





### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Warner in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Warner on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.) for the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association for the purpose of promoting and publicizing the natural advantages of the Town, together with other towns in the region.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$450.) towards payment of the Concord Hospital deficit.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.) for Blister Rust.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$10,200.) for the purpose of repairing Dalton Bridge; the sum of Two Thousand Two Hundred (\$2,200.) plus interest to be raised by taxation in the year 1962, and the Board of Selectmen and Town Treasurer authorized to borrow the remaining amount of not exceeding Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000.) on the note or notes of the Town of Warner, New Hampshire, to be paid off in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.) annually until said note or notes are paid in full.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.) for the purpose of repairing the Parade Cemetery Road.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900.) for the purpose of oiling the road in the Melvin Mills section of Warner, New Hampshire, from Ansel Moshier's to F. A. Bewersdorf's on County Road so called.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.) to be held in reserve for new road equipment.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make reasonable charges for the use of the kitchen, dressing rooms and main basement area for the hot lunch programs of the Graded School and Simonds Free High School.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Warner Grade School and the Simonds Free High School the unrestricted use of the Town Hall for all school activities without charge; and that any previous motions passed, in regard to the schools' use of the Town Hall, be rescinded.
- 12. To see if the Town will accept the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.) this amount received from Robert S. Andrews and State Street Bank & Trust Company, Trustees under Agreement of Trust by Arthur I. Andrews, dated February 5, 1960. Known as the Alice L. G. Andrews memorial trust fund with income to be used for the purchase of certain books by Pillsbury Free Library, Warner, New Hampshire.
- 13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money in the anticipation of taxes on the note, or notes of the Town, payable on or before December 31, 1962.
- 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell property taken for taxes.

- 15. To hear reports of the Officers of the Town heretofore chosen and Committees appointed and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### AN APPEAL FROM YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook — yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness — our carelessness. The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

- 1. Follow the warden's directions.

- 4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
- 5. See that your children are properly cautioned. Everyone will benefit by it.

### Superintendent's Report

There have been several changes in the teaching staff of the High School. Mrs. Carol Herting is the new Home Making teacher; Mr. Norman Deschenes is the new French teacher and Mrs. Judith Russell is the new Social Studies teacher. On October 1st Norman Yeaton was called into service with the National Guard Air Force. At the moment he is sharing the duties in the shop with Mr. Nelson. Shop teachers are in extremely short supply and we should all be very grateful to Mr. Nelson for helping us in a most difficult situation.

The 1961-1962 staff is a good one and every effort should be made to keep these teachers. Teachers continue to be scarce and each year it gets more difficult to find replacements. Beginning teachers are asking for and getting higher salaries each year. In order to compete for teachers we must pay the salaries which teachers demand, or take what is left after everybody else gets through picking. It is difficult for us, who competed with twenty five or thirty other candidates for a teacher position, to realize that it is the teacher now who has the choice of many different positions, and is able to take the one which looks most attractive to them. There are several young people who are

graduating from the Teacher's Colleges in January, and they are being beseiged by Superintendents who still have positions to fill.

The key to a successful school program is good teachers. Warner, because it is a high school which receives tuition pupils who could attend other high schools, is of necessity in direct competition with those schools. In order to survive we must meet that competition.

You will recall that several years ago Minimum Standards were set up for high school by the State Department of Education. For the past year a committee has been studying these standards and have come up with further proposals which will mean further expansion of our curriculum if these proposals are adopted by the State Department of Education. Some of these proposals we are already meeting. Additional service must be provided in the Fine Arts, Physical Education, Library and Guidance Program.

We live in a swiftly changing and dangerous age. Twenty years ago our way of life was challenged by Nazi Germany and Fascist Italy. Today it is being challenged by Soviet Russia and Communist China. This is no time to be complacent. We must develop our young people to their highest capacity. A second rate effort by us as parents or a second rate effort on the part of our children will not be enough if we are to meet the challenge.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Warner Town Hall in said district on the 13th day of March 1962, at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,050 for teachers' salaries.
- 10. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,250 for the construction of a language laboratory at the high school (half this sum will be reimbursed by the State under the National Defense Act)
  - 11. To see if the district will authorize the school board

to make application for and to receive in the name of the district such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter fe forthcoming from the U. S. Government and/or State Agencies.

- 12. To see if the district will vote to accept as a gift that certain tract of land situate on the southwest bank of the Warner River known as the Simonds Free High School Association athletic field or Copps Field and as recorded in Merrimack County Registry of Deeds, Lib. 467, Fol. 475.
- 13. To see if the district will vote to accept as a gift that tract of land situate on the southwest bank of the Warner River and being the same premises as described in deed recorded in Merrimack County Registry of Deeds, Lib. 507, Fol. 293.
- 14. To see if the district will vote to accept as a gift that tract of land containing twelve (12) acres, more or less, situate on the southwest bank of the Warner River adjacent to the Simonds Free High School Association property and commonly known as the Warner Ski Area property, together will all buildings associated therewith. Said premises being the same as described in part by deed recorded in Merrimack County Registry of Deeds, Lib. 649, Fol. 48.
- 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
