TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Richmond in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Richmond on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at seven of the clock in the p.m. to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highways and bridges, or take any action thereon.

4 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a a sum of money for winter maintenance of highways, or take any action thereon.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for cemeteries, or take any action thereon.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the maintenance of the Library, or take any action thereon.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Fire Department, or take any action thereon.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Police work, or take any action thereon.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for relief, or take any action thereon.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$59.94 for publicity.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$149.00 for the Elliot Community Hospital, or take any action thereon.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate **a** sum of money for Brush Removal, or take any action thereon.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$474.91, the State to contribute \$3,166.04 for the T.R.A. Program.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Civil Defense, or take any action thereon.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the Blister Rust Control Program.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to Purchase a 50 Star Flag to fly at Veterans' Memorial Hall.

17. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two percent on all taxes paid in full within 30 days of invoice.

18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for use of the Town in anticiaption of taxes.

19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell the North Richmond Schoolhouse.

20. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell Tax Deeded property.

21. To see if the Town will authorize the winter maintenance of the so-called Activity Road from the Fred Blodgett Place, socalled, to the intersection of the old Peck Road with said Activity Road near the residence of Margret Damon, or take any action thereon.

22. To see if the Town will vote to elect a Zoning Commission of five members, to report their findings at the next Town Meeting.

23. To hear the reports of Agents, committees, etc. heretofore chosen and take any action thereon.

24. To take any other action that may legally come before the meeting.

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN AT THE TOWN HALL IN RICH-MOND, COUNTY OF CHESHIRE, IN THE STATE OF NEW HAMP-SHIRE ON THE 10TH DAY OF MARCH AT 2:00 O'CLOCK IN THE AFTERNOON AND WILL REMAIN OPEN UNTIL 9:30 IN THE EVENING TO VOTE ON THE FOLLOWING SUBJECTS:

1. To elect one delegate to the Constitutional Convention to be held the second Wednesday of May, 1964.

2. To vote in the Presidential Preference Primary.

3. To vote for the election of Delegates to National Conventions.

4. To vote on the following question: "Shall sweepstakes tickets be sold in this Town?"

5. To vote on the following question: "Shall the provisions of Chapter 171A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this Town in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 292 of the session laws of 1949?"

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to'our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personel rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done. Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.

2. Carry your rubbish to the public dump — its safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.

3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.

4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make a subject of play.

Lets all join with "Smokey the bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

SOUTHWESTERN N. H. DISTRICT FIRE

MUTUAL AID SYSTEM REPORT

During 1963 we received 73 calls requesting assistance at fires, 437 pieces of apparatus were dispatched to handle these requests. For a comparison, during our first year, 1956, we dispatched 21 pieces of apparatus, a great example of the acceptance of Mutual Aid.

The Dispatchers handled approximately 30,000 telephone

calls, over 400 in one 8 hour shift during the dry season in October. Our Radio log sheets show a total of 15,799 fire transmissions and 14,482 police transmissions. Our Fire radio network has 178 units, and 23 police cars are equipped.

We find an increasingly amount of home monitors being put into service. Many Departments are fully equipped with each member having one. Those living adjacent to the stations have wired house speakers from their Base sets. These home monitors have proven a valuable addition to the departments, both for local fires and quick response for a Mutual Aid call.

26 Stations have now been equipped with Tone Decoders and the initial phone calls are being handled by the Dispatch Center. Additions are expected to be added to this number following Town Meetings.

To Mrs. Mona Packard and Mrs. Doris Doubleday for supervision in loading and shelving, to Eddie Martin for the use of his truck and to Mrs. Shirley Amidon for serving hot chocolate and cookies after the task was completed. There are still many things to be done but these will be completed in time. It is a great pleasure working here and to see the young people taking such an active interest. They really appreciate a place to gather for study and chat. Our first Christmas tree was brought in and decorated by them and on December 30th, 43 of them enjoyed an evening of films.

I attended the New Hampshire Library Association Annual Meeting in May and the New England Library Association Annual Meeting in September. Both were held at Wentworth-By-the Sea in Portsmouth. 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Report of the Police Chief

I hereby submit my report for the year 1963.

We want to thank all those who have by their cooperation made our work easier. We sincerely hope that everyone will continue to promptly report any suspicious individuals or occurances as soon as possible. Your department is here to serve you, but they cannot be of full service if they are not notified of happenings in the community.

During the past year your police department has investigated 14 instances of breaking and entering or stolen property. A stolen **car** was recovered.

We were called to investigate 10 disturbances of the peace and 13 incidents involving property damage. Two meetings were held with the youth of the town to establish cooperation.

Five undesirable individuals were transported out of town

Your officers stood duty at the scene of twenty-one accidents, cooperated in the search for a missing person, and patrolled several areas where trouble was particularly prevalent. Warnings were issued and individuals taken to court in ten cases of traffic violations.

Delinquent dog taxes were collected and seven dogs were disposed of by the department.

Eight emergency messages were delivered and three warrants served.

The department has cooperated with the Athol and Winchester Police Departments, the sheriffs' department, and the State Fire Wardens in the enforcement of the fire ban.

The children waiting for the school bus and arriving home in the afternoon have had police protection.

One of your officers has been on duty at all the public functions held in the town.

During the summer we have tried to keep the beach free of congestion and undesirable conduct.

The department has cooperated with the Civilian Defense **program** in the town.

During the past year through the efforts of this department a traffic light was installed at Four Corners and a stop sign at the intersection of the Hatchery road and Route 32.

Report of the Board of Health

To the Selectmen Richmond, N. H.

The adoption of several sections of the State sanitary code, regarding standards of living, housing and sewage disposal, has had a major impact on the local health department this past year. It necessitated increased activity, not only for this office, but the cooperation with Keene.

To clarify unsanitary conditions existing in your town and to uphold the state code governing same, will ultimately benefit our town, and in so doing, does not create any undue hardship for the individuals involved. It will aid them in every way with their health and living conditions. Those who made this action necessary this past year have complied with all requests, which is very gratifying. These sanitary codes, along with others of importance, will be closely followed during the ensuing year

Due to the dry spell last year, many families found it necessary to have water tests taken. Water pollution was active.

A close check was kept on careless disposal of refuse at the town beach and roadsides.

The appearance of fox rabies in the Northern part of the State makes it necessary that every one look with suspicion on a sick dog or cat. This is highly important. Two cases were reported, with proper attention given. The patients were treated by a doctor and a report filed. Both dogs were properly restrained for a ten day period, during which time their health and habits were closely watched. In one instance the animal was destroyed.

All communicable diseases should be reported to the local office, regardless of the Doctor's report. It is urged that you follow this request.

A weekly report, required by law, is sent into Concord every Monday covering all phases of the duties of the local Board of Health officer.
