2012 Board of Selectmen Report

It has been another busy year for the town and the Board of Selectmen.

The Saco River Embankment Repair & Mitigation Project was completed successfully in November, grant funds from FEMA and the NH State Highway aid fund were received and applied to the completion of the project. Special thanks to Richard Garabedian for all his efforts as project manager for the town. It was no small undertaking!

Nancy Hayes is to be commended for her continued efforts as Treasurer, coordinating with Richard Garabedian and the Board of Selectmen to ensure working cash flow for the Saco River Embankment Repair and Mitigation project, not an easy task when the total project costs were nearly ten times our average annual budget. Fortunately, Mike Poirier, the FEMA coordinator for the state of NH, and Charles Willeke of the NH State Highway aid fund, understood our limited resources and worked with the town to expedite FEMA & state highway aid fund payments as the project progressed.

Our thanks to Burr Philips of Civil Solutions, LLC, and Sean of Headwaters Hydrology, LLC, who combined their talents to conduct a detailed hydrological analysis of the project site, they designed and provided oversight of construction of the embankment repair and mitigation project. Burr was involved from start to finish and was proactive on many fronts, especially in obtaining the special use permit required by the US Forest Service for construction of a portion of the embankment on National Forest land. We thank Mike Martin, Saco District Ranger for the White Mountain National Forest, for his recognition of the importance of this project and his approval of the 30 year special use permit which allows for construction and maintenance of the embankment.

After several years without a resident Town Clerk and Tax Collector, we are fortunate that Michelle Goodreau has accepted the post after being elected by write in votes for the vacant Town Clerk position in March 2012. Michelle has been training for months, working hands on with Leslie Mallett, travelling to training workshops on multiple occasions in Concord, and shows aptitude and enthusiasm for her new post. Michelle currently keeps office hours on Mondays from 5pm to 6:30pm. She can be contacted during these hours by phone at 603 374-6397 or email: hartslocationtc@gmail.com.

The Board wishes to thank Leslie Mallet for her service as administrative clerk / tax collector, conducting much of the clerical work of the town during the years that we did not have a resident town clerk. Leslie stepped down in 2012, and we are very grateful for her service to the town.

We congratulate Ed Butler on his re-election to the NH House of Representatives. Ed is now serving his third term in the state house, and chairs the house Commerce Committee. If you have questions or concerns about issues in the state legislature, please contact Ed.

The town received a state matching grant for much needed fire suppression equipment in 2012. Our thanks to Bill King, Fire Warden, for all his efforts in obtaining the grant, identifying, and procuring the needed equipment. We did not receive the communications equipment grant.

Last year at town meeting, voters approved the necessary changes to the Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance to remain in compliance with the National Flood Insurance Program. Updated flood plain mapping for much of Carroll County was conducted in 2011 and will be implemented in 2013. A section of the Saco River within Hart's Location and just over the Bartlett town line was included in the updated mapping, and has been identified as a Special Flood Hazard Area. The detailed study did not go further upstream.

The Board of Selectmen formally adopted the revised Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance in December 2012 by resolution, and the resolution specifically references the new Carroll County Flood Plain Maps, dated March 19, 2013 as the effective date.

Important Notice to Property Owners on Cobb Road: Your property may be impacted by the new flood plain mapping and revised Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance. Please contact a member of the Board of Selectmen if you would like to view the new maps and to receive information about how your property may be affected.

Gary Fournier, of Purvis & Associates, continues to work on assessment data updates in the field for the next town-wide revaluation in 2015. Gary is working under contract with the town and updates data for 25% of the town each year. The field data collected over the 4 year contract period will be analyzed and reviewed as part of the state required town wide revaluation process. Property owners will be notified of their new valuations in 2015.

It has been brought to our attention that Gary has been refused access from some property owners within the town, which is unfortunate, because he is doing work under contract with the town as mandated by state statute. Gary wears an identification badge and is authorized by the Board of Selectmen to conduct field assessments on all properties within Hart's Location. Please allow him to conduct his work when he visits your property. Josephine Belville, of the NH Department of Revenue, Municipal Services Division, may also visit your property to verify the data that Gary is reporting. Josephine also wears an identification badge when conducting her field reviews. If you have further questions, please contact a member of the Board of Selectmen.

Article 3 asks if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$3000 for the town revaluation capital reserve fund. These funds will provide the money needed to meet our assessment contract obligations through 2015. The Board of Selectmen support this article.

The chair reluctantly accepted the resignation of Jon Goodreau as a member of the Board of Selectmen in February 2013. Jon served the town with dedication since his appointment in 2011 and his subsequent election in 2012. His participation on the Board of Selectmen, and his good nature will be missed.

As always, we encourage each of you to participate in some way to help run your town. Please contact Mark Dindorf or George Holmes if you are willing and able to do so.

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Article 2: \$250,000 (gross budget) for the purposes of municipal infrastructure and the property repairs arising from the 2011 flooding damage from Tropical Storm Irene and to authorize the issue of up to \$250,000 of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal finance Act (RSA Chapter 33, as amended) and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver such bonds or notes and to determine the interest rate thereon, and the maturity and other terms thereof as shall be in the best interest of the Town; to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, obtain and accept federal and state disaster relief funds, grants, gifts or other forms of assistance, if any, which may be available for such projects; and to authorize the Selectmen to take any other action or to pass any other vote related thereto. It is anticipated that 75% of this appropriation will be covered by federal/state disaster relief funds, and that upon receipt, theses funds shall be applied to pay down the bonds or notes; and an anticipated 25% of this appropriation shall be the town's matching share. It is further anticipated that State Highway Aid Funds will fund 2/3 of the town's matching share. (Two thirds majority ballot vote required) Selectmen favor.

Article 5: To see if the town will vote to amend the Hart's Location Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance, Appendix B, to include the following language:

SECTION 2: DISTRICT BOUNDARIES

2:01 **DEFINITIONS**:

- 1. "Base Flood" means the flood having a one-percent possibility of being equaled or exceeded in any given year.
- 2. "Basement" means any area of a building having its floor subgrade on all sides.

4. "Flood Insurance Rate Map" (FIRM) means the official map incorporated with this ordinance, on which FEMA has delineated both the special flood hazard areas and the risk premium zones applicable to the Town of Hart's Location.

5. "Flood Insurance Study" (FIS) means an examination, evaluation and determination of flood hazards and, if appropriate, corresponding water surface elevations, or an examination, evaluation and determination of mudslide (i.e. mudflow) and/or flood-related erosion hazards.

8. "Historic Structure" means any structure that is:

a. Listed individually in the National Register of Historic Places (a listing maintained by the Department of Interior) or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as

meeting the requirements for individual listing on the National Register;

- b. Certified or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as contributing to the historical significance of a registered historic district or a district preliminarily determined by the Secretary to qualify as a registered historic district;
- c. Individually listed on a state inventory of historic places in states with historic preservation programs which have been approved by the Secretary of the Interior; or
- d. Individually listed on a local inventory of historic places in communities with historic preservation programs that have been certified either:
 - i. by an approved state program as determined by the Secretary of the Interior, or
 - ii. directly by the Secretary of the Interior in states without approved programs.

9. "Lowest Floor" means the lowest floor of the lowest enclosed area (including basement). An unfinished or flood resistant enclosure, usable solely for parking of vehicles, building access or storage in an area other than a basement area is not considered a building's lowest floor; provided, that such an enclosure is not built so as to render the structure in violation of the applicable non-elevation design requirements of this ordinance.

10. "Manufactured Home" means a structure, transportable in one or more sections, which is built on a permanent chassis and is designed for use with or without a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities. For floodplain management purposes the term "manufactured home" includes park trailers, travel trailers, and other similar vehicles placed on site for greater than 180 consecutive days. This includes manufactured homes located in a manufactured home park or subdivision.

11. "Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision" means a parcel (or contiguous parcels) of land divided into two or more manufactured home lots for rent or sale.

12. "Recreational Vehicle" is defined as:

- e. built on a single chassis;
- f. 400 square feet or less when measured at the largest horizontal projection;
- g. designed to be self-propelled or permanently towable by a light duty truck; and
- h. designed primarily not for use as a permanent dwelling but as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel or seasonal use.

13. "Regulatory floodway" means the channel of a river or other watercourse and the adjacent land areas that must be reserved in order to discharge the base flood without cumulatively increasing the water surface elevation more than a designated height.

14. "Special flood hazard area" is the land in the floodplain within the Town of Hart's Location subject to a one-percent or greater possibility of flooding in any given year. The area is designated on the FIRM as Zone AE.

Article 6: To see if the town will vote to add the following language to the Hart's Location Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance, Appendix B:

SECTION 3: PERMITTED USES:

All proposed development in any special flood hazard area shall require a permit.

Article 7: To see if the town will vote to amend Section 8, Construction Requirements, of the Hart's location Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance, Appendix B, to read:

The Board of Selectmen shall review all building permit applications for substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is located in a **special flood hazard** area, all substantial improvements shall: ...

In the preceding paragraph, the words: "<u>special flood hazard area</u>" replace the words: "<u>flood</u> <u>prone area</u>".

Article 8: To see if the town will vote to amend SECTION <u>9</u>. WATER AND SEWER SYSTEMS of the Hart's Location Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance, Appendix B to read:

Where replacement water and sewer systems (including on-site systems) are proposed in a **special flood hazard** area the applicant shall provide the Board of Selectmen with assurance that these systems will be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters, and on-site waste disposal systems will be located to avoid impairment to them or contamination from them during periods of flooding.

In the preceding paragraph, the words: "<u>special flood hazard area</u>" replace the words: "<u>flood</u> prone area".

Article 9: To see if the town will vote to add the following section as a new section of the Hart's Location Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance, Appendix B:

SECTION 10: CERTIFICATION

For all substantially improved structures located in Zone AE, the applicant shall furnish the following information to the Board of Selectmen:

a. the as-built elevation (in relation to NGVD) of the lowest floor (including basement) and include whether or not such structures contain a basement.

b. if the structure has been floodproofed, the as-built elevation (in relation to NGVD) to which the structure was floodproofed.

c. any certification of floodproofing.

The Board of Selectmen shall maintain the aforementioned information for public inspection, and shall furnish such information upon request.

Article 10: To see if the town will vote to add the following section to the Hart's Location Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance, Appendix B:

SECTION 11: WATERCOURSES

1. In riverine situations, prior to the alteration or relocation of a watercourse the applicant for such authorization shall notify the Wetlands Bureau of the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services and submit copies of such notification to the Board of Selectmen, in addition to the copies required by RSA 482-A: 3. Further, the applicant shall be required to submit copies of said notification to those adjacent communities as determined by the Board of Selectmen, including notice of all scheduled hearings before the Wetlands Bureau.

2. The applicant shall submit to the Board of Selectmen, certification provided by a registered professional engineer, assuring that the flood carrying capacity of an altered or relocated watercourse can and will be maintained.

3. Along watercourses with a designated Regulatory Floodway no encroachments, including fill, new construction, substantial improvements, and other development are allowed within the floodway unless it has been demonstrated through hydrologic and hydraulic analyses performed in accordance with standard engineering practices that the proposed encroachment would not result in any increase in flood levels within the community during the base flood discharge.

Article 11: To see if the town will vote to add the following section to the Hart's Location Floodplain Conservation District Ordinance, Appendix B:

SECTION 12 SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD AREAS

1. In special flood hazard areas the Board of Selectmen shall determine the 100-year flood elevation in the following order of precedence according to the data available:

a. In Zone AE, refer to the elevation data provided in the community's Flood Insurance Study and accompanying FIRM.

2. The Board of Selectmen's 100-year flood elevation determination will be used as criteria for requiring in Zone AE that:

- a. All substantial improvement of residential structures have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated to or above the 100-year flood elevation.
- b. That all substantial improvements of non-residential structures have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated to or above the 100-year flood level; or together with attendant utility and sanitary facilities, shall:
 - be floodproofed so that below the 100-year flood elevation the structure is watertight with walls substantially impermeable to the passage of water;
 - ii. have structural components capable of resisting hydrostatic and hydrodynamic loads and the effects of buoyancy; and
 - iii. be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect that the design and methods of construction are in accordance with accepted standards of practice for meeting the provisions of this section.
- c. All manufactured homes to be placed or substantially improved within special flood hazard areas shall be elevated on a permanent foundation such that the lowest floor of the manufactured home is at or above the base flood level; and be securely anchored to resist floatation, collapse, or lateral movement. Methods of anchoring may include, but are not limited to, use of over-the-top or frame ties to ground anchors.
- d. All recreational vehicles placed on sites within Zone AE shall either:
 - i. be on the site for fewer than 180 consecutive days;
 - ii. be fully licensed and ready for highway use; or
 - iii. meet all standards of Section 3 of this ordinance and the elevation and anchoring requirements for "manufactured homes" in Section 11 (2) (c) of this ordinance.

A recreational vehicle is ready for highway use if it is on its wheels or jacking system, is attached to the site only by quick disconnect type utilities and security devices, and has no permanently attached additions.

- e. For all substantial improvements, fully enclosed areas below the lowest floor that are subject to flooding are permitted provided they meet the following requirements:
 - i. the enclosed area is unfinished or flood resistant, usable solely for the parking of vehicles, building access or storage;

- ii. the area is not a basement;
- iii. shall be designed to automatically equalize hydrostatic flood forces on exterior walls by allowing for the entry and exit of floodwater. Designs for meeting this requirement must either be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect or must meet or exceed the following minimum criteria: A minimum of two openings having a total net area of not less than one square inch for every square foot of enclosed area subject to flooding shall be provided. The bottom of all openings shall be no higher than one foot above grade. Openings may be equipped with screens, louvers, or other coverings or devices provided that they permit the automatic entry and exit of floodwater.
