TOWN WARRANT - 1985

To the inhabitants of the Town of Surry, in the county of Cheshire, in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Surry on Tuesday, the 12th of March, 1985, at 2:00 p.m. in the afternoon to act upon the following:

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 2:00P.M. TO 7:00P.M. ON MARCH 12, 1985 TO CHOOSE THE TOWN OFFICERS AND VOTE ON THE TOWN PLANNING BOARD ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS AS LISTED ON THE OFFICIAL BALLOT.

ON THURSDAY, MARCH 14, 1985, FOR THE BUSINESS MEETING AT THE TOWN HALL AT 7:30 P.M. TO ACT ON THE FOLLOWING ARTICLES OR IN RELATION THERETO.

1. To hear the reports of the Town Officers and Committees. Reports of Town Officers were corrected. Motion is carried to accept the reports.
2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen and the Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Motion is carried.
3. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds that have been received by the Town during the past year. There was no Trust Funds to be accepted in 1984. Motion is carried.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to administer and dispose of and deed any real estate acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's deed, after being advertised, during the year 1984. (RSA 80:42) Motion is carried.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the state, federal or another governmental unit, or private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in RSA 31:96-b. Motion is carried.
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the federal Revenue Sharing Fund for use as set off against the following debt service with the balance of \$521.83 to be used for any general unencumbered expense.

Purpose:

Principal on Fire Truck \$3567.00

Budget Comm. Chairman Sheila Phillips, pointed out that the \$3567.00 in the Article should have been Principal and interest. Motion is carried.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to add to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of reassessment of the Town in 1986. Motion is carried.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$45,000 for the purchase of a new Town highway truck. To authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue and sell bonds or notes in the name and on the credit of the Town under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, Chapter 33 RSA, and to delegate the Board of Selectmen authority to fix the time and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Surry, and to withdraw the sum of \$5,000 plus interest from the Capital Reserve Fund for a total of \$50,000 or take any action in relation thereto. We voted by ballot, 93 votes cast. 59 Yes 34 No, Motion failed to carry.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$45,000 for the purpose of purchasing a new Town highway truck and to withdraw the sum of \$5,000 plus interest from the Capital Reserve Fund for a total expenditure of \$50,000 plus interest from the Capital Reserve Fund, or take any action in relation thereto. Voted by ballot, 86 votes cast. 44 Yes 42 No, Vote carried by 2 votes.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 for the purchase of a used highway truck. To authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue and to sell bonds or notes in the name and on the credit of the Town, under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, authority to fix the time and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Surry, and to withdraw the sum of \$5,000 plus interest from the Capital Reserve Fund, for the total of \$30,000 or take any action in relation thereto.

10. Motion made and seconded not to consider the article.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to add to the established Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of a replacement Town highway truck, or to take any action in relation thereto. Motion made and seconded not to consider the article.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 for the purpose of making improvements to a portion of the Joslin road, or to take any action in relation thereto. Motion carried by vast majority.
13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to act as "Franchising Authority" in accordance with RSA 53-C:3 with regard to the franchising and regulation of the cable television systems. Motion carried 75 Yes 3 No.
14. Shall the Town accept the provisions of RSA53-B:1 2-11 inclusive providing for the establishment of a regional refuse disposal district, together with the Towns of Nelson, Westmoreland, Troy, Swanzey, Gilsum, Hinsdale, Marlborough, Chesterfield, Fitzwilliam, Roxbury, Harrisville and the City of Keene and the construction, maintenance and operation of regional refuse disposal facility by said district in accordance with the provisions of a proposed agreement filed with the Selectmen. Motion is carried.
15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell or otherwise dispose of timber growing on Town property or take any action in relation thereto. Motion is carried.
16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to cost share with the landowner the expense of an independent forester on timber harvest occurring within the Town of Surry, Said expense to be determined by the Selectmen, but not to exceed 10% of the expected revenues, or take any action in relation thereto. Motion made to Amend article 16 by inserting "to the town" following expected revenues. Motion carried.
16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to cost share with the landowner the expense of an independent forester on timber harvest occurring within the Town of Surry. Said expense not to exceed 10% of the expected revenues to the Town, or take any action in relation thereto.

16. Motion carried.

17. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget for the Calendar Year 1985 and to raise and appropriate the money to be expended according to the Budget. Motion carried, total expenditures \$168,734.50 .

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The meeting was adjourned.

3. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds that have been received by the Town during the past year.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of and deed any real estate acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's deed, after being advertised, during the year 1985 (RSA 80:42).
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the state, federal or another governmental unit, or private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in RSA 31:96-b.
6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for use as a setoff against the following debt service with the balance to be used for any general unencumbered expense:

PURPOSE

Principal and interest on Fire Truck \$3,426.00

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the purpose of re-assessment of the Town in 1986, and to withdraw the sum of \$10,000. plus interest from the capital reserve fund for a total expenditure of \$15,233.00, or take any action in relation thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to have the appraisal division of the department of Revenue Administration conduct a complete revaluation starting in 1986 or thereafter and to appoint the Selectmen as agents to oversee the appraisal.

9. BY PETITION:

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to establish a Capital Reserve fund for the purpose of constructing a Town Highway Garage, or to take any action thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget for the Calendar Year 1986 and to raise and appropriate the money to be expended according to the Budget.

SURRY VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

REPORT OF THE FIRE ENGINEERS

The past year saw a slight increase in fire and rescue calls responded to by the fire department.

The attendance at the SVFD monthly meetings and drills was very good. Average attendance by active members was better than 85 per cent. In addition, six members were certified in CPR. We now have nine members certified by the state of NH as Firefighter I.

The insulating and re-siding of the Fire Station last year proved to be a very good investment. Concrete figures have yet to be compiled, but we are very satisfied with the results.

The engineers and Chief Robert Callahan of SWMA designed and executed a fire pre-plan on the town hall. The plan can be adopted to the church or any other large building in the area. It was considered a good learning experience by all involved. Joining Surry for the pre-plan were units and manpower from Keene, Gilsum, Walpole, Marlborough, West Swanzey, and Swanzey Center. We are in the process of preparing at least one pre-plan for next year.

Cheshire County experienced very dry conditions this past spring. A fire ban was imposed by the State Forester. Only one illegal fire was reported during the ban.

The engineers asked the selectmen and budget committee to consider placing an article on the town warrant to start a capital reserve fund for the replacement of our present Phamphlet 19 Pumper which is 18 years old. If purchased in the next few years, the new truck should save homeowners in the town thousands of dollars in insurance premiums.

Realizing the replacement costs of a new fire truck will be high, the volunteer firepersons started a Fire Truck Fund account this past year. The volunteers have raised \$2343.19 from various money raising activities. We are now selling cookbooks compiled by the department using recipes from many townspeople. The proceeds from the cookbook sales will go into this fund.

We wish to thank all who have supported the department and our endeavors this past year. Thanks to all who donated time and recipes to our cookbook.

Please note that the monthly engineers meeting has been changed from the third Monday to the first Monday of the month.

TO: Surry Landowners

In order to maximize the benefits of timber harvest in the Town of Surry, the office of selectmen recommends you consider the services of a private forester. A good forester more than offsets the cost of his services by virtue of increased revenues and also ensures good forestry practices, better market utilization, and insures a contract which protects you.

Recognizing these benefits, the town will assist the financing of the forester under the following guidelines:

1. Up to 10% of expected revenues to the town when the forester is employed prior to any contract with the prospective purchaser.
2. Up to 5% of expected revenues to the town if a contract has been entered into prior to the employ of a forester.

In either case, participation by the town will entitle the town to a copy of the foresters report of the cut.

If you plan to participate in this program, you or your forester should contact the office of selectmen prior to receipt of intent to cut being received at the selectmens' office.

1985 CHANGES TO RSA 79 TIMBER TAX LAW

Introduction

The enactment of the Timber Tax Law in 1949 was for a specific purpose. Very heavy cutting, primarily clear-cutting, was common throughout the years of World War II for the production of pine boxes to transport munitions. At one period during the 1940's more than 75 portable sawmills were located in Rockingham County alone.

The Timber Tax Law set the stage for some very necessary encouragement for landowners to conserve or manage their forests. The payment of taxes at the time of timber harvest, as opposed to taxing trees on an annual basis (ad valorem), encouraged landowners to hold some of their timber to maturity. The law discouraged owners from liquidating timber to avoid the payment of annual tax. It also eliminated the need for assessing officials to evaluate timber stands on a yearly basis, a task that they had little time to accomplish.

The accomplishments of the Timber Tax Law are substantiated by the preliminary 1983 forest survey data for New Hampshire. There is a marked increase in the percent of the total acres of sawtimber in the state when compared to the 1972 figures and those of the decades prior to the enactment of the law. The number of acres in the seedling and sapling category has decreased during this same period. Therefore, it is apparent that liquidation of timber to avoid tax payment is no longer a problem.

The New Law

Filing Responsibility and Penalties

The changes in RSA 79 "Forest Conservation and Taxation - 1985", as of April 1, 1986, require the landowner to pay the timber tax. The law requires that before cutting commences, landowners shall complete an "Intent to Cut" form which may be obtained from their Town Offices. The "Intent to Cut" form must then be filed with the Selectmen in the town where cutting is to take place. The Selectmen are required to process the form and mail appropriate copies to the New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration within 30 days after receipt.

Upon receipt of an original "Intent to Cut", the Department of Revenue Administration shall assign an operation number and furnish without cost to the landowner a certificate and "Report of Cut" form. The certificate must be posted by the landowner in a conspicuous place, usually along the woods road into the area of cutting. Failure to file the "Intent to Cut" before starting the cutting operation shall constitute a misdemeanor. Failure to post a certificate shall constitute a violation.

A violation has a 90-day statute of limitations and a penalty of \$0-\$500. There is no criminal record.

A misdemeanor has a 12-month statute of limitations and a fine of \$0-\$1,000 for an individual; \$0-\$10,000 for corporation and also up to one year in jail. It also remains on record unless, upon request, the court agrees to remove it.

Report of Cut Requirements

The "Report of Cut" form must be filed with the assessing officials indicating all wood and timber cut within 60 days after completion of the operation. Two copies of this report shall be mailed to the Department of Revenue Administration.

Even if the operation is not complete at the end of that tax year, March 31st, a "Report of Cut" shall be filed not later than April 15 of said year reporting all wood and timber cut up to and including March 31st. It is necessary to file a "Report of Cut" even if no wood or timber is cut, if an "Intent to Cut" was filed.

"Reports of Cut" will include the name, residence and social security number of the landowner, the volume of wood and timber cut by species or species group and primary products. It shall also include information relative to the location of the lot to enable assessing officials to verify and determine the stumpage value.

The landowner and the person who does the cutting of timber must sign the "Report of Cut" form under penalty of perjury certifying to the accuracy of the volume of wood and timber harvested. Failure to file a report of cut or falsification of figures shall constitute a misdemeanor.

Tax Calculation and Payment

The Selectmen (assessing officials) will then determine the stumpage value. Operating costs, logging conditions and other factors influence the stumpage value. The Selectmen may consider the actual competitive bid on a per-thousand board-foot, per cord, by weight or other basis, in a particular sale to determine the stumpage price. Once the stumpage price is determined, they multiply this by the total volume by species and then by 10 percent to determine the tax.

The landowner will then be billed for the tax by the Tax Collector and must remit within 30 days after the mailing date of be subject to an interest charge of 18 percent per year computed from the due date.

Additional information may be obtained from your county Cooperative Extension Service office, or the Department of Revenue Administration, or the Division of Forests and Lands, both in Concord.
