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# Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

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## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

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{ L. S. }

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs.*

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third. To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds of the town for three years.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to construct and repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

Eighth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day or act thereon.

Ninth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital or act thereon.

Tenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association or act thereon.

Eleventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library or act thereon.

Twelfth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of An Act to provide for State Aid and for the permanent improvement of Main Highways throughout the State, approved Feb. 24, 1905, or act thereon.

Thirteenth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of An Act in Amendment of Section 8, Chapter 35, of the Laws of 1905, and Section 20 of Chapter 155 of Laws of 1909, relating to maintenance of Highways, approved April 15, 1911, or act thereon.

Fourteenth. To determine the division of the school money.

Fifteenth. To hear the report of the Auditors and the Town School Board.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollar to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground, or act thereon.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars to hire a playground at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

Eighteenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Nineteenth. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 172 of Laws of 1913, entitled "An Act to Protect the Youth of our State," or act thereon.

Twentieth. To see if the town will vote to build a sidewalk during the ensuing year on the easterly side of Water Street running from Mascoma Street at the Riverside Mill to the Spring Street Bridge, or act thereon.

Twenty-first. To see if the town will vote to lay a concrete walk from the railroad crossing near the so-called Jones place on the south side of Mascoma Street to intersect the walk at the Elliott place and raise money therefor, or act thereon.

Twenty-second. To see if the town will vote to purchase a motor truck for the street and highway department and raise money therefor, or act thereon.

Twenty-third. To see what action the town will take to improve the lighting system on the main streets in Lebanon Center Village and raise money therefor, or act thereon.

Twenty-fourth. To see what action the town will take in furnishing electric lights for the village of Mascoma.

Twenty-fifth. To see if the town will vote to have all the real estate of said town with description, names of owner with assessed value of same as it is on the town books, printed in pamphlet form for free distribution not later than Jan. 1st, 1918.

Twenty-sixth. To see if the town will vote to use the Australian ballot system at all town meetings hereafter.

Twenty-seventh. To see if the town will vote that no town official shall hold more than one office, either under the town, county, or state, at the same time.

## ABSTRACT FROM TOWN CLERK'S RECORD.

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At the annual meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March, 1916, at 10.18 o'clock in the forenoon, the meeting was called to order by Fred A. Jones, the moderator, who then read the warrant and proceeded to act upon the several articles of the warrant as follows:

For Town Clerk: Joseph C. Smith.

For Selectmen: Charles S. Ford, Thomas P. Waterman and Eugene B. Gerrish.

For Overseer of the Poor: Charles S. Ford.

For Highway Agent: O. Dan Lareau.

For Police: Leon F. Copp.

For Trustees of the Trust Funds: George A. Gardin for three years, William A. Churchill for two years, and Frederick H. Emerson for one year.

Voted: That all other necessary town officers be appointed by the selectmen.

Voted: To raise the sum of thirteen thousand dollars (\$13,000.00) to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Voted: To raise the sum of nine thousand dollars (\$9,000.00) to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Voted: To raise the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) for the construction and repair of sewers, and two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for the construction and repair of sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Voted: To raise the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00) for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town for the ensuing year and that Charles E. Marston,

Ernest E. Lavigne and Stephen H. Tilden be a committee for the supervision of the same.

Voted: To raise the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Voted: To raise the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the purpose of maintaining a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital in Hanover commencing April 1st, 1916. Said bed to be for the benefit and use of the legal residents of Lebanon and the assignment of the same to applicants to be left in the hands of the selectmen.

Voted: To raise the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.00) to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association.

Voted: To raise the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library.

Voted: That there be set aside out of the sum raised for the care and maintenance of highways under Article 5, the sum of thirty-five hundred eighty-eight and seventy-five one hundredths dollars (\$3,588.75) to enable the town to secure State Aid as provided by the provisions of "An Act to provide for State Aid and for the permanent improvement of Main Highways throughout the State." Approved February 24th, 1905.

Voted: To raise the sum of twenty-six hundred and fifty dollars (\$2,650.00) for trunk line maintenance, and the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for State Aid maintenance to enable the town to secure the benefits of the provisions of An Act in amendment of Section 8, Chapter 35, of the Laws of 1905, and Section 20 of Chapter 155 of Laws of 1909, relating to maintenance of highways. Approved April 15th, 1911.

Voted: That the school money be divided by valuations.

Voted: That the reports of the auditors and the town school board be accepted as printed.

Voted: To raise the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground.

Voted: To raise the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) to hire a playground at West Lebanon.

Voted: To raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for brass bands.

Voted: That the selectmen be instructed to construct and build a sidewalk during the year 1916 on the west side of Hanover Street from its junction with Summer Street to a point opposite the front entrance of the residence of Alfred Densmore.

A resolution was introduced and duly seconded "To see if the people will vote to pay all that work for town, or State work, \$2.25 per day." This resolution was lost.

A resolution was offered that the Australian ballot be used at the next town meeting, which was lost.

Voted: To adjourn.

## REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH

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During the past year Lebanon has lived up to its reputation of being the most sanitary large town in the state of New Hampshire. Two diseases, however, have been quite prevalent, namely, whooping cough and scarlet fever.

These were communicated mostly through the carelessness of the public in not reporting the diseases and taking the proper precautions to prevent their spread.

According to statistics 10,000 children die annually in the United States from whooping cough. Parents should therefore realize the great danger of exposing infants and young children to the disease. They should see that no cases of whooping cough be allowed to attend school, church or any public or private gathering. 5000 children die annually from scarlet fever in the United States, yet here in Lebanon there have been cases where the parents failed to report the disease in their families and have allowed the children to mingle with others and spread the disease. A little active cooperation on the part of the public will aid greatly in the prevention of these diseases. The public is requested report to the Board of Health all violations of the law pertaining to the distribution of milk in unclean vessels. Some of the bottles used have a decidedly swarthy Pittsburg complexion.
