Report of School Board

For the Year Ending Feb. 15, 1913.

To the Citizens of the School District of Brookfield:

We submit the following report as to the welfare of our schools:

Some needed repairing has been done and a few new books have been purchased. We have tried to expend the money allotted to us for that purpose to the best advantage.

We have endeavored to supply a good corps of teachers and feel that the work done has been as good as usual. Two pupils left our schools in the fall to attend Brewster Academy at Wolfeboro.

The daily attendance has been good, but there is still room for improvement. A few are graduating at fourteen years. Do not graduate from the town school too soon, especially if you are going no higher. Much practical knowledge can still be gained in "the little red school house."
