

#### **TOWN WARRANT**, 1934

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lincoln, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Lincoln, on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next. at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. How much money will be raised for the Public Library?

4. How much money will be raised for the Police Department?

5. How much money will be raised for the Public Health Department?

6. How much money will be raised for the Fire Department?

7. How much money will be raised for Town Maintenance?

8. How much money will be raised for Miscellaneous expense?

9. How much money will be raised for the Public Cemetery?

10. How much money will be raised for support of Town Poor?

11. Will the Town vote to raise the sum of \$1,500 and Interest to take up Water Bond due April 1, 1934?

12. How much money will be raised for maintenance of Water Department?

13. How much money will be raised for Street Lighting?

14. To see whether Beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under this act—Laws of 1933—Chapter 99— Section 22.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
