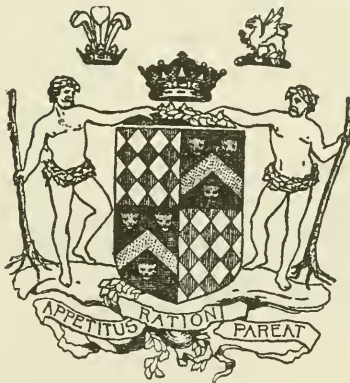

# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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## TOWN WARRANT, 1962

To the inhabitants of the Town of Fitzwilliam, of the County of Cheshire, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Fitzwilliam, on Tuesday, the 13th day of March 1962, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects.

Art. 1. To bring in your votes for the election of one selectman, town clerk, town treasurer, highway agent, one cemetery commissioner for three years, one trustee of trust funds, for three years, one trustee of the town library for three years, three fire wards, three commissioners of Plante Memorial Park, town hall agent and constable and prosecuting agent.

Polls will be open not later than 10 o'clock a.m. and close not earlier than 6 o'clock p.m.

Art. 2. To hear and act upon the reports of committees and officers heretofore chosen.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,000 for town charges.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200 for street lighting.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500 for oiling town roads.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000 for town road maintenance.



Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid for town road construction and raise and appropriate the sum of \$841.79, the state to give \$5,611.97.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,400 to help maintain a district nurse for the current year, the same to be expended under the direction of the Fitzwilliam District Nursing Association.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200 for the general care and maintenance of the town cemeteries, the same to be expended under the direction of the cemetery commission.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the care and maintenance of the town library, including the purchase of books and periodicals.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the care and maintenance of the common, the same to be expended by the village district.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for the general care and maintenance of Plante Memorial Park, to be expended by the park commission.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$219 (1/100th of one per cent of the valuation of the town to the Monadnock Region of S.W. New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in co-operation with the other thirty seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 to be used for the observance of Memorial Day, the same to be expended under the direction of the patriotic bodies.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900 for the spraying and care of trees

on the common, Plante Memorial Park, the cemeteries and the street.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the purpose of defraying and expenditures for civil defense, approved by the local civil defense director and the selectmen, in accordance with the provisions of R.R.R. Chapter 107, Sections 10-14-20.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$508 as a contribution to the Elliot Community Hospital of Keene, N. H.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five (or seven) members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to spend under the direction of the authorized 200th anniversary committee.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 to repair and paint the fire station at the Depot.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$20,000 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town; the old Winchendon road No. 78, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, as amended by Laws of 1957, Chapter 273:3, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may

be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Fitzwilliam.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 to paint and repair the town library.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$370 to paint the main hall way and the large hall adjacent to same in the lower town hall.

Art. 25. To take action on any question that may properly come before this meeting, not involving the appropriation of any money.

## ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

March 14th, 1961

Officers elected: Selectman for three years, Roy I. Longever; Town Treasurer, Clara Quereau; Town Clerk, Willard M. Blodgett; Highway Agent, John T. Mattson; Constable and Prosecuting Agent, Frank B. Patterson; Town Hall Agent, Alexander W. Matson; Fire Wards, Carl Baldwin, Walter Tommila and Russell Raitto; Cemetery Commissioner, Eugene Lawrence; Trustee of the Trust Funds, Clarence Damon; Trustee of the Library, Kathrene Bruhns; Commissioners of Plante Memorial Park, Joseph Tardiff, James Hind and Victor Dunham. All officers elected and appointed were sworn in as by law prescribed.

Meeting called to order at 9:15 a.m. by Moderator, Horace B. Firmin. Meeting opened with a prayer by Rev. C. Austin Earle.

Moderator read the warrant and declared the polls open and voting started at 9:25 a.m. on Article 1—election of Town Officers.

Art. 2. Voted to take up later.

Art. 3. Moved passage of article.

Art. 4. Voted to raise and appropriate \$22,310 for Town charges as listed below:

Art. 5. Voted to raise and appropriate \$2,200.00 for street lighting.

Art. 6. Voted to raise and appropriate \$7,500.00 for road oiling.

Art. 7. Voted to take up later.

Art. 15. Voted to take up article 15. Mr. Howard Holman presented the following:

Resolved:

That we enlist the support of the Monadnock Region Association in an effort to have State Highway No. 137 extended, from its intersection with State Highway No. 124, in Jaffrey, west, along Route No. 124 to the intersection of Route No. 124 and the Mountain Road leading to Fitzwilliam; Thence along said road to State Highway No. 119; thence south and west along Route No. 119 to the intersection of Route No. 119 and the Royalston Road and thence south along said road to the New Hampshire-Massachusetts Line."

Mr. Holman withdrew the resolution and the sum of \$217.00 was voted for the Monadnock Region Association.

Art. 7. Voted to have a committee of three appointed from the floor and with the Selectmen be authorized to purchase a 2½ ton truck not to exceed \$4,600.00

Art. 8. Voted the following amendment raising \$14,000.00 for town roads. "That \$2,300.00 be set aside, as principal and interest, as the Town's share of an accelerated T.R.A.

program as customarily accepted under Article 9 of this warrant."

Article 8 as ammended to read as follows:

"To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 for town road maintenance and that \$2,300.00 be set aside, as principal and interest, as the Town's share of an accelarated T.R.A. program as customarily voted under Article 9 of this Warrant."

Art. 9. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$846.30 for T.R.A. construction.

Art. 10. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for District nurse.

Art. 11. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the cemeteries.

Art. 2. Voted the acception of the Reports. Voted a rising vote of thanks to the Doctors committee and to extend this committee for another year. Voted to send a letter of thanks to Mr. George Godbeer for his generous contribution to the lighting of the Town Hall spire. Voted to express appreciation to the Garden Club for their work on this lighting of the spire. Voted to extend the Safety Committee for another year. Voted to take up Article No. 22.

Art. 22. Resolution voted as follows: Resolved; that the Town vote to hold a 200th anniversary celebration during the year 1962 and raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00, to be spent under the direction of the authorized anniversary committee.

And, be it further resolved that the appointed committee be augmented to include; Rev. C. Austin Earle, Fannie B. Spicer, Gladys M. Wilkins and Walter M. Stone.

Voted to recess until 1:30 p.m.

Art. 12. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for care of the Library. Also voted the passage of the following resolution: Resolved:

That the Library Trustees through the Trustees of the Trust Funds ask for further interpretation of the Esdaile Trust to allow a broader use of income from the fund.

Art. 13. Voted the passage of this article raising \$200.00.

Art. 14. Voted the passage of the article raising \$100.00 for Plante Memorial Park.

Art. 16. Voted the passage of this article raising \$300.00 for Memorial Day.

Art. 17. Voted the passage of this article raising \$200.00 for spraying and maintaining trees.

Art. 18. Voted the passage of this article raising \$100.00 for Civil Defense.

Art. 19. Voted the passage of this article raising \$455.00 for the Elliot Community Hospital in Keene.

Art. 20. Voted the passage of this article raising \$4,-797.32 to make up the current deficit for the year 1960.

Art. 21. Voted the passage of the article.

Art. 23. Voted the passage of the article.

Art. 24. Voted to indefinitely postpone this article.

Art. 25. Voted to indefinitely postpone this article.

Art. 26. Voted NOT to pass this article.

Art. 27. Voted the passage of the following :

Motion :

That this body assembled vote to re-establish the listing of dog licenses to owners each year in the town report.

Motion :

That this body assembled vote to rescind previous action taken at Town Meeting in 1950, Article 29, providing a 2%

discount on Taxes if paid in 15 days; and establish in-lieu thereof, a 1% discount on taxes if paid in 30 days, effective for 1961 and until further action is taken.

Voted a rising vote of appreciation to Joseph Tardiff retiring Selectman.

Completed voting on Articles at 2:35 p.m.

Polls were closed at 6:07 p.m. and meeting dissolved at 8:05 p.m.

Two hundred and twenty one ballots were cast.

### General Maintenance

Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

## REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF FITZWILLIAM SCHOOL DISTRICT

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To the Superintendent of Schools:

Submitted is my sixth report as the Principal of the Dr. George S. Emerson School.

### School Personnel

This year we have practically the same teaching personnel as last year. Mrs. Evelyn Damon is now our second grade teacher and previously was our fourth grade teacher. Mrs. Damon replaced Miss Esther Grout who left us to accept a position in another district. Miss Lois Enos accepted the position as our fourth grade teacher. Miss Enos comes from Concord, New Hampshire and is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire.

Mr. George Prentiss is our custodian replacing Mr. Bruhns who formerly held this position. These are the only changes in our staff which we have had so we have been very fortunate in keeping all our other teachers, regular and special, our cafeteria personnel, health personnel and our bus drivers.

### Curriculum

We have had a great improvement in our curriculum this year in adopting the Joplin Reading Plan. This plan is now being used in grades four through eight. The students in these grades are grouped into divisions determined by standardized reading tests which establish actual reading grade level. Reading for the entire group is scheduled for the same period for a specified length of time.

Using a uniform basic reader series, the teacher teaches two sections of a grade level instead of the existing four or five, within her grade. The children in each section get more time per pupil for instruction, motivation and actual drill or experience in oral reading while the other section works on

silent reading, skills or comprehension. Then there comes the reversal.

The grouping we use is flexible and the scholar is moved ahead as fast as he can go or at least at half year intervals.

Last year we had Conversational French in grades four, five and six. This year this has been extended to grade seven.

### **Improvements**

There were no major projects of improvement carried out this past year. During the summer a few minor repairs were made along with some painting on the inside of the building. The usual routine complete cleaning of the inside of the building was done during the summer along with the maintaining of the grounds.

### **Recommendations**

This coming year we hope to move our third grade out of the basement room to upstairs where the rest of our classes are held. The basement room could then be made available for a nurse's room and for sick children. Many times in the course of a school year we must keep sick children at school for various reasons. This room would provide a proper place for them where it would be quiet and relaxing and to separate them from the rest of the children. Probably part of this room could also be used for a conference room where parents and teachers could discuss problems confidentially and without interruptions of one sort or another. At the present time it is almost impossible to be able to talk privately with parents concerning problems which do occur.

### **Conclusion**

In concluding my report, it gives me a great deal of pleasure to express my appreciation to our Superintendent of Schools, our School Board, our Teachers, our Parent-Teachers Association, and to all our other school personnel for their cooperation in the interests of our school.

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook — yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness — our carelessness. This, we — you — and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations — hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you —

1. Follow the warden's directions.
2. Secure the required burning permit.
3. Keep your fires under control.
4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

Everyone will benefit by it.
