

# Town Warrant

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Windsor, County of Hillsboro in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the North School house in said town on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects.

Article 1. To chose one selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Surveyor and two Constables for one year, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, and all other necessary Town affairs or agents for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear the reports of the Town officers to the auditors, the reports of auditors, agents, committees or other Town officers heretofore chosen or appointed and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to meet the current expense of the Town for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways.

Article 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairing of highways, bridges and culverts.

Article 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for breaking roads.

Article 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the purchase of snow fence.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purpose of co-operating with the State and Federal governments in the control of the white pine blister rust, or act in relation thereto.

Article 9. To transact any other business that may

legally come before said meeting.

Given under our hands this twentieth day of February in the year of our Lord, nineteen hundred and thirtytwo.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of the Town of Windsor, N. H.

Your Superintendent of Schools hereby presents his report for the school year ending June 30, 1931.

There were five Windsor pupils in school for at least a part of the time this year. Elizabeth, Alice and Carl Hoyt, attended the Dole School in Washington, Norman Chapman attended the Lower Village School, in the Hillsboro Town School District, and Mary Chapman attended the Hillsboro High School.

The Hoyt children were not in town until late in the term. The Superintendent's 201 visits to the high school may seem large when compared with the other schools, but there were seven teachers to visit there, and only one in the other schools.

The Dole school was taught by enthusiastic cadets, the Lower Village school by Mrs. Gile, an experienced teacher, where the children also had the advantage of a play ground, and music and art supervisors. Our percentage of attendance this year, 94.5%, was very good.

It appears that these schools were visited 14 times by five different Windsor citizens. I sincerely hope that other Windsor tax payers may visit the school to which some of their taxes go as tuition payments. They are good schools, and if you know it by personal observation, you may be even more willing than at present to raise the necessary money, although I have never yet heard a complaint about the cost from anyone in Windsor.
