THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Errol qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Old Town House in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools for the ensuing year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
5. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the public library for the ensuing year.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise money for the support of a high school, and how much.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on town debt.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise money to buy a piano for town hall and choose an agent to purchase same.

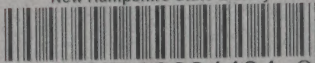
