#### TOWN WARRANT THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN OF LEE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lee in the County of Strafford (L.S.) in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town of Lee on Tuesday the ninth day of March, to act on the following subjects:

(Polls will be open from 10:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M.)

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To see if the Town will vote the changes in the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board.

(Articles 3 through 18 on appropriations will be taken up at the Mast Way School on Wednesday, the tenth day of March at eight o'clock in the evening.)

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as may be necessary for General Government, including Town Officers salaries and expenses, election and registration, 'town buildings; for Health, Vital Statistics, Public Library, Employees' Retirement and Social Security, Police, Insurance, planning and Zoning, Town reports, parks and playgrounds, interest on temporary loans, cemeteries and county taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be deposited with the Town Trustees of the Trust Funds as a capital reserve for equipment for the Fire Department.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of the Town Dump.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Highways.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred eight dollars and ninety-five cents (\$708.95) for the construction of Class V Highways under the provisions of the TRA, so called. The

State will contribute the sum of four thousand seven hundred twenty-six dollars and thirty-four cents (\$4,726.34).

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the Ambulance Corp. of Durham.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred twenty-five dollars (\$725.00) toward the support of the Oyster River Home Health Agency.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

11. (On petition of Dr. Walter Durost and nine other registered voters of the Town.) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate toward the purchase of a Radar for the Lee Police Department.

12. (On petition of Richard Weyrick and nine other registered voters of the Town.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty dollars (\$50.00) to cover expenses for the operation of the Conservation commission for the year 1971, to include membership dues in the New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions.

13. (On petition of Richard Weyrick and nine other registered voters of the Town.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) to cover expenses in planting trees on five (5) acres and performing timber stand improvements on five (5) acres of the Town forest lands, provided that cost-share funds will be made available through the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

14. (On petition of LaVohn Weyrick and nine other registered voters of the Town.) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) to help defray the expenses of the operation of the Beech Hill Cooperative Recreation Area for the year 1971, on the condition that said amount be deemed payable only if matched by equal appropriation from each of the Towns of Durham and Madbury.

15. (On petition of Gerald Ouellette and nine other registered voters of the Town.) To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of twenty four hundred dollars (\$2,400.00) for the construction of a multi-season recreation facility at the Town Park under the supervision of the Lee Recreation Commission.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired from tax sales.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

#### LEE FIRE DEPARTMENT 1970

The Fire Department responded to 19 calls in 1970 with loss estimated at 330,000.00. Mutual Aid was called upon for help on three occasions, and responded to seven calls to other towns.

These calls were for Fire Department manpower, and do not include Red Network calls for ambulance, police, checking smokes, permits, dump and other miscellaneous items that Red Network dispatchers are called on to perform.

As this will be my last annual Fire Department Report, I would like at this time to thank everyone who has supported the Fire Department actively and financially, to any degree, and made our work easier.

I I have not retired from the Fire Department and intend to support Chief Hatch, the officers and men, the Fire Department Auxiliary and the Red Network Ladies to the best of my ability and hope you will do the same.

#### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1970 forest fire season was a quiet one in this area, quiet in part because of your continued cooperation and favorable weather conditions.

Fires that did occur were, for the most part, caused by debris burning, children and smokers.

The elimination of these three causes of forest fires would drastically change this picture-- to bring about this change we make the following suggestions:

1. When the ground is not covered with snow a permit to burn must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden. This permit covers waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, as well as garden trash and brush burning such burning is restricted by regulation to prior to 9:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M. with the following exceptions:

Commercial or industrial burning is permissible at any time under normal conditions but only with the approval of the District Chief and a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.

- 2. Fires caused by children can be prevented only with the complete cooperation of parents in the supervision of their children, keep matches out of reach of children, this action will help to prevent fires and may save a life, the life of your child. Try to explain this to your child, won't you?
- 3. Forest fires caused by smokers can be reduced in number by the exercise of more care in the discarding of matches and smoking material whether from a vehicle or by a hiker. In all cases, make sure that the butt or match you discard is out, dead out. Smokey says, "Thanks for your help", and invites you to join with him in setting a good example for others in the prevention of fires and the protection of our environment.

#### OYSTER RIVER HOME HEALTH ASSOCIATION Annual Report 1970

The Oyster River Home Health Association is a visiting nurse agency serving the towns of Durham, Lee, Madbury and Newmarket. It was incorporated on February 27, 1967 and the Board of Directors is made up of five members from each town. Included in the standing committees are physicians, registered nurses, a registered physical therapist, a registered dietitian, an attorney and lay persons.

The administrative nurse is Mrs. Lillian Howes, R.N. and Her assistants are Mrs. Norman Yeaton, R.N. and Mrs. Hugh McGill, registered physical therapist. The agency's office is located at 1 Madbury Road, Durham, where the nurse can be reached Monday through Friday. Telephone 868-5055 from 8 A.M. to 4 P.M. or through one's own physician. During the hours when the nurses are out on call, one may leave a message through the answering service at the same phone number.

Funds for the support of the association come from contributions from organizations and individuals, membership and nursing fees, grants and funds voted by the participating towns. Memberships (\$1.00) and contributions are tax deductable.

Continued support from the four towns through appropriations to be made at the 1971 town meetings is anticipated.

## **RFPORT OF THE LEE CONSERVATION COMMISSION FOR 1970**

The Lee Conservation Commission meets monthly, the first Tuesday of every month and would welcome any interested townspeople to attend our meetings by phoning either of the co-chairmen to learn the place of the meeting.

During the past year we have started on an inventory of the scenic, historic and natural areas of the town. We are mapping roads and potential trails. We are working on a Nature Trail for the Mast Way School and the townspeople and hope to have at least part of this open for use next summer.

We have looked into the possibilities of acquiring river front property of historical and natural interest with matching Bureau of Outdoor Recreation (a Federal Agency) funds. If an agreeable price can be worked out this would be a fine acquisition for the town.

We gave a half scholarship to a Lee youngster to attend Conservation Camp at Bear Brook State Park. This scholarship will be available every year to a qualified High School student from the Town of Lee.

We also sponsored tree improvement work on the town forest.

We received the \$750 from Spaulding Potter Trusts and this is now earning interest in the bank along with the money voted at previous Town Meetings. There is no large appropriation request in this year's warrant because these matching funds are no longer available. However, additional funding may be forthcoming in the future through the newly formed New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions to be used for acquisition of scenic, historic and natural areas in the town.
