TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN OF LEE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lee in the County of Strafford in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Lee on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

(Polls will be open from 10:00 A. M. to 6:00 P. M.)

Articles 2 through 23 on appropriations will be taken up at the Mast Way School on Wednesday, the eleventh day of March at eight o'clock in the evening.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as may be necessary for General Government, including Town officers salaries and expenses, election and registration, town buildings; for Health, Vital Statistics, Public Library, Employees' Retirement and Social Security, Police, Insurance, Planning and Zoning, town reports, parks and playgrounds, interest on temporary loans, cemeteries and county taxes.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) to be used to widen the bridge on Mill Road.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be deposited with the Town Trustees of the Trust Funds as a capital reserve for equipment for the Fire Department.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the control of Pine Blister rust.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of the Town Dump.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Highways.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a Tractor Shovel.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred fourteen dollars and sixty-nine cents (\$714.69) for the construction of Class V highways under the provisions of the TRA, so called. The State will contribute the sum of four thousand seven hundred sixty-four dollars and fifty-seven cents (\$4,764.57).

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to procure a new Police Car through the State Division of Purchase and Property.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell surplus Town property by bid.

12. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the Plan, service in any Class or Classes of positions of election officials or election workers for a calendar quarter in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than fifty dollars (\$50.00)

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the Ambulance Corp. of Durham.

14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred thirty dollars (\$230.00) for partial participation to the Seacoast Regional Association, this money to be spent for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources and advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other towns in the Seacoast Region.

15. (On petition of Melvin E. Jenkins and nine other registered voters of the Town.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen hundred (\$1,500.00) dollars to continue the work of the Lee Conservation Commission. Said funds would receive 50% matching funds (\$750.00) from the Spaulding Potter Trusts and be used for the taking of easements, options or for the purchase of open space lands.

16. (On petition of Melvin E. Jenkins and nine other registered voters of the Town.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred seventy dollars (\$170.00) to plant three acres of the Town forest and complete five acres of cultural improvement on said forest. These funds may be matched by County funds of \$160.00.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred eighty (\$180.00) toward the support of the Oyster River Health Agency.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

19. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town revalued and make appropriation for same.

20. (On petition of Brian Burke and nine other registered voters of the Town.) To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law as authorized RSA 32. Said budget committee to be comprised of six (6) members-at-large elected by Australian ballot at the next Town Meeting, either Regular or Special.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired from tax sales.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting

REPORT OF LEE FIRE DEPARTMENT 1969

The Lee Fire Department responded to 37 Calls in 1969. Eight were structural fires (some with minor or no damage), two chimney fires, five auto fires and accidents, six Mutual Aid calls, five unauthorized dump fires, three grass fires (only one of any size) and eight calls that included everything but fire. Total fire loss for the year is estimated at \$20,000.

All the Department equipment is in good shape at this time, but two of the trucks are getting old and hard to get parts for. One is a 1947 Chevrolet and the other is a 1950 Chevrolet, making them both 20 years old or over. At least one truck should be replaced as soon as possible.

A house numbering system is a must soon as residents change so fast that it is sometimes difficult for firemen to know where to go. The Lee Fire Department Auxiliary is investigating ways of setting up such a numbering system.

A change of radio frequency is now underway. A good radio training program has been in effect two years and will continue.

Volunteers are always welcome to join the Fire Department. Meetings are held on the second Thursday of every month at the Fire Station.

State law requires that you have an oil burner permit. If you do not have one, contact the Fire Department and it will arrange for checking and a permit.

THIS IS YOUR DUMP

I would like to clarify a few items which some townspeople may not understand.

Please haul as much of your rubbish, brush and burnable materials as possible to the town dump. The dump is open twenty-four hours a day, (subject to weather conditions) to encourage this. We are prepared to handle the safe burning of material here.

It you must burn anything on private property, a permit is required. Burning anything out-of-doors is serious business not to be taken lightly. We all know how quickly the weather can change, but do we realize how much weather effects fire behaviour? When planning to ask for a permit, start watching all weather forecasts well in advance and observe our local conditions to see if the time is really safe to burn. Remember, a freak change in the weather could let your fire get out of control, which costs you money and loss of other valuables. There are many hours that are safe to burn, even in a dry year, if you are willing to work when the weather is favorable rather than just at your convenience. For example: night times are almost always safe times to burn.

The town dump is not supposed to burn except when the Highway Agent plans for it. Townspeople are not to set their rubbish afire in the dump, and there should be no smoking in the dump area. These acts carry the same penalties as burning without a permit. Please report unauthorized dump fires immediately.

I wish to thank the townspeople for their cooperation this past year. Also, the Selectmen, Fire Chief and Deputy Wardens for their help.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF 1969

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follow:

Fire Permit

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Report of Forest Fire Warden and District Chief (cont.)

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

1. For Kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.
2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one years imprisonment.
3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.

The total circulation for 1969 was 3,504 books, with 523 adult borrowers and 683 children borrowers. The Bookmobile made four visits and 2,348 books were borrowed from the State Library. Since our library is affiliated with the N. H. State Library, we may borrow from them, on request from you, most books, some films, records, or microfilms. This includes books needed for school assignments.

A Story hour was held this year with approximately fifty children participating in each session.

The Oyster River Home Health Association is a visiting Nurse Agency serving the towns of Durham, Lee, Madbury and Newmarket. It was incorporated on February 27, 1967 and the Board of Directors is made up of five members from each town. Included in the standing committees are physicians, registered nurses, a registered physical therapist, a registered dietitian, an attorney and lay person.

The Administrative Nurse is Mrs. Lillian Howes, R. N. and her assistants are Mrs. Ursula Hinck, R. N. and Mrs. Allan Handy, R. N. The office of the agency is located at #1 Madbury Road, Durham, where the nurse can be reached Monday through Friday. Telephone, 868-5055 from 8 A.M. To 4 P.M. or through ones own physician. During the hours when the nurses are out on calls one may leave a message through the answering service at the same phone number. Funds for the support of the Association come from contributions from organizations and individuals, membership and nursing fees, grants and funds voted by the participating towns. Memberships (\$1.00) and contributions are tax deductible.

Continued support from the four towns through appropriations to be made at the 1970 Town meetings is anticipated.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE LEE CONSERVATION COMMISSION 1969

The Lee Conservation Commission concerned themselves with a number of conservation items during the year, among some of which we made some progress and with others, a holding pattern.

Some of the more noteworthy events were the Conservation Commission seminars held in Concord to which the chairman attended; continued work on the obtaining of large scale photographs of the town with transparent overlays for the location of property bounds; wetlands and river flowage. The town completed 5 acres of forest stand cultural treatment of the Town Forest with plans for additional beautification along the dump road. Reports and a study group analyzed the desires of the townspeople based upon the town conservation survey of 1967 and report of 1968. These recommendations are still being studied. The commission tackled the problem of gravel bank rehabilitation however, it was determined that this is properly within the role of the town planning board. A committee was set up to determine if the University was agreeable to the town utilizing a portion of the newly acquired Demeritt Farm for recreation and aesthetic values. The results have not yet been forthcoming. The commission established a fund for a deserving lee youngster to attend the one week Spruce Pond Conservation Camp. We also began preliminary thinking regarding a Town Comprehensive Plan in association with the Planning Board and the Recreation Commission. The chairman has maintained close relations with the Society Protection of New Hampshire Forests alert to new conservation ideas and directions as well as with the State offices.

At our annual election of officers, Mrs. Pat Bruns and Mrs. Gail Sanborn were elected as co-chairwomen while Dick Weyrick was elected Recording Secretary. Other members of 1970 are: Mr. Dave Faye, Bob Wolfe, Helmut Haendler and Mel Jenkins.
