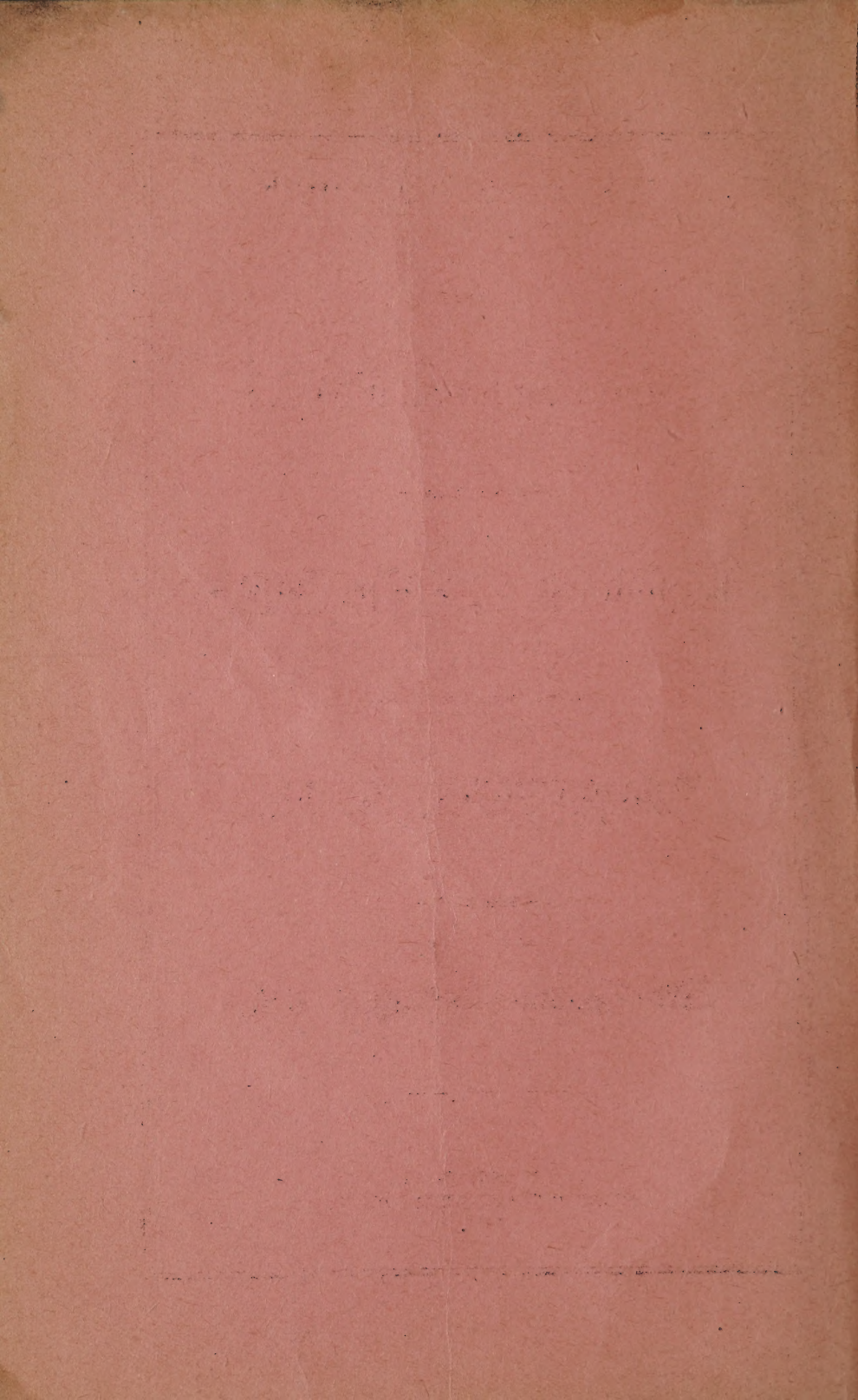

Warrant for Town Meeting.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Grafton in the County of Grafton in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at town hall in said Grafton the 14th day of March next, at nine of the clock in in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

3. To see what sum or sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate towards removing the obstruction around "Ram's Head" so called, and other improvements in that vicinity.

4. Shall Joseph T. Gallagher be exempt from taxation for twelve years, to start the Granite Industry in the town of Grafton.

5. To see what sum or sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repair of town hall.

6. To see what sum or sums of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for railing dangerous embankments and culverts.

7. To see if the town will vote to allow a three per cent discount on all taxes assessed in the year of 1911 if paid on or before July 1st 1911.
