**WARRANT FOR ANNUAL MEETING  
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lyndeboro in the  
County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified  
to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Lyndeboro on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Namely: town officers' salaries, town officers' expenses, election and registration expenses, expenses of town hall and other buildings, police department, fire department, health department, vital statistics, auto and dog fees, town maintenance of highways and bridges, street lighting, general expenses of highway department, town road aid, libraries, town poor, old age assistance, Memorial Day and other celebrations, aid to soldiers and their families, parks and playgrounds, cemeteries, Monadnock Region, interest on temporary loans, on long term notes, on principal of trust funds used by town, payment of notes in anticipation of taxes, serial and long term notes, county taxes, payments to school districts.

3. To see if the town will vote to accept State T. R. A. for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$755.20 and the State will contribute \$3020.80.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for tarring T. R. A. road from Shepard's Corner to the Wilton line.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appro-

priate the sum of \$400.00 for widening and improving highway and stone bridges at foot of Jason Holt hill so called.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$162.50 for insurance of town employees and accept provisions of the Workmen's Compensation law of the State of New Hampshire.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,190.00 for two steel snow plows.

8. Part 1: To see if the town will vote to discontinue and close that part of the road leading from Woodward place to the Old Stage Road (about  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile) which lies between the black-top South Lyndeboro—Lyndeboro Center Road and the Old Stage Road to Greenfield or take any action relating thereto.

Part 2: To see if the town will vote to widen the corner at the intersection of the Old Stage Road and the black-top South Lyndeboro-Lyndeboro Center Road, near the residence of Howell G. Wilcox, and improve and black top that part of said Old Stage Road from near the residence of said Wilcox, to its intersection with the said South Lyndeboro-Lyndeboro Center Road and raise and appropriate money for same or take any action relating thereto.

9. To see what action the town will take on plowing driveways.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to purchase water pump and equipment to be mounted on Ford Truck recently purchased by the Fire Company and equipped with a 650 gallon water tank.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$63.00 ( $\frac{1}{100}$  of 1% of the valuation) to the Monadnock Region of Southern New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed



matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

12. To see if the town will vote to have one trustee of trust funds in place of three now serving or act anything thereon.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

14. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

15. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to distribute inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory April 1st.

16. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget as prepared by the budget committee, or make any alterations thereto.

17. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in re-appraising the taxable property in the town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for same.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Submitted herewith is the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Lyndeborough which was made by this Division. This audit covered the fiscal year ended December 31, 1947, and the period from January 1st to May 12th, 1948. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report which is made up in three sections as follows:

Section I – Fiscal Year Ended December 31, 1947

Section II – Period January 1st to May 12th, 1948

Section III – Statistical Tables Covering Ten Year Period

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

*Comparative Balance Sheets – December 31, 1946 -  
December 31, 1947: (Exh. A)*

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1946 and December 31, 1947, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein a change in the financial condition of the Town amounting to \$3,237.18 took place during the year 1947, which started with a Surplus of \$356.67 and closed with a Net Debt of \$2,880.51.

*Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-1)*

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-1, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

*Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures —  
Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits B & C)*

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1947, are presented in Exhibits B and C. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit C), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$2,023.03, less a net revenue surplus of \$1,291.19, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$731.84.

*Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit D)*

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1947, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit D. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of May 12th, 1948, is indicated in Exhibit I.

*Statistical Tables:*

The third section of the report is comprised of statistical tables covering the ten year period from 1938 to 1947. These are as follows:

- I — Comparative Balance Sheets
- II — Comparative Statement of Indebtedness, Valuation and Taxes
- III — Comparative Statement of Taxable Valuation and Taxes Assessed

#### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible, totals of receipts and expenditures verified and classification of accounts noted.

#### GENERAL COMMENTS

*Selectmen's Accounts:*

Selectmen's orders issued during the period from January 1st to May 12th, 1948, had not been entered in the classification record book at the time of the audit. It is important that all expenditures be recorded according to the proper classifications at least by the end of each month in order that the amount expended may be compared with the amount appropriated for each budgetary item. Otherwise it is not possible to exercise control over appropriations.

In some instances the Selectmen's orders contained only one

signature. Orders should always bear the signatures of at least two members of the Board of Selectmen.

It is not necessary to require receipted bills from vendors. The original itemized bill or invoice should be attached to the voucher which is issued in payment thereof. The treasurer's check when endorsed and cancelled by the bank constitutes a proper receipt.

*Treasurer's Accounts:*

The Treasurer issues separate treasurer's checks in payment of Selectmen's orders. It is recommended that instead of the present procedure the Treasurer countersign the Selectmen's orders (with the name of the depository bank indicated thereon) which thereby become negotiable checks. This removes the possibility of there being any difference between the amount of the order and the check. It also provides for the same numerical sequence for vouchers and order-checks.

It has been the custom for the Treasurer, in some instances, to cash Selectmen's orders after the payee had endorsed the order. Such orders did not go through the bank. It is approved procedure for the Treasurer to cash properly endorsed town checks out of available funds but such checks should in all cases be deposited in the bank so that all receipts and expenditures will be reflected in the bank account.

*Tax Collector:*

The accounts and records of the Tax Collector were found to be in very good condition.

It was noted that there were unredeemed taxes from tax sales on account of levies as far back as 1934. Although a considerable amount of the unredeemed taxes were cleared from the books in 1947, either through redemptions or tax deeds passed to the town, continued efforts should be made to liquidate these accounts. It is suggested that the Selectmen and Tax Collector carefully go over each individual account and that deeds be passed to the Town by the Collector in cases where such deeds are due. If there is any case where for some particular reason it may be inadvisable to take a deed and it is reasonably certain that no redemption will be made, the unredeemed tax should be abated.

*Conclusion:*

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report. This letter of transmittal should be included in its entirety but the inclusion of Exhibits is optional.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Lyndeborough for their assistance during the course of the audit.

9. To see if the school district will vote to authorize the school board to sell the South Lyndeborough School House and the Perham Corner School House.

10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to sell any equipment in the South Lyndeborough and Perham Corner Schools that cannot be used in the new school building.

11. To see what action the district wishes to take relative to using a check-list at all future meetings, such list to be used and checked, at the election of officers and otherwise, at the annual meeting of the district.

## REPORT of SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of Lyndeboro:

I respectfully submit my second annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

### *Better Education*

Better education is the basic need of a free democratic society. We shall remain a free and strong nation only if we have enough free and competent people. The perpetuation of the American way of life requires citizens who understand and love it and are willing to live fervently in accord with it.

Better education cannot be obtained through the efforts of a single agency or group of people. It demands the full cooperation of an informed, educated citizenry; the support of courageous, enlightened school committees; teachers who have a broad cultural background and who understand the needs of the community, and administrative officers who are willing to interpret the needs and power of education and to bring about a working relationship between the people and their schools.

An informed citizenry is one who is aware of pending legislation, both state and national, that will affect education. An informed citizenry will know the policies of the schools and will take an active part and share in the building of wholesome school and community relationships.

A courageous school committee is one that stands firm for the welfare of the children; insists on securing a good professional staff; insists upon adequate and modern tools of learning and promotes sound and educationally defensible school budgeting which will give unqualified opportunities to children.

The good teacher is a growing teacher, and one who can adequately interpret and present the methods and procedures used in effectively teaching the children

under his or her influence. The effective teacher is one who establishes and maintains good esprit de corps among the pupils and parents.

Effective administrative officers should accept the responsibility for providing the best personnel possible and to provide materials and supervise a balanced educational program that will help boys and girls develop wholesome personalities and the ability to effectively participate in the democratic way of life.

Thus, all must work side by side to establish schools equal to the challenge of our times. As this is done we shall not only have better schools and better communities, but in the process we shall become better people.

### *Teacher Improvement*

#### *A. Extension and Summer Courses.*

During the past two years the teachers have been encouraged to improve themselves professionally. To assist in this professional improvement an extension course was held during the late fall and winter of last year. This course was organized through the cooperation of Keene Teachers College and held at Wilton. The area studied was Social Studies in the Elementary Field. The teachers attended this class once a week for fifteen weeks. The purpose of the course was to re-evaluate the offerings in the area of social studies in the elementary school and to develop units of work that would be applicable to their own teaching situations.

Much excellent work was accomplished and the social studies program throughout the Union has taken on new zest and interest.

Many of the teachers who did not attend this course have taken summer school work. It is interesting to note that 76% of the teachers in Supervisory Union No. 63 have either attended summer school or taken extension courses in the past year and a half.

The instruction we are receiving reflects the interest of the teachers in self-improvement.

### *B. Art Workshop.*

In October, all of the teachers in Supervisory Union No. 63 met in Wilton to engage in a three day art workshop. This workshop was organized through the co-operation of the State Department of Education, who in 1947, added a Director of Fine Arts to its staff.

The workshop was established for the purpose of teacher-improvement in the field of art, so that they might go back into their classrooms and re-vitalize their work, thereby making their courses more interesting to the pupils.

The ideas presented dealt with the basic principles of art education in relation to general education. No "bag of tricks" was presented to the teachers. An effort was made through lecture, discussion, demonstration and participation to show the teachers that art is a means of expression and is dependent upon increased powers of imagination, observation and organization.

The teachers returned to their classrooms and applied their learnings to literature, science, health, social studies, etc.

In January 1949, a follow-up program of two days was held, in which the teachers came together for the purpose of discussing their successes and failures, to learn new techniques with different art media, and to present the results of their past two months work.

The results were exceedingly gratifying. Inventive and creative drawings and paintings, the result of the child's problem-solving, took the place of the many color books and patterns that have a tendency to limit the inventive nature of the child. This creative and imaginative freedom in art may account for the school yard being raked and planted with grass and shrubs or the interior of the school painted with stimulating,

although restful colors, rather than the customary brown and buff.

A marked change in art teaching procedures has been recognized throughout the Union. To be sure, an art workshop cannot be expected to take the place of a good art supervisor who gives regular help to teachers, but it is a welcome and very worthwhile substitute.

### *School Enrollments*

No report would be adequate unless some mention was made of the school enrollment trends in the next few years. This problem is not only a national and state problem but it is one that is going to definitely affect many local communities and budgets within the next few years.

This year we have approximately 18.6 million children in the elementary schools. In two years we may expect 20 million and in four years, 22 millions. It is estimated that by 1957 we shall have 26.6 million children in the elementary schools, 8 million more than the 18.6 as of now .

High school attendance will perhaps diminish slightly in the next three years. This is probably due to the low birthrate in the early 30's. However, high school enrollments will gradually increase through the 50's so that by 1960, there will be 8.1 million high school children as compared with the present 6.3 million.

Local conditions vary somewhat from this, particularly if the high schools include grades 7 and 8.

Following is a study of the local school enrollment based upon the Census reports of September 1948:

These enrollments pose problems for local communities. For some it will mean considering construction of additions, or new schools, or entering into a cooperative school program. For others it may mean utilizing present buildings within the community, as an emergency measure, to house the expanding school population.

What ever measures are taken, it should be noted that a school is more than four walls and a roof. Today's education demands spacious rooms, well lighted and attractively decorated with ample playground area adjacent to or as near to the plant as possible. Classroom activities are no longer built around a fixed chair, desk, paper and pencil program. The activities are based upon the philosophy of learning by doing and living by acting.

As new or additional classrooms are being set up the problem of more elementary teachers presents itself. We see no relief in sight in so far as the supply of elementary teachers is concerned. It is estimated that the normal number of new teachers needed in the elementary field in New Hampshire is approximately 150. Next year, according to latest reports, the two New Hampshire Teachers Colleges, namely Keene and Plymouth, will be graduating a total of 25 elementary teachers. For years we have been able to press into service married women, who for one reason or another dropped out of teaching, and women who have retired and have again made themselves available for teaching positions. It appears that this supply is fast becoming exhausted.

Our only hope is to recruit more young people into teaching. We must make teaching attractive enough in terms of salary, living conditions, and working con-



ditions so that young people will be encouraged to enter this profession. Until this is done we may find ourselves "keeping school" rather than "teaching school."

*BUDGET:*

The budget presented for 1949-50 calls for an assessment of \$13,000.00 an increase of \$2913.00 over the budget and special appropriations last year. This increase is accounted for in large part by capital outlay and expenses connected with the construction of the new Lyndeborough School. Principal and interest on new building amounts to \$2250.00; insurance \$300.00; fuel \$150.00; janitor service \$100.00; water, light and janitor's supplies \$50.00; miscellaneous \$63.00.

Every effort was made to keep the school budget as low as possible and yet offer the type of education that is desirable and necessary.
