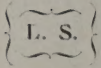

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.;



To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects.

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year, and to see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to employ an Engineer to have charge of the highways, sewers and sidewalks.

Third. To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds of the town for three years.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to construct and repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks the ensuing year.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town or act thereon.

Eighth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Ninth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Hospital, or act thereon.

Tenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

Eleventh. To see what sum the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association, or act thereon.

Twelfth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars for the use of the Food Production and Conservation Committee of the Chamber of Commerce for the benefit of Municipal gardens, or act thereon.

Thirteenth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the provisions of "An act in amendment of Section 8, Chapter 35, of the Laws of 1905, and Section 20, Chapter 155, of the Laws of 1909, relating to maintenance of Highways," approved April 15, 1911, or act thereon.

Fourteenth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of "An Act to provide for State Aid and for the improvement of the Main Highways throughout the State," approved Feb. 24, 1905, or act thereon.

Fifteenth. To determine the division of the school money.

Sixteenth. To hear the report of the Auditors.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers and Whitney Park for a public garden, or act thereon.

Eighteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars to hire a playground at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

Nineteenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Twentieth. To see if the town will vote to purchase a Tractor, or act thereon.

Twenty-first. To see if the town will vote to lay a concrete walk on the north side of Mascoma street, from the premises of Emery Lawrence to the Scytheville schoolhouse, or act thereon.

Twenty-second. To see if the town will vote to build a sidewalk on the west side of Ela street, or act thereon.

Twenty-third. To see if the town will vote to accept the bridge across the Mascoma river on Mahan flat near the residence of Tophile Clement, or act thereon.

Twenty-fourth. To see if the town will vote to rescind the vote taken at our last annual meeting in relation to improving the lighting system on the main streets in Lebanon Centre Village, or act thereon.

Twenty-fifth. To see if the town will vote to build the extension of Child street to West street and make the necessary appropriation therefor, or act thereon.

Twenty-sixth. To see if the town will vote to purchase or build a trailer and fixtures therefor to fight forest or brush fires, and to appropriate the sum of money not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars to provide the same, or act thereon.

Twenty-seventh. To see if the town will vote to have Liquor Agents or a Liquor Agent in Lebanon for the ensuing year beginning May 1, 1918, to sell as provided in Chapter 147, Laws of 1917, pure spirituous and malt liquors for medicinal, sacramental, mechanical or scientific use, or act thereon.

Twenty-eighth. To see if the town will vote to give prescription permits from May 1st, 1918, according to the provisions of Chapter 147, Laws of 1917, to Druggists who are registered pharmacists doing business in Lebanon, to sell liquor for medicinal, sacramental, mechanical or scientific use, or act thereon.

Twenty-ninth. To bring in your votes for five delegates to the Constitutional Convention, to be holden at Concord on the first Wednesday of June 1918.

The past year has been one necessitating large expenditures. We have expended on sewers and sidewalks nearly double the amount raised by taxation. A bituminous macadam road has been built on a part of Mechanic street. Hanover, Mascoma and High streets have been graveled, cement curbs have been built on Campbell, So. Park, High and Mascoma streets, concrete wall with pipe railings have been built on School, Mascoma, High

and Hanover streets. A retaining wall at the Hubbard bridge has been built at a cost of \$1,797.04. The Hanover street bridge has been replaced by a reinforced concrete structure at a net cost to date of \$7,288.91. The action against the town on account of the death of Andrew Lacosse has been settled at a cost to date of \$2,936.23. There is remaining to be paid bills of counsel which have not been presented. The action of E. J. Hutchings for gravel has been settled for \$70.00. We have also purchased new labor-saving machinery for the sewer and highway departments at a cost of \$1,108.05. There is on hand a new iron bridge for the Meriden road with the cement for construction. These bills are all paid and we have a note due the People's Trust Co. for \$8,000.00.

Our total liabilities are \$13,036.24 with assets of \$14,250.53, so that we are able to report the town proper without any indebtedness.

As there will be a shortage of labor, and the raising of food crops will be necessary, we would recommend that for the present year as little money be raised as will keep the highways in repair and for the necessary charges of the town.

During the past year there has been a small number of contagious diseases in Lebanon. Of scarlet fever there were eight cases and about a dozen cases of measles. There has not been a single case of either diphtheria or typhoid fever. Frequent analysis of the drinking water have been made. That of Lebanon Precinct has been consistently good. In West Lebanon the new reservoir was opened and every analysis showed considerable decayed vegetable matter existing in it. It is to be hoped that it will soon clear up. Otherwise a filtering plant will be needed to make the water fit for drinking and cooking purposes.

In explanation of expenditures under the item Labor, Teams and Materials we wish to mention the extraordinary expense of installing a new fountain amounting to about \$500, although more expensive than anticipated will be a permanent improvement to Glenwood Cemetery.

Instead of raising on the price for care of lots to keep pace with the increased cost of labor, teaming and

materials the committee deems it advisable to require the lot owners to make prompt payment each year for the care of same.

The sexton will be advised on April 15th of each year to neglect all lots against which there are outstanding bills. You are invited to cooperate with the committee in making the cemeteries a credit to Lebanon by making payments as requested and not be disappointed Memorial Day by finding your lot has been neglected.

WEST LEBANON CEMETERY.

The fence in the West Lebanon Cemetery, some of which was in bad shape was repaired at considerable expense. The head stones in a good portion of the Cemetery were straightened up and put on a line. A number of the monuments that were leaning were straightened and lined up. There were quite a large number of headstones reset in cement, that were loose in their sockets and liable to fall over and break. Several stones that were broken were repaired. A number of large stumps that were very unsightly were removed. A number of lots that were too high were lowered and the surplus soil was used to fill up sunken graves and other depressions. Trees were trimmed and rubbish that had accumulated in the north-west corner and near the tool house was removed. A beginning was made to put the cemetery in respectable shape. I began similar improvements in the Lebanon Village Cemetery in 1894. A word in regard to finance. I think that the property in the western part of the town is nearly one fourth of the taxable property of the town.

In only four years has West Lebanon Cemetery had over one-eighth of the appropriation, in 1899 \$98.18; 1902 \$85. In 1908 a fence was built for the addition and \$116.37 was used out of an appropriation of \$400. In 1909 \$50, in 1910 nothing, in 1911 \$54.50, in 1912 \$50, in 1913 nothing, in 1915 and 1916 \$50, in 1916 with an

appropriation of \$600 \$50, in 1917 with an appropriation \$1,000, \$50 tendered. The expenses of the Lebanon Cemeteries in 1910 were \$1,355.85, in 1916 \$2,340.07. an increase of \$984.22. The expense of the West Lebanon Cemetery in 1911 was \$103.44, in 1916 \$110.32, an increase of \$6.88. The average increase in expenses in the Lebanon Cemeteries for six years over the 1910 expense was \$652.33. The average decrease in expenses for the West Lebanon Cemeteries for six years over the 1911 expense was \$3.46. Some contrast. It takes 20 per cent of the amount usually apportioned for the West Lebanon Cemetery to pay the water tax.

The Lebanon Cemeteries have no water taxes to pay. It does not seem reasonable considering the large increase in the cost of labor, material and the repairs that were necessary, to make the Cemetery presentable to apportion to West Lebanon Cemetery, less than in 1911 with an appropriation of \$400.00 while the appropriation for 1917 was \$1,000. By a vote of the Town the funds received for the sale of lots in Glenwood Cemetery are used for the improvement of that Cemetery. As a square deal the money received for lots in the West Lebanon Cemetery should be used in that Cemetery.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT.

During the past month our library has closed four days in each week on account of shortage of coal. Great effort has been made to serve the community the two remaining days the best possible under those conditions.

The number coming to the library for reference work is constantly on the increase. The new International Encyclopedia purchased during the year has been of great value and in almost constant use. A set of Luther Burbank's Works in 12 vols. was also added to the library. The Burbank volumes are a magnificent piece of work and richly repay careful reading.

Nineteen books on the war have been added during the year. For these there is a steady demand.

One hundred eighteen books were given by our citizens and sent by the library to the War Libraries. These were all good, fresh books. No old or uninteresting books were sent.

For the year 1909, when our library was opened in its new home, 22,817 books were given out. This year's circulation makes a gain of 1,653 over that year.
