TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lisbon Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the fifth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects except 1, 2, 3, and 4, to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote in favor of adopting the proposed amendments by the Planning Board.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote for the adoption of homeowners exemption as provided in RSA 72 revised laws State of New Hampshire.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote on the question, 'Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Laws relative to playing beano be adopted in this city or town?"
- 5. To hear reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriations for the same as set forth in the following budget:

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to expend the sum of \$5,000.00 (five thousand dollars) from surplus for the Equipment Fund.

RSF---Revenue Sharing Funds

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell property acquired by Deed of the Tax Collector.
- 10. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 (six hundred dollars) to be used toward the operation of the Information Booth in the Town of Lisbon, to be sponsored by the Lisbon Chamber of Commerce.

- 11. To see if the Town will vote to spend those funds received through Revenue Sharing (State and Local Assistance Act of 1972) in the amount of \$5,610.12 (five thousand six hundred ten dollars and twelve cents) for Summer Road Maintenance; \$12,000.00 (t welve thousand dollars) for Public Safety--Police Department; \$3,000.00 (three thousand dollars) for Health Services; \$1,600.00 (sixteen hundred dollars) for Recreation; \$5,000.00 (five thousand dollars) for Libraries; and \$6,000.00 (six thousand dollars) for Social Services for the Aged and Poor.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,900.00 for re-roofing the Lisbon Public Library.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$3,000.00 (three thousand dollars) to purchase a new Police Cruiser.
- 14. To see if the Town of Lisbon will vote to create a special unpaid committee to be known as a regional refuse disposal planning committee, consisting of three persons appointed by the Moderator of the Town of Lisbon. The duties and responsibilities of this committee will be to study the handling and disposal of solid waste and report their findings to the Selectmen of the Town of Lisbon on or before July 1, 1974.

(As authorized by RSA 53-B:1)

- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds through the State Disaster Coordinating office and to expend the funds so received to repair the damage to Town roads and/or bridges caused by any declared emergency and to authorize the selectmen to borrow such sums as may be necessary to defray the costs of repairing damage in anticipation of Federal Disaster Funds to be received through the State Disaster Coordinating Office.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to spend \$5,000.00 (five thousand dollars) of those funds received through Revenue Sharing (State and Local Assistance Act of 1972) for the purchase of a new truck for the highway department.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the citizens of Lisbon for their help and understanding over the past year.

For the second year the Lisbon Police Department had the help of two Police Cadets funded by a grant from the Governor's Commission on Crime and Delinquency. Cadets Les Corey and Arthur 'Wimp' Boutin were selected.

The Lisbon Police Department has put in for a grant to the Crime Commission for additional office equipment. This grant has been approved, pending funds from the Federal Government.

The communication system put in by the town for the Police and Fire Departments has improved and speeded the response to complaints and emergencies. During the flood of June and December it proved to be of great value.

Over the past year the department had more motor vehicle warnings and checkups than any time in the last five years. Driving while intoxicated arrests were up 100% and still I'm saddened to have to report four highway fatalities for 1973. We are working harder in 1974 to bring that number back to zero.

In the year 1973, the Lisbon Police Department was assisted by Local, County, State and Federal agencies in its work.

Again, thank you for your continued support.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR 1973

Your Fire Department takes great pride in its accomplishments and dedication to civic duties in spite of great handicaps to efficient operation.

Our Eleventh Annual Horse Show was a tremendous success and the great respect for this excellent show continues to grow in the State and all of New England as evidenced by the high quality of animals exhibited. Receipts from this project go into our Building Fund.

Our Open House in commemoration of National Fire Prevention Week was held at the Fire Station, with but little more success than last year's. To the few citizens who did come, we are grateful for their interest and hope that the demonstrations and exhibits were informative. To the rest, we hope you will come next time, too.

Our Department took an active part in the excellent Twin State Fire School. Two days were spent at Bradford, Vermont, and two other days right here in Lisbon.

Again several firemen pitched in to give the Lions a hand with work on the Community Field, especially after the devastating floods, and we do plan to hold work projects there again when spring and summer weather arrive.

New equipment added this year consisted of two Scott air packs and a foam gun.

The critical lack of space for housing our equipment, holding meetings, and conducting training sessions continues to be a great deterrent for efficient operation of your Fire Department. We are already hopelessly cramped in present quarters, and it is just impossible to meet new demands and regulations that require modern equipment.

With four new members, all of whom have taken some fire training, we now have our manpower up to twenty-two. We are sorry to lose Malcolm Clough who has resigned after twenty-five years, and I am very grateful to him for his faithful service and support.

The closing of the Knapp Home and the afternoon closing of the Bakery have compounded the Red Network problem. We are working with the Police Department in an effort to work out a solution. These volunteers who have given us coverage for so many years have rendered service above and beyond....It has now reached a point where we must make some arrangements to be sure that these emergency calls can be handled.

Prevention is still the best weapon, and we are very grateful to the citizens of Lisbon and Lyman for their part in eliminating fire hazards and for calling promptly when help may be needed. With the thought in mind that the Red Network phone number, 2211, should be always available for emergencies, it seems appropriate to ask that everyone try to curtail the unnecessary calls. Of a total of 110 calls listed below, only 15 of them were legitimate emergencies! Small children playing with phones and careless dialing resulted in at least 73 other calls!

NORTH COUNTRY HOME HEALTH AGENCY, INC. Report of 1973

The following is a statement of services from January 1, 1973 to December 31, 1973 rendered to the people of Lisbon by our Agency.

The nursing staff made 629 visits to residents of Lisbon along with 4 Physical Therapy and 20 Social Service visits. This is a total of 653 visits made to residents of your town. Coupled with the Child Health Programs and the Expectant Parent Classes this represents approximately \$10,658.00 in services to Lisbon residents in 1973. Of this amount \$2,017.00 was charged to town funds. Last year's appropriation was \$1,585.00 so the remaining \$432.00 was charged to other funds or paid for from donations.

In mid year we terminated the Social Service Component as Federal funds expired for this program. We were able to refer a great number of cases with social problems to other social agencies in the area and utilize other staff members for these services.

This fall we initiated a series of Well Child Clinics for this area. They will be held every other month with either Dr. Bishop or Dr. Lewis as the attending physician. Physicals are given by appointment. These are geared to low income families especially those children not under regular medical attention. The age group is primarily birth to 5 years although exceptions will be made in special circumstances. Immunizations and TB tests are available for any child needing them. We plan in the future to include vision and hearing testing and dental screening.

We also held a series of Expectant Parent Classes in November. The people attending received instruction in Child Birth, Diet and Nutrition, Baby Care, Exercises and many basic facts about prenatal care. This series of 5 classes will be run in Woodsville in the Spring and in Littleton in July or August. They will be held approximately three times a year. There was an average attendance of 12 persons at each of the 5 classes with many fathers attending. The results were very gratifying. People from Littleton, Lisbon, Bath, Haverhill and Bethlehem attended the classes which were held in Lisbon.

The Nursing and Physical Therapy Components of our service are very important to the patients we serve. These services help reduce hospital stays, assist people to return to as high a degree of independent functioning as is possible. They also allow people to recuperate at home in more familiar surroundings and with family members present. The service also saves money as it is less costly than extended hospital stays.

An example of this would be a 35 year old male patient with Transverse Myelitis, Sacral Decubitus and Neurogenic Bladder. This patient also has Laennec's Cirrhosis. This patient is being seen 5 days a week to treat the decubitus, irrigate the catheter, monitor general condition and supervise diet, medication and cirrhosis. This patient has been on our caseload since May 25, 1973. The total cost of our service for this patient has been \$2,160.00 for that period. Adding \$180.00 a month for housekeeping and food service brings the total cost of maintaining this individual at home to \$3,240.00. Had he been cared for in a hospital it would have cost \$18,000.00 for a comparable period and \$7,200.00 for an extended care facility. As you can see, this represents a substantial savings to whoever is paying the bill. The cost of all these services eventually comes from the tax or public dollar at some level. As you can see, this service is worth at least each dollar asked for from all services.

We are now planning a Homemaker Home Health Aide Program for the area we serve. This program will provide a much needed service for area residents and reduce the cost of providing nursing service to patients.
