BELMONT TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Belmont in the County of Belknap, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall, first floor, in said Belmont on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To choose one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of the Public Library for three years, one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years.

3. To see if the Town will vote to change the time for discussion of the Warrant in 1965 to 2:00 P. M., on the Saturday after the second Tuesday in March.

4. To see what action the Town will take upon the Budget as recommended by the Budget Committee.

5. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes paid within thirty days of presentation of tax bills.

6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year.

7. To see what the Town will vote to do with the income from the John M. Sargent Fund.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to refinance and/or renew any loans **which** may become due during the current municipal year.

9. To see if the Town will vote to have a detailed inventory of taxable property in the Town as assessed by the Selectmen, published each 3rd year as a part of the Town Report. Beginning with the next year's Town Report, the year 1965 report or in an individual booklet form.

10. Suggested Town Warrant Article on Restraint of Dogs, to be Presented to Selectmen for Inclusion in 1965 Town Warrant

"To see if the Town will vote to have all owners or keepers of dogs within the Town of Belmont come under the following Ordinance:

'All owners or keepers of dogs within the Town of Belmont, shall, beginning April 1, 1965, and thereafter, keep said animals restrained from running at large off the owner's property, unless said animals are on a leash and under the direct control of the owner or **his agent**. Upon finding a dog running at large off the owner's property, and not on a leash and under the direct control of the owner or his agent, the Dog Officer of the town or any police officer shall forthwith impound said animal, if possible, and if it bears a collar and tag, notify the owner. If the owner cannot be located or fails to call for the animal within five (5) days, it shall be destroyed by the Dog Officer without liability on the part of the officer or the Town. There shall be no obligation to notify the owner of any animal not wearing a collar and tag. Upon complaint or investigation, if it is determined

that the same animal is found loose or at large as defined by this ordinance a second time within a twelve month period, the owner or keeper may be summonsed to court and if found guilty of violating this ordinance, shall be fined not more than ten dollars for each violation".

11. To see if the Town will vote to have the official appraisers from the Tax Commission Office in Concord revalue the property in the Town of Belmont, N. H., during 1965. The cost will be approximately \$6800.00.

12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$50,000 to be used for a new well and fifteen acres of land and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the Town bonds, said bonds to be paid from the water department funds over a period not to exceed thirty years.

13. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new truck for the highway department. Also to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed \$10,000 and to issue in the name of and on credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor said notes to be paid over a period not to exceed four years.

14. To see if the Town will vote to have the Moderator forthwith fill the vacancy existing on the Town Planning Board, and to instruct the planning board to proceed forthwith to study the advisability of adopting some form of Zoning Ordinance in the town, said planning board to report back to the next Town Meeting. Also to give the Moderator power to fill any future vacancies that may exist on said board.

15. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue part of old Route No. 106 up to new Route 106 which is near State Highway Shed.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

January 29, 1965

Board of Selectmen
Belmont, New Hampshire

Gentlemen :

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Belmont for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Water Department, Library, Trustees of Trust Funds and Municipal Court.

*Financial Statements**Comparative Balance Sheets:*

December 31, 1963 — December 31, 1964: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1963 and December 31, 1964, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$3,284.55, in 1964.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows :

*Comparative Statements of Appropriations & Expenditures -
Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)*

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimates and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$5,102.13, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$2,036.68, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$3,065.45.

*Summary Statement of Receipts & Expenditures:
(Exhibit B-1)*

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1964, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Water Department: (Exhibit E)

A statement of the receipts and expenditures of the Water Department for 1964 is contained in Exhibit E.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amount of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in the report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$102.55, from \$26,034.59 to \$26,137.14, in 1964, as shown herewith:

The lists of uncollected taxes on the warrants of 1961 and prior years should be carefully gone over by the Board of Selectmen and Tax Collector and such taxes thereon as appear to be uncollectible should be abated.

The two year period provided by law having expired on the unredeemed taxes of the levy of 1961 and prior years, the Collector should give deeds to the Town for all of the properties represented by these liens.

Surety Bond:

The surety bond of the Town Clerk should be increased in amount from \$3,000.00 to \$4,000.00.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184, of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Belmont for their assistance during the course of the audit.

BELMONT POLICE DEPARTMENT**Reports for the Year Ended December 31, 1964**

Thanks to the foresight of the people of Belmont, we now have a permanent, full-time Police Chief, a service which many other towns have provided, and which has greatly improved the status of law-enforcement here.

Since March, your Police Chief has worked 2,180½ hours, plus being "on call" when off-duty, and he and his wife have answered 2,475 phone calls, an average of six daily. Some weeks, he has put in 77 hours or more, and his average hourly pay would come to only \$1.44, dividing his weekly salary by average hours worked. This does not include clerical time and people calling or coming to his home. On a \$1000 annual car allowance, he has traveled 24,821 miles on police business.

During 1964, there were 210 calls between midnight and 9:00 A. M. The Chief took eight days vacation this summer, with Dep. Sheriff Raymond Lakeman and Asst. Chief Robert Harper filling in, but only 25 complete days off have been taken all year.

Police headquarters at the Town Hall have been remodeled, and an extra room added, partly with money raised by the sale of tonic.

Due to Federal rulings, our radios were declared obsolete in 1964. New equipment was bought, and we hope to complete the program in 1965. This will provide instant contact between the Chief's home and his car, and car-to-car communications between two local cars, plus tie-in with State and Laconia police.

The volume of business we have handled has continued to increase, and we hope with the great strides we have been able to make due to the awareness and cooperation of the public, we shall keep pace with it, and still get by with a budget several thousands of dollars less than many towns of comparable size. Our thanks to the people of Belmont, the Budget Committee, Planning Board, Selectmen and Sheriff Rodney Crockett for their assistance and support, and we express our sincere hope that we may continue to merit your good will in the years to come.

NEW HAMPSHIRE STATE CIVIL
DEFENCE AGENCY

To: Town Selectmen and City Councils:

The nuclear age is here. This fact is indisputable and we all must learn to live with it. Upon you, as an elected official in a position of leadership in your community, now falls the responsibility of decision.

The National Public Fallout Shelter Program has already located many shelter areas and its goal is eventually a public shelter space for every citizen. Here in New Hampshire, more than three hundred (300) facilities located in less than fifty (50) communities are now in the process of being licensed, marked and stocked. These facilities need trained personnel assigned to them. Each shelter should have a trained manager and three (3) deputies assigned to it.

Where is this trained personnel to come from? This is your area of decision! In any emergency, to whom does the public look for direction, guidance and leadership? You, more than anyone else, know the answer to that question - to its elected and appointed leaders.

Very careful consideration for a few moments brings some interesting facets of this problem into the light. In the event of a nuclear attack, these Shelter Managers will be called upon to handle people in confused, panic or near panic conditions. What qualifications or characteristics are necessary or desirable in a Shelter Manager? When are the doors to a public shelter, stocked with supplies purchased by public funds, to be closed? How should dope addicts, alcoholics, or emotionally disturbed persons be handled in cramped, less-than-ideal shelter environments?

We know that if a nuclear attack occurs, the demand on police officers and firemen, on auxiliary personnel and related forces, will be tremendous. In the event of heavy fallout, even police and firemen will be forced into shelters. Naturally, there should be pre-attack assignments of these personnel to specific shelter areas, where and when feasible.

It is conceivable that a police officer, fireman, or welfare worker may find himself in a shelter where the trained, pre-attack assigned staff is non-existent or unavailable at the time of the emergency. If this person has had shelter management training, he may be able to control the shelter and contribute to the saving of many lives.

Perhaps at this time, there is no shelter area in your community. This situation could change in the near future. Or, personnel taking this course might move to or be visiting a community with a shelter area at the time of attack. In any event, this office strongly urges you to seek volunteers in your community to enroll in a shelter management course. Such a course is being offered in or near your community soon. Please contact your local Civil Defense Director for particulars.

REPORT OF THE CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR**For the Year Ending December 31, 1964**

It has been the goal of your Civil Defense Director this year to systematically revitalize the various units of our local organization. The Auxiliary Police were reorganized, and provided with badges, hats, shirts, ties, handcuffs and billy clubs. They proved very useful to the Regular Police on a number of occasions, including traffic duty on Old Home Day, Hallowe'en Duty, and during a search for escapes from the Belknap County Farm.

The R.A.C.E.S. radio for contact with Civil Defense area headquarters, for which money was appropriated and held over two years ago, has finally arrived and been set up at the Fire Station, together with five Walkie-Talkies on the forestry frequency, which will be used by the Fire Department and for radiological monitoring. These units proved their worth during a big fire at the town dump this year. Since additional funds were available over and above the cost of the R.A.C.E.S. radio and walkie-talkies, with approval of the Board of Selectmen, the local Civil Defense paid half the cost of a base station and two mobile radios for the Police Department, to replace obsolete equipment which was outlawed by the Federal Communications Commission in 1964. These radios, which are expected to be installed sometime after the first of January, 1965, will be owned by the Town, and the Police Department will pay the other half of the cost of acquisition. A rescue boat to be used by the Fire Department in drownings was acquired by Civil Defense this year.

Radiological fallout monitoring stations have been established at the Winnisquam and Belmont Fire Stations, and the staff is in the process of being reorganized.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Members of the School Board and Citizens of Belmont:

The information included in the 1964 Annual Report represents an educational history of the past year.

The School Board has used the funds provided by the local taxpayers and the foundation, building and sweepstakes aid provided by the state to improve the education of local youth.

The vocational program has been expanded annually with mechanical drawing and general metals added to the four-year curriculum. The library has added a tremendous number of books to supplement the local library. The part-time librarian and part-time guidance teacher have improved the school. The high school principal does not have any teaching duties and is free to use his time for the administration, organization and supervision of the school program.

The School Board, in addition to the usual maintenance and general policies, has taken the following actions:

1. Completion of the school parking lot and repair of the school road.
2. Construction of counter and shelves for the lunch program.
3. Partiton of the shop for a mechanical drawing room.
4. Purchase of a government surplus truck for school use.
5. New ceiling for the lunch room and the shop.
6. Provision of an assistant principal for the elementary schools.
7. Addition of driver training instruction.

The Sargent Fund Directors deserve the thanks of the community for turning over the receipts this year for the school district. The School Board will use all the funds for the purchase of band instruments.

The State Board of Education, effective July 1, 1964, cancelled the former Supervisory Union No. 59 and added Belmont to Union No. 18 consisting of Franklin, Tilton-Northfield, Sanbornton and Hill.

May I extend my thanks and appreciation to the School Board, the Municipal Budget Committee, the Selectmen, the School Treasurer, the Principals and Teachers, the School Lunch Director and Assistants, the Bus Superintendent and Operators, the Parent-Teacher Association, the Chief of Police, and all civic and social groups for their cooperation in the continued improvement of Belmont education.
