Polls will be open from 10:00 A.M. until 7:00 P.M.

To the inhabitants of the TOWN OF CHICHESTER in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said CHICHESTER on Tuesday, the 2nd day of March next, at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following sugjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$640.00 for the support of the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. (Requested by the C.N.H.R.P.C.)
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$2100.00 as the Town's share of the cost of operating the Center Barnstead Ambulance Service during daytime hours only. (Requested by the Barnstead Fire Dept.)
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract with Planning Maps Inc., of Newport, N.H., for the construction of a Tax Map, as required by state law, and raise from current year taxes the sum not to exceed \$5618.25 as the first of four payments, to be made in 1976, 1977 1978 and 1979. The remaining payments to be raised by Town Meeting in each respective year.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$779.44 for continuation of services to the low income and elderly residents of Chichester through the Suncook Area Center of the Community Action Program.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1500.00 for the Support of the Concord Regional Visiting Nurse Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of current year taxes.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1000.00 for the Chichester Library Building Fund, and to transfer said sum to Capital Reserve. (At the request of the Library Trustees)
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$5000.00 for the purchase of sanding equipment for the Highway Department.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$500.00 to aid in defraying costs of insurance and equipment of the Chichester Summer Baseball Teams, to be apportioned as follows: \$250.00 for the "Little League Team" and \$250.00 for the "Indian League Team". (By petition)
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town assume ownership and maintenance of all old cemeteries where one or more are buried. The initial cost to be from the unused interest of the cemetary trust funds, which in 1975 were approximately \$6500.00. (By petition)
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of R.S.A. 154, as set forth by State law, pertaining to fire regulations. (Recommended by Town Counsel and the Fire Chief)
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1000.00 for the support of the Capitol Area Mutual Aid Fire Compact, Central Dispatch Center, and to contract with same for dispatching services for the Chichester Fire Department, This amount to be Chichester's share for 1976. (Requested by the Fire Chief)
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1000.00 to be placed in Capitol Reserve towards the purchase of a fire truck. (Requested by the Fire Chief)
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$2500.00 for the purchase of four inch hose and fittings for the fire department. (Requested by the Fire Chief)
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to reduce the Tax Collector's salary to \$1000.00 per year.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

All articles except 1 above will be taken up at 2:00 P.M., Saturday, March 6, 1976, at the Town Hall.

# REPORT OF THE DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF

Upon the recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

The total number of calls for assistance this year are about what they have been for several years. For many years the call for chimney fires has been nil, but with the ircreased use of wood for fuel chimney fires are again becoming a problem. As the use of wood fires increases, many old chimneys suitable for oil heat are not safe for burning wood and constitutes a fire hazard. There is also a whole new generation of home owners who have never before had the experience of burning wood and know nothing of the fire safety for flues and chimneys. Anyone having a question about the installation of wood stoves may contact your fire department for assistance.

The largest call for assistance are mutual aid calls, which consitiute almost half of our total responses. We are in two mutual aid associations consisting of fourteen towns which makes our ratio of out of town calls fourteen to one. However this also means when we need help we have fourteen towns to call upon. Although the initial attack on a fire by the local departments determines the end, it is the backup supplied by mutual aid that furnishes the means, especially on large fires. This mutual aid assistance has helped us to maintain a good fire suppression record.

making this report of 1975 I would like to do a little reflecting over the last few years. press the value of the Chichester Volunteer Department the records during last ten the show a total of sixteen structual fires within the town, in which either a house or barn was involved in actual fire when the fire department arrived on the Of these sixteen fires scene. two were a total loss owners. The other fourteen were to the structures that were saved or possibly the barn was lost but the house was saved, and all are presently occupied as dwellings. These properties add much as to the tax value to the town but more particularly represent saving the homes of the families involved. If space would permit the excellent response and quick action of the fire department could be expounded upon in the saving of these homes.

Through the use of the state training program, mutual aid associations, better communications, and new equipment, the fire organization have advanced much in the last few years. All of this of which the Chichester Volunteer Fire Department has availed itself.

During the year a group of firemen have taken the State Emergency Medical Training course and have formed a company within the fire department to respond to medical emergencies and assist the ambulance crew. Any person interested in supporting this group may contact the fire department.

The year 1976 will mark the 40th anniversary of the organization of the Chichester Volunteer Fire Department. During these years we have grown from a one truck to a four truck department. The original firehouse was an old stone shed, today it is a two story building housing four trucks, and meeting room, built by the Volunteer firemen. We have had radio equipment for over 20 years and was one of the first towns in the area to use radio dispatching for our firemen.

The town has seen fit to raise the money to purchase two new pieces of fire apparatus during the last twelve years. Our fire department has been able to accomplish all these things on a budget far less than that of surrounding towns and still give the town adequate fire protection.

There is always a need for new equipment as well as replacing the old and the town warrant will carry several articles for consideration in the budget.

In closing this report I must reluctantly say I am retiring as fire chief and by the time you receive this report a new chief will have been chosen. I have been chief for 16 years and a member for 38, all of which I have enjoyed serving. The fire service has deeply influenced my life and run in my blood. It has received one of the top priorities during my life as it always will.

My health now requires that I conserve my energy and rest if I am to remain active. As the responsibilities of being fire chief are the most demending on my time I feel this is what I must give up.

I wish to express my thanks and gratitude to the townspeople and fellow firemen who have supported me during my years as fire chief.

# SCHOOL BOARD REPORT 1975-1976 CHICHESTER, NEW HAMPSHIRE

The past year has been a very busy one. There are an ever increasing number of directives from the State Board. Our Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Croteau, is forced to spend more of his precious time on legal matters. In spite of a busy schedule, he has provided valuable guidance to our principal, Mr. Fowler, and the School Board.

This year we have introduced a comprehensive science program in grades 7-8 which utilizes films, film strips and a laboratory unit in conjunction with the text. This program has been enthusiastically received by staff and students. Because of the cost of the program, students in grades 7 & 8 are currently enrolled in the 7th grade program. The unit for grade 8 is planned for the 1976-1977 school year.

Our speech therapist is at the school one day a week. We were fortunate to find an outstanding person for this position. This service along with Mrs. Elaine Coffey and the government funded Title II program, are providing valuable help to students with special needs.

We wish to thank the P.T.A. for providing funds for curtains and slip covers for the teachers' room and to Mrs. June Hatch for making them. Mrs. Hatch did a professional job.

Our major maintenance project last summer, was to clean the sludge from the oil storage tank. This has to be done occasionally because of the #4 oil used for the furnace. This is the first time the tank had been cleaned since its installation.

Looking to the future: The pupil enrollment has remained stable. The census figures show no drastic change at this time.

In the near future, some major repairs and remodeling need to be done. The tile on the oldest classroom floors is wearing thin. Some are worn through. The present custodian's room should be utilized as a space for conferences, special classes, etc. The kitchen storage area can be divided for more efficient utilization, possibly using a section for the custodian. If parents are interested, a more extensive music program which includes instruments is being considered.

The most difficult job of the year is preparing the budget. There are many items over which we have no control. We carefully examine each item and present a budget as reasonable as possible. A financial report is provided each month and the spending of appropriated funds is carefully supervised.

Our thanks to the volunteer library aids, and the many people who have worked together to provide the best opportunities for the young people of Chichester.

Mrs. Sanborn is giving art instruction to Grades 1-5. The students are working with different are media in arts and crafts.

Miss Hassett is teaching music to Grades 1-5. A Christmas concert was given in December and a spring concert is being planned.

Mrs. Barbara Jobin, speech therapist, is working with speech problems. She helps those who have trouble in pronunciation and auditory discrimination.

Mrs. Elaine Coffey is the instructor in the Title I program. Several children are gaining from small group instruction in the area of language.

This year we expanded our achievement leveling to include the first five grades. This allows a child in a specific grade to receive instruction in reading or math in a higher or lower grade depending upon ability and achievement.

The Chichester Central teams continue to do well in the Merrimack Valley Basketball League under the leadership of Mr. Farnum, basketball, Mrs. Ingram and Miss Hassett, cheerleading.

Pittsfield Area Arts Council and the New Hampshire Commission on the Arts sponsored the poetry-inthe-schools program last year. Catherine Young worked with students in the fourth through sixth grades. An exposure to poetry was given with many original poems being written by the students.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

We have continued our efforts to develop a comprehensive testing program. This is made up of both the Stanford Achievement Test that is administered to the students as a group in the spring and the individualized testing that is administered by the consultants from the Central New Hampshire Mental Health Center. As we gather more information about the students, we will be in a better position to design programs to meet their individual needs.

We have been successful in our initial efforts to develop a regional center that will deliver special services to children. The school districts of Supervisory Union #53 have joined together with several school districts in other supervisory unions as well as the Central New Hampshire Mental Health Center for this purpose. A federal grant has been awarded to this group for the purpose of researching the needs the area of special services as well as developing a model to meet these needs. When the model has been developed, it will be presented to the separate school boards.

We have established a Committee for the purpose of developing a new staff evaluation system. It is expected that this Committee will deliver the report before the end of this school year so that it may be presented to the separate school boards. A Curriculum Committee has also been established. The purpose of this Committee is to study the school programs that we have and to make suggestions for improvements. It is expected that through this process we will have better continuity in our programming for grades one thru twelve.

Federally mandated legislation and regulation is requiring a considerable amount of time. An example of this is the Title IX analysis that has to be done for each community in Supervisory Union #53 before July 1, 1976.

The Staff Development plan for staff in-service training has been approved by the State Department of Education. The Staff Development Committee is now occupied with the second phase which is developing plans for in-service training on a local basis.

In closing, I would like to thank the School Board, School Staff, and citizens of Chichester for all that they have done for the Chichester children.
