonal, and the individual is lost in the masses.

In closing, I would like to thank the Chichester School Board, the School Staff and the citizens of the community for all that they have done for the Chichester children.
