## AUDITOR'S REPORT

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Windsor, New Hampshire  
February 17, 1930

I have this day examined the books and accounts of the Town Officers whose duties require them to handle funds of the Town, and report as follows:

### **Tax Collector**

I find the Tax Collector has paid to the Treasurer during the current fiscal year the sum of \$2532.61, this being the amount he claims collected, plus a certain amount for interest. I have not seen a detailed list of uncollected taxes so cannot vouch for this item.

### **Town Clerk**

I have examined the stubs in the Automobile Permit book, and those in the Dog License book and find that all money collected for 1929 permits and all money collected for dog licenses for the current fiscal year, less fees, has been paid to the Treasurer.

### **Trust Fund Committee**

I have verified the principal of the various funds and the income received for the current fiscal year by examining the pass books of the Savings Banks where these funds are invested and find that the Trust Funds Committee's accounts are correct.

### **Treasurer**

Verified all income as shown by the audit and find the Treasurer has accounted for it properly. Payments are in all cases authorized by Selectmen's orders, and the balance of cash shown by the Treasurer, \$98.15, is correct. I have examined the last bank statement and pass book and find that this money is actually on hand.

### **Selectmen**

The Selectmen's accounts are correctly cast and the expenses seem to be such as would be proper in the accounts of a town.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

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To the School Board of Windsor, N. H.:

The Superintendent of Schools presents the following report for the school year 1928-1929:

Although we still have no school in session in our district, it will be of interest to know something about the education of our children who are attending school in other districts.

We have, this year, five pupils in different schools. Lillian Mae Manworren attended the Dole School, Mary and Norman Chapman and Edgar Jones attended the Lower Village School, and Stanley Nelson attended New Hampshire University. Mabel Wheeler no longer is a Windsor pupil as she moved to Washington before the opening of school. We had no pupils in high school this year.

Lillian, Norman and Edgar were in the sixth grade and Mary was in the seventh. Edgar moved out of town in October, and Norman was out of school some time on account of illness. For these reasons our average membership in the grades was only 2.87 and the average attendance 2.62, but the average per cent of attendance, 91.2%, was fairly good. Our four pupils had ten tardy marks, which considering their distance from the schools, and the roads they were obliged to travel, was also fairly good.

The teachers of our pupils both had had considerable teaching experience, and both had the highest form of certificate granted by the State Board of Education.

As far as I can determine from the teachers' registers the schools which our children attended had 9 visits from Windsor parents and friends. We would be glad to have you visit the schools more often. The Superintendent visited these two schools 69 times during the year, or about once a week each. The pupils in the Lower Vil-

lage had the benefit of music supervision, and of a very fine school yard.

Although it might seem well to have a school of our own, yet under the present circumstances our children receive better instruction than we could possibly offer in the size of school ours would necessarily be, even if a competent experienced teacher could be persuaded to teach so small a school. I feel that we are offering our children a good educational opportunity at comparatively small cost.
