

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Surry in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Surry on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next at 7:30 P.M. in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
 - 2. To hear the reports of the town officers.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds that may have been received by the Town during the past year.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$8,400 for the purpose of maintaining improvements to the following Class V road within the Town: namely the Joslin Road commencing at the junction of Route 12A, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Surry, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the purchase of land from the Robert M. Crain Estate abutting Route 12A and adjacent to land contain-

ing the Fire Station, the frontage on Route 12A being twenty-five (25) feet with a depth of three hundred eighty (380) feet, or take any action in relation thereto.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept the amendments to RSA Chapter 41: the following new section 41: 16-a, 26-a, and 2-a, to determine if they are in favor of having a three year term for the Town Clerk, Town Treasurer and Tax Collector respectfully, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 8. By Petition: To see if the Town will vote to request the assistance of the Tax Commission in appraising all the taxable property in Town.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the invitation of the N. H. State Highway Dept. of N. H. of turning over the so-called Perkins Bridge on Route 12A in town to the property of the N. H. State Highway Dept., the town to pay its share of one-sixth the cost of a new bridge according to the specifications of State Highway Bridges the state to pay five-sixths of the total cost, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget as presented by the Budget Committee and raise and appropriate money for the same, or take action in relation thereto.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to abandon the section of the old state highway in the west part of the town at the Westmoreland town line, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Town Zoning Ordinances as follows:
 - 1. Amend Section 1, (4) to read as follows: "No building or structure, including mobile homes and trailers as defined in the ordinance, shall be built or altered or moved, within the limits of the Town of Surry except with the approval in writing of the Zoning Board of Adjustment, in order to insure compliance with Federal and State Laws relative to water supplies, sanitation and fire hazards."
 - 2. Amend Section 5, (b) so that the last sentence

reads as follows: "Any building or structure within the Town limits shall be set back at least ten feet from the side and rear property lines."

- 3. Amend Section 5, (4) by deleting the words "in any District within three hundred (300) feet from the center line of any District highway" and substituting the words "within the town limits." and Section 5, (4-b) by changing 300 gallons to 500 gallons per dwelling unit."
- 4. Add a new Section 5, (5) as follows: "A dwelling unit, for the purpose of this ordinance, means one or more rooms arranged for the use of one or more individuals living together as a single housekeeping unit with cooking, living, sanitary and sleeping facilities, and intended for other than transient occupancy."
- 5. Amend Section 7, (2) by adding the following new sentence, "The applicant shall pay all relevant costs in connection with the hearing."
- 6. Amend Section IX of the Trailer Section of the Zoning Ordinance by deleting the following: "A fee of \$20 per year payable to the Town of Surry shall be assessed for a permit to locate and occupy a mobile home for residential purposes outside a duly licensed trailer park in the Town of Surry."
- 13. To take up any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
