## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will raise for the maintenance of highways and bridges, except snow work.

4. To see how much money the town will raise for breaking roads in the winter.

5. To see how much money the town will raise for the rebuilding of bridges.

6. To see if the town will raise \$750 toward the construction of the Trunk Line road and authorize the Selectmen to borrow from the State (agreeably to House Bill No. 310) the balance necessary to complete this Trunk Line.

7. To see if town will raise \$1,400 for Trunk Line maintenance.

8. To see if town will raise \$200 for unimproved Trunk Line maintenance.

9. To see if town will raise \$700 for State Aid maintenance.

10. To see if town will raise \$100 per mile, for each of the years 1929 and 1930, for use on Sugar Loaf road, provided the State appropriates \$400 per mile for the same period.

11. To see if town will raise \$1,000 on account of note for tractor.

12. To see if town will vote to purchase a steel snow plow and authorize the Selectmen to borrow money to pay for same.

13. To see if town will raise \$200 for control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

14. To see if town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid before July 1.

15. To see if town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of receipt of taxes.

16. To act on any other matter that may legally come before this meeting.
