SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The Selectmen have been very busy during 1987 with the continued growth of the Town of Campton.

The new Campton Public Library was completed and dedicated on May 16, 1987. On behalf of the Town, we express our sincere thanks to those who donated their time and efforts to moving the contents and setting up the new library.

Stuart Bownes and his wife, Kim, were hired to gather the information on buildings in town for the appraisal cards at a price of \$11.00 per unit. Work is completed on existing buildings as of approximately September 1, 1987 but construction proceeds at an unprecedented pace.

Solid waste disposal still remains an ever present problem.

We received flood damage assistance from Federal and State funds in the amount of \$19,602.

Osgood Bridge was damaged in the flood so had to be closed to traffic. The State Highway Department moved up the bid date so the job could be started sooner and was completed and open to traffic on October 1st. The successful bidder was Winterset, Inc. of Lyndonville, Vt.

Campton voted at a Special Town Meeting held in May to join the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association and this seems to be working quite well.

The Selectmen have an Agreement with Elm Square Builders to resurface and restore Vintinner Road from Campton Shopping Plaza to its termination if and when the Shopping Center becomes a reality.

When all bids were received for snow removal and sanding, there was no bid made on Bog Road, Beaverbrook or Beech Hill Roads so the Board decided to purchase a 1-Ton dump truck complete with plow, wing and sander from Fred Madore Chevrolet. Mother Nataure was very kind to us and delivery was accomplished. Some problems have been cleared up and everything seems to be working very well.

We, also, purchased a sander to be used in Mr. Burhoe's truck.

It appears that in the near future the Town may be required to own more snow removal equipment as with the cost of equipment and upkeep plus the lack of help to work long and odd hours private contractors are having to give up on bidding. We, again this year, wish to express our appreciation to the Fiddlehead Garden Club for providing and caring for the attractive flower boxes on the Town Office building.

REPORT OF THE TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Between July 1986 and June 1987, we experienced fewer fires than normal. The three leading causes of forest fires were again children, fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden and debris burning. All causes are preventable, but only with **your** help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of state timber harvest regulations is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden or Concord Forest Protection Headquarters at (603) 271-2217.

If you own forest land, you became responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

PEMI-BAKER HOME HEALTH AGENCY 1987 Agency In Review

The Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, a non-profit agency, has provided services to its member towns since 1967. We continue to strive to strengthen our current services and provide quality Home Care to those in need so that we bring a level of care to our clients that will allow them to remain in their homes in the best possible health.

In August of 1987 Elaine Vieira, RN, returned to the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency to assume the position of Director of Clinical Services. Mary Moulton, Susan Reese, Darlene Pierce and Nancy Morin provide Aide services to those in need of personal care. Dorothy Curran, Jeanne Erickson, Sharon Smith and Alice McGarry provide Skilled Nursing care to our clients. Meinsje DeNoble, Physical Therapist, Paul Lister, Speech Pathologist, and Kathryn Smith, Occupational Therapist provide Therapeutic services to our clients. Janice Gallinger is the current Board President. Kathryn Dauphine is the Bookkeeper/Administrative Assistant and Margaret Crowell is the Executive Director of the Agency.

The Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency holds free Blood Pressure and Diabetic Screening clinics in Asland, Hebron, Plymouth and Rumney. We hold free Immunization Clinics every other month at the American Legion in Plymouth.

In October the Agency offered a two day flu clinic. One hundred and forty flu shots were given.

In November the "Helping Hands" program was introduced to the community. This program provides, at no expense, free time on a regular basis for individuals who have full charge and care of a home-bound person who cannot be left unattended. The coordinators of this program are Alice Andrews, Peggy Thompson and June Winsor.

Our 1987 visit statistics indicate a continued "team effort" to provide our ten member towns with quality home care.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Campton, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Campton on Tuesday, the eighth day of March 1988, at two of the clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles:

Art. 1: To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2: To vote, by Official Ballot, on amendments to the Zoning Ordinance proposed by the Campton Planning Board.

Art. 3: To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.

Art. 4: To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of its highways and bridges.

Art. 5: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 6: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,500.00 for the maintenance of Blair and other cemeteries in Town and to authorize the withdrawal of \$4,758.96 from the Cemetery Trust Funds for Perpetual Care leaving \$5,741.04 to be raised by taxes.

Art. 7: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$21,000.00 for the support and maintenance of its Fire Department.

Art. 8: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00 for the operation of the Fast Squad as part of the Campton-Thornton Fire Department. This article is contingent upon the same article being voted in the affirmative by the Town of Thornton.

Art. 9: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,602.11 for the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Association for fire dispatch and dues.

Art. 10: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for fighting forest fires.

Art. 11: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 for a new Police Cruiser and authorize the withdrawal of said funds from the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund.

Art. 12: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the use of the Park and Recreation Commission.

Art. 13: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,688.50 for the Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency, Inc.

Art. 14: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,805.76 to reimburse the Town of Plymouth for ambulance service.

Art. 15: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,234.50 to reimburse the Campton Village Precinct for hydrant rental, payment to be pro-rated per working hydrant as determined by the Lakes Region Mutual Aid Fire Association.

Art. 16: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for Memorial Day.

Art. 17: To see if the Town will vote to continue its membership in the North Country Council.

Art. 18: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the North Country Council.

Art. 19: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to support stray animals from the Town of Campton placed with the N.H. Humane Society.

Art. 20: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,393.00 to support the Grafton County Senior Citizens Council, Inc. which handles the Meals on Wheels at the Center for the older citizens of the area.

Art. 21 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 to support the Tri-Country Community Action Program for their Outreach Program.

Art. 22: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to support the Reverend Bayard Hancock Human Services Center.

Art. 23: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for, and to support, the Plymouth Area Task Force Against Domestic Violence, a nonprofit organization pursuant to New Hampshire Legislation, and partially funded by marriage license fees from the State of New Hampshire. (By Petition)

Art. 24: To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to convey property acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's Deed by sealed bid or public auction or in such manner as justice may require.

Art. 25: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and accept and expend, without further action by the Town meeting, money from the state, federal, or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the fiscal year pursuant to RSA 31:95-b.

Art. 26: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to act as agents to carry out the purposes of the Capital Reserve Funds.

Art. 27: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund established for the purpose of purchasing highway equipment and appoint the Selectmen as agents for the withdrawal of monies required from said fund.

Art. 28: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund established for the purpose of purchasing a police cruiser and appoint the Selectmen as agents for the withdrawal of monies required from the fund.

Art. 29: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund established for future waste disposal facilities and/or equipment needs of the Town of Campton either individually or in agreement with other towns and appoint the Selectmen as agents for the withdrawal of monies required from said fund.

Art. 30: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,919.00 for the development costs associated with the District purchase of the Plymouth Incinerator/Recycling Facility and Rumney landfill site. The appropriation will be used to finalize the District Agreement, evaluate the hydrogeologic characteristics of the Rumney site, finalize the incinerator upgrade design and implement the recycling and transportation plan. The Pemi-Baker Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Committee recommends this appropriation. This vote will be contingent on voters of the Town of Plymouth voting to sell or donate the present site and incinerator facility to the Pemi-Baker Solid Waste District.

Art. 31: Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 80:58-86 for a real estate tax lien procedure? These statutes provide that tax sales to private individuals for nonpayment of property taxes on real estate are replaced with a real estate tax lien procedure under which only a municipality or county where the property is located or the state may acquire a tax lien against land and buildings for unpaid taxes. (Vote by Ballot)

Art. 32: To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to dispose of tax collector deed acquired property to not-for-profit groups or corporations

for the purpose of it being used for the building of low cost or affordable housing, the definition of which shall be determined by the Selectmen. (By Petition)

Art. 33: To see if the Town will vote to accept Meadow Lane, a distance of approx. 1,213 feet in the R.H.R. Subdivision when deemed acceptable by the Board of Selectmen. Said road is located off Beech Hill Road and appears on survey by H.D. Trojano, Surveyor dated October 1968 and recorded at the Grafton County Registry of Deeds in Book 1059, Page 61. (By Petition)

Art. 34 To see if the Town will vote to assume responsibility for care and maintenance of Alden Drive from Lot U to Waterfall Drive, Waterfall Drive, and Puckerbrush Farm Road from Lot G to the end of Lot J for a total footage of 4,863 feet, and Arrow Lane for a distance of 450 feet for a total of 5,313 feet. (By Petition).

Art. 35 To see if the Town will vote to accept Mespelli Drive, a distance of 650 feet in the Mespelli Subdivision when deemed acceptable by the Board of Selectmen. Said road is located off Quimby Road in West Campton and appears on Plan approved by the Campton Planning Board dated November 10, 1987. (By Petition)

Art. 36 To see if the Town will vote to accept in accordance with RSA 230:1 the road shown as Lindsley Drive, 1,000 feet, which is off Bog Road which was approved by the Campton Planning Board in August 1986, when deemed acceptable by the Board of Selectmen. (By Petition)

Art. 37 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Moderator to appoint a study committee of seven (7) to study the police department needs.

Art. 38 To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to deed to the Campton Village Precinct approximately 3800 sq. ft. of the said Beebe River access road right-of-way that may be given to the Town by the State, the Town retaining a remaining 50 ft. right-of-way. Said purpose for the Precinct to use the land to obtain water rights.

Art. 39 To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of agents and officers heretofore chosen.

Art. 40 To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF GRAFTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Budget for the current fiscal year is \$8,947,343. Town taxes to the County average 6.7% or \$2.21 per \$1,000, of the property owner's tax bill. The major portion of county expenses goes to the operation of the Nursing Home (39.69%) and to human services programs for the elderly, disabled, nursing care and children (26.86%).

Registry of Deeds had gross income of \$3,630,159 in 1987. The total number of documents processed in 1987 was 29,983. \$3,184,982 was received in transfer tax, of which 96% or \$3,057,584 went to the State of NH and 4% or \$127,398 was retained as county income. Other receipts include recording and copy fees in the amount of \$445,177. Total income to the County was \$572,575 compared to a total of \$3,057,584 paid to the State, although the County is liable for 100% of all operating costs.

Human Services: Old Age & Disabled grant programs remain fairly constant with the elderly program averaging 100 cases at \$4,800 per month and the disabled averaging 225 cases at \$21,000 per month. Intermediate Nursing Care caseload increased with SB-1 where the County became responsible for all INC cases and eliminated town liability. INC cases now average 255 at \$110,000 per month, a rapidly increasing cost to the counties with savings to the towns. Children and Youth Services also became a county liability under Senate Bill 1, with counties reimbursing the State 25% for all child service costs. It is impossible to give accurate figures for child expenses, as they are rapidly increasing monthly. Current accounts reflect 130 to 150 cases costing from \$64,000 to \$75,000 per month. (At the beginning of this fiscal year, we had approximately 120 cases at about \$50,000 per month.) The County has 25% funding liability of child placement costs and we are taking an active interest in the needs of children in Grafton County. Social Service agencies receive \$247,217 or \$4.03 per capita, to provide much needed services for home health, mental health, developmentally disabled, senior citizens transportation and nutrition and many other valuable programs.

Correctional Facility is increasingly overpopulated, now averaging 58 inmates per day and frequently housing 60 +. The current cost of operation is \$28.63 per inmate day. We have contracted with an architect to present design and cost for a 34 bed addition. Schematic designs and price estimates are expected by mid-January to go out for bid by late January with bid results due in by the end of February. Funding issues should go to the delegation and public in March with anticipated ground breaking in April. Grafton County Nursing Home for intermediate nursing care is licensed for 136 beds and is about 80% reimbursable. FY 87 cost per patient day was \$68.78 with \$58.87 reimbursed by Medicaid.

Grafton County Farm continues to be self-supporting and provides work for inmates as well as offering access for experimental agricultural projects. This is primarily a dairy farm with an average herd of 170, but also grows produce for the nursing home.

Grafton County Commissioners meet weekly on Wednesdays. We encourage public attendance and welcome facility tours. We were deeply saddened by the deaths of Commissioner Arthur E. Snell, Dist. #2 and Commissioner Leonard Anderson, Dist. #3, early this year.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Nature of the Organization and Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of the organization:

Waterville Estates Village District is incorporated in the state of New Hampshire. Its original charge was to collect taxes and use those funds for the maintenance and improvement of common area roads and the water system within the District area. The District has also been established for the additional purposes of construction, maintenance and care of parks and commons; the maintenance of activities for recreational promotion; the control of pollen, insects and pests; and the appointing and employment of watchmen and police officers.

Significant accounting policies:

Fund accounting:

The accounts of the District are organized on the basis of funds and account groups, each of which is considered a separate accounting entity. The operations of each fund are accounted for with a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund equity, revenues, and expenditures, or expenses, as appropriate. Resources are allocated to and accounted for in individual funds based upon the purposes for which they are to be spent and the means by which spending activities are controlled. The various funds in the financial statements in this report are as follows:

The General Fund is the general operating fund of the District. It is used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund.

The General Fixed Asset Account Group is used to maintain records of long-lived public assets. General fixed assets are recorded at cost and no depreciation has been provided for on them.

The General Long-Term Debt Account Group contains long-term liabilities expected to be financed from the General Fund.

Basis of accounting:

The General Fund records are maintained on the modified accrual method of accounting, whereby tax revenue is recognized when levied and expenses of the General Fund are recognized when incurred. Principal and interest payments on long-term debt are considered to be obligations of the General Fund in the year in which amounts are appropriated to make such payments.

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NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 2. Property Taxes

The District levies property taxes which, in accordance with state law, are collected by the towns of Campton and Thornton and then remitted to the District.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE 1987

I'd like to thank all school personnel, physicians, and parents for their cooperation and support in assisting me in my role of promoting and protecting the physical and emotional health of the students.

The school nurse is at Campton two days each week. Much of this time is spent with individual students treating injuries, checking medical problems, discussing health matters, and making and following up on referrals. Cumulative health records are maintained on all students, including health history, immunizations, medical examinations, screening results, medical recommendations, referrals, nurse and teacher observations, and other supplemental records. The State of N.H. Annual School Service Report is to be completed at the end of each school year.

This fall, the Annual State of N.H. Bureau of Communicable Disease Control immunization audit was completed and submitted. Most students have been fully immunized, a few are in the process, and two students have documented medical exemptions. Campton School is in compliance with the new immunization law.

In October, fifth grade students and several transfer students, with parental permission, had physical exams by Dr. Stephen Elgert. At this time, a few minor problems were detected and parents notified.

First through fourth grade students, with parental permission, are brushing their teeth daily, and using a flouride rinse once a week. The program is sponsored by the N.H. Department of Dental Health, but it is the effort of the classroom teachers that make the program work. I have submitted an application and am waiting approval for the School Dental Health Program, which includes oral prophylaris, topical flouride treatment and home care instructions for students.

Screening tests are being conducted on all students, and these include: vision, hearing, height, weight, and color vision. Blood pressure and scoliosis screening are done in grades 5-8. Referrals are made and followed up. Some funding is available by state and local agencies. Students have also been checked for head lice. There have been a small number of children found with lice, but all have been promptly and properly treated.

In the Spring, preschool registration will be held at Campton Elementary School. This involves the nurse, kindergarten teacher, speech pathologist, and resource room teacher in gathering pertinent information to evaluate the prospective kindergarteners. Lastly, the nurse is responsible for administering the free and reduced lunch program.

CAMPTON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Each year when it is time to write the Town Report, I try to think of a theme that more or less characterizes the school at this time. In my previous two reports I have used change and adjustment. I suspect we are still in for more of each.

The school population continues to grow at an unprecedented rate. At this writing (and it will change) we have 320 students in grades K-8. There are an additional 107 students in high school. The K-8 enrollment by grade is as follows: Kindergarten, morning session - 26; Kindergarten, afternoon session - 25; Transition - 17; First Grade - 24; First Grade - 25; Second Grade - 27; Third Grade - 21; Third Grade - 19; Fourth Grade - 27; Fifth Grade - 30; Sixth Grade - 25; Seventh Grade - 29; Eighth Grade - 25.

Despite the sharp increase in population, life continues at the school. We continue to serve the needs of our students and have increased our curricular offerings and the teaching staff. New to us this year are Miss Lisa Schmitt, 3rd grade; Miss Patricia Dunfey, 4th grade; Miss Julie Lund and Miss Collins-Mead in the Resource Room. Mr. Terry Dempsey is the new Art teacher approved in separate warrant last year. New Chapter I personnel include: Susan Miller, Patrice Mitchell and Cynthia Perry.

We continue to offer our regular programs and special programs such as RIF (Reading Is Fundamental), I Love to Read month, and our 8th grade Outdoor Education trips still are active, popular, and flourishing. The new art program has been successful and productive with many of our students involved in various local competitions.

Another new addition to our program this year is the Transition class. This is the first year we have offered the transition program on a full-time basis. We have come to realize that just as all young children do not roll-over, sit, stand, walk, and talk at the same time in their development, neither are they ready to benefit from school instruction at the same time. Transition allows them a time to grow while in a learning environment.

The Building Needs Committee, headed by Ken Sutherland, Jr., has been reactivated to review future facility needs and to investigate possible land acquisitions. A new parent support group has emerged this year. They are called, "Friends of Campton School (FOCS)", and meet once a month. Already they have contributed to the success of the school with funds for the skiskate program at Waterville Valley and also with volunteers to assist with recesses and class parties. Anyone wishing to learn more about the FOCS should contact either Barbara Rankin (536-1795) or Cheryl Filion (536-4991) who co-chair this group.

The next two to three years could become trying. If current growth rates continue there will be problems of space and extra costs. I ask that the support and caring for your children and their education which has always been in evidence will continue. Your children remain the top priority.

REPORT FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

School Administrative Unit #48 continues in its goal to prepare our children for the present and the future. Within our ever changing environment this is no small task. Our entire staff is dedicated to dealing with the individual needs of our children, while being responsive to parental and community concerns; as well as State and Federal Mandates.

We are responding to the need for sound "basics" educational programming while also introducing our students to technology. Several grants have allowed our schools to utilize technology in the classroom. Holderness received a laser grant, while Campton and Plymouth will receive training grants in the use of computers for teachers. Other SAU Districts continue to expand their use of technology in the classrooms.

Curriculum development and program implementation remains a high priority. Our goal this year is to implement a cyclical process for curriculum development and a procedure to insure program implementation using all the SAU resources to benefit all districts. Our teachers and administrators will be making this process work.

The expanding growth of our area is both exciting and demanding. As the populations within our schools grow, each district has responded in kind. The addition to Holderness Central School begins this spring. Thornton will vote on a bond issue for expansion in March. Campton, having completed the first phase of expansion last year, prepares for further expansion in the near future. Plymouth's School Building Needs Committee continues its work and expects to finalize plans for a school addition this spring. Rumney and Wentworth are in the initial stages of planning for future building renovation and expansion.

The Cooperative School District Study Committee continues its work in evaluating various school organizational structures and funding mechanisms. The committee is engaged in a long range study to evaluate educational ramifications, current facilities, enrollment, demographic and financial considerations involved with each educational structure.

Community support for our schools has always been a trademark in School Administrative Unit #48. Your support during these changing times will testify to our continued commitment to quality education.

Our districts continue to move toward excellence. Teachers continue to improve their instructional techniques, while district administrators strive to improve their abilities. Several administrators are moving toward advanced degrees from Doctorates in Education to a variety of advanced degrees and certificates. Their commitment to quality education is very encouraging. We welcome new administrators to the School Administrative Unit #48 family: Michael Maroni - Holderness Central School Principal; Frank Sawyer -Thornton Central School Interim Principal; Sandra Tilton - Chapter I Coordinator.

We also welcome Gail Hannigan as our new Gifted and Talented Coordinator/Teacher.

As your superintendent, I wish to thank you for giving me the opportunity to work with all of you in making School Administrative Unit #48 the best it can be. We all must continue to work together toward our ultimate goal of helping learners learn.

EXPLANATION OF SUPERINTENDENT'S AND ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY FOR 1986-1987

Chapter 189, Section 48 Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, requires that the school district annual report show the total amount paid to the Superintendent of Schools as per the following quotation: "Reports. Each Superintendent of a School Administrative Unit shall annually prepare a report of the total salary paid to the superintendent, showing in detail the amount paid by the state and each local school district and their share of same . . . Said report shall be included in the annual report of the respective school district as a separate entry. A like report and entry shall be made for each assistant superintendent, teacher consultant, and business administrator if any is in service in the unit."

One-half of the School Administrative Unit expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the unit on the basis of adjusted valuations. One-half is pro-rated on the basis of average daily membership in the school for the previous school year ending June 30th. The salary of \$45,595.00 which was received by the Superintendent of Schools of School Administrative Unit #48 during 1986-1987 was prorated among the school districts comprising the School Administrative Unit. Allowance for \$2,500.00 travel within the Unit was also prorated as stated above.

The salary of \$35,000.00 for the Assistant Superintendent during 1986-1987 and travel allowance within the Unit of \$1,750.00 was prorated as stated above.
