TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lisbon Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the sixth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects, all except 1 to be considered at seven-thirty in the afternoon.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To hear reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriations for the same as set forth in the following budget:

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend the sum of \$5,000.00 (Five thousand dollars) from surplus for the Equipment Fund.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote on the question, "Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Laws relative to playing beano be adopted in this city or town?"
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell property acquired by Deed of the Tax Collector.
- 8. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 (Six hundred dollars) to be used toward the operation of the Information Booth in the Town of Lisbon, to be sponsored by the Lisbon Chamber of Commerce.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Planning Board to regulate non-residential developments as provided by New Hampshire R.S.A. 36:19a.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to spend those funds received through the Revenue Sharing (State and Local Assistance Act of 1972) in the amount of \$15,000.00 (Fifteen thousand dollars) for general Winter Maintenance of roads and \$16,812.00 (Sixteen thousand eight hundred twelve dollars) for general Summer Maintenance of roads.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a road agent, to be effective at the end of present road agent's term.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions in Life Safety Code 101, the 1970 Edition and National Building Code.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR 1972

In addition to the general round of activities including training, meetings, and fire fighting, the firemen spent a considerable amount of time working at the Lions Community Field. A filling and widening project was completed with great success and the results in added space for our horse show, the soccer field, and baseball outfield are evidence of the value of this undertaking. Parking area for the skating rink and tennis courts was also prepared — the tennis courts now being located on the site of the previous area.

A public inspection, demonstration, and education day were held to commemorate National Fire Prevention Week. The firemen were well organized to handle the situation, but the wintery blizzard so early in October discouraged attendance. (It's a good thing firemen are not deterred from doing their duty on account of adverse weather conditions!) Our equipment was all on display, and there were interesting demonstrations on the use of the pumps and tankers, air packs, resuscitators, and fire extinguishers. It is hoped that another attempt of this kind will meet with better success and more interest from the taxpayers.

A few members of our department attended the excellent Mutual Aid Fire Training School held in Littleton last fall; another is planned for this year, and it is my hope that all members of our department will take advantage of the opportunity.

There continue to be real needs for efficient operation of our Fire Department. We need more manpower. It is getting increasingly difficult to have the red network covered at all times, especially during the new government-planned long weekends. It seems quite an imposition to have the same few cover the phones over and over again. And the number of men available at these times is alarmingly small.

We also continue to feel real need for an adequate fire station for housing our equipment and for more efficient operation. The department itself has established a building fund in anticipation of the day when a suitable location might be found and new building begun, and our horse shows add to the fund each year. In these times of higher and higher costs, it is difficult to feel we can afford to go ahead planning such a project, yet it will be impossible to add to our apparatus without adequate garage area.

A member of our department did an excellent job of preparing a Lisbon-Lyman directory so that we have an up-to-date residence directory for these towns.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative State-town program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development upon recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire, remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent a forest fire.
