WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

L.S.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second **Tuesday of March next** at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First—To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second—To choose three Selectmen, one for three years, one for two years, and one for one year, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third—To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds of the town for three years.

Fourth—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fifth—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to construct and repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Sixth—To hear the report of the bridge committee, and to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to build a bridge to take the place of the Hubbard bridge or act thereon.

Seventh—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks, the ensuing year.

Eighth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

Ninth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Tenth—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six hundred dollars to provide a tree bed at the Mary Hitchcock Hospital, or act thereon.

Eleventh—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association, or act thereon.

Twelfth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

Thirteenth—To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 117, Laws of 1917, on a section of the Mascoma Road, so-called, and appropriate, or set aside from the amount raised for highway work the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, for this purpose.

Fourteenth—To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the provisions of "An Act Chapter 35 Laws of 1905 and Chapter 155 Laws of 1909, or Chapter 158-162 or 168 Laws of 1913 or Chapters 51 or 93 of Laws of 1915 or 162 or 224 Laws of 1917 or Chapter 118 Laws of 1919 in relation to improved highways, and of Chapter 133 Section 27 of the Laws of 1911 in relation to the maintenance of the highways, or act thereon.

Fifteenth—To determine the division of the school money.

Sixteenth—To hear the report of the Auditors.

Seventeenth—To see if the town will vote to raise one hundred dollars to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground, or act thereon.

Eighteenth—To see if the town will vote to raise fifty dollars to hire a playground at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

Nineteenth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Twentieth—To see if the town vote to allow a discount on taxes, if paid before specified dates, or act thereon.

Twenty-first—To see if the town will vote to have an inspector of milk, and to have all cows tuberculin tested, to take effect May 15th, 1921, or act thereon.

Twenty-second—To see if the town will vote to request the Boston and Maine Railroad to furnish a flagman or gates for the Mascoma Street crossing, or act thereon.

Twenty-third—To see if the town will vote to extend Winter Street to the premises of George E. Canfield, or act thereon.

Twenty-fourth—To see if the town will vote to build a sidewalk on the south side of Tracy Street at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

Twenty-fifth—To see if the town will vote to build a sewer on Farman Avenue at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

Twenty-sixth—To see if the town will vote to give prescription permits from May first 1921 to May first 1922 according to Section 9 Chapter 99 of the Laws of 1919 to druggists who are registered pharmacists doing business in Lebanon, to sell

liquor for medicinal, sacramental, scientific or mechanical purposes, or act thereon.

Twenty-seventh—To see if the town will vote to discontinue that portion of Hanover Street as laid out in 1818 lying Easterly and Northerly of the following described line: Beginning at a point on the West bank of Mascoma River thirteen feet Northerly of the North end of the Westerly abutment of the bridge over said river, thence Westerly in a straight line to an iron post set in cement at the Westerly end of the iron railing, thence following the East line of the sidewalk to land of John P. Labombard estate.

Twenty-eighth—To bring in your ballots upon each of the questions submitted by the Convention to Revise the Constitution relative to the amendments proposed by said Convention at a session held on January 28th, 1921.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

The report of the health officer of the town of Lebanon shows that the town was free from any serious epidemic of communicable diseases. There was a considerable number of cases of measles last summer in West Lebanon and in Lebanon this winter; other communicable diseases consisted of two diphtheria cases and four scarlet fever cases, with only one fatality, showing that this vicinity was in an exceptionally healthy condition as far as communicable diseases were concerned.

Frequent reports of water analysis show that physically and organically the samples represent water of good quality.

Reports of milk analysis from six of the dairies that supply the town show the milk to be clean and up to the standard.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Board of Education,
Lebanon Town School District,
Lebanon, N. H.

Lebanon, N. H.

Gentlemen :

While a formal report to you gentlemen on the school conditions in the Town district seems to me unnecessary owing to the close observance of school affairs on your part, I feel that possibly some communication to the public through you may be of benefit to the citizens of the district who might be unwilling to secure the information in any other way. School administration has changed so rapidly in the last two years that few people, besides school officials, have been able to comprehend the change or interpret its meaning. It is natural then for information to be sought by those who hold an interest and a sincere desire for public improvement.

The action of the legislature in 1919 created a state board of education with power to take over and administer the school affairs of the state. This board prescribes the way in which the district shall distribute its funds, certifies teachers (who are qualified), standardizes school buildings and in fact has the same power as a board of directors over a corporation. This applies particularly to districts that are state aided but nevertheless influences all schools.

How Aided

Any district may apply for state aid for the support of its elementary schools provided such a district raises \$5.00 for each \$1000 of the inventory of the district for elementary school purposes. For instance our inventory for 1920 is placed at \$1,473,496, and by raising \$5.00 on each \$1000 of this inventory we are entitled to apply for state aid. In addition we must raise an amount for which the state will not contribute. We can not derive aid on such items as

insurance, payment of debts or interest, the purchase of buildings or fixed charges such as rent; neither are we granted aid on the purchase of new equipment or payment of notes but only on such items as directly relate to current expenses such as teachers' salaries, fuel, books and supplies, transportation; medical inspection, janitor service. Our \$5.00 tax is a little more than enough to pay our teachers' salaries and inadequate to pay for salaries and transportation of pupils. I mention these two items only to show that the amount we raise by law is insufficient to pay for the other necessary expenses of the elementary schools. Now according to the law the state will reimburse us for all legitimate demands out of a fund for school purposes set aside by the action of the legislature. If a *sufficient fund* is available we will get our aid in full but if sufficient money is not appropriated for all state aided districts, our share will be distributed pro rata. Last year we did not receive all that was approved as legitimate claims and it is doubtful if we receive complete reimbursement for the year 1921-22. It is evident then that a \$5.00 tax is not sufficient to administer school affairs even with state aid and may I suggest that we interpret the law as follows? That the district raise all the money it can reasonably stand and then apply for enough state aid to complete the proposed budget of expenditures? Otherwise we find ourselves in drastic financial circumstances in February not because we have spent more money than usual but because the district anticipated more aid from the state than it actually received.

Teachers

We should consider our district particularly fortunate in securing the services of a corps of high grade teachers. Everyone of the teacher employees has had some normal school training and all but two, previous experience. The district, I doubt, realizes the value of a real teacher and but few comprehend the work connected with the profession. Their work is not completed at 4.30 nor does it end Friday night and I am glad to say that the general tendency is toward a broader appreciation of the services rendered by our women in behalf of the children in our district. Their work is never done, their problems are many and may God speed the day when a real teacher shall receive a salary that

will at least approximate her value to the district. She seldom sees the big results of her work; her greatest compensation is in the realization that she has helped others gain a broader view of life and strived to reveal the goal of true citizenship, untainted and unselfish.

Our average salary for teachers 1920-21 is \$744.44.

Last October the National Education Service Bulletin reported a shortage and below standard of 93,000 teachers in the United States. Conditions appear a little brighter for the year beginning September 1921.

Rural Schools

I wish it were possible to maintain accommodations for six grades (1-6) in the rural schools. I hesitate to mention this subject as it is easy to misinterpret the object. A child entering the high school usually finds himself out-classed by those who have had the privilege of a junior high school training in the schools of the special district. On the other hand some districts object (rightfully) to conveyance, especially in winter, from the more remote schools. Such an arrangement however, allows the rural school teacher a greater amount of time to drill the younger children while the older pupils are privileged to secure better preparations for high school. This arrangement seems advisable not because our teachers are unable to teach upper grades satisfactorily but on account of lack of time to instruct all. However we must remember that by so doing our overhead expense is increased and at the same time we must adjust controversies over transportation and tuition.

Tuition

There are 65 pupils from the town district enrolled in the Junior and Senior High schools. If they remain for the full year, the tuition bill will exceed \$3,000 and if the bill now in legislature is passed, allowing districts to increase their tuition to \$75.00 maximum, we must expect to pay over \$4500 tuition for the year 1921-22. Only one of the minor evils of maintaining several school districts in the same town. We are fast arriving at a point where the relation between district valuation and tuition favors the special district and

not the town. In addition I might add that our elementary school tuition for pupils attending the West Lebanon, Hanover and Hartford schools exceeds \$700.00.

Transportation

The state law obligates a district to convey all elementary pupils who live two miles or over from the school assigned them by the board of education. We are operating four lines of transportation viz: Poverty Lane, Mt. Support, Methodist Hill and Butmanville. There is no economic option in this matter, neither is there noticeable competition and we are obliged to pay about what the conveyor may ask and may I add that thus far the driver of each route has been exceedingly considerate of the district in performing this service and we should be very appreciative of their services in doing the work as in most cases it consumes a part of the day that might be used for other employment to a great advantage. Our transportation from September first 1920 to date, February 19, has cost \$809.30.

Repair and Remodelling of One-Room Buildings

The state board of education passed regulations to the effect that all one room buildings should meet standard requirements regarding correct lighting and sanitary conditions. The East Lebanon school has been shingled, toilet conditions corrected and more light admitted from the left and rear of the room.

In order to comply with these regulations it was necessary to enlarge the Baker school and in so doing the former wood-shed was removed and a new shed built on the south side of the school. The Hardy Hill and Hall schools were given better toilet and lighting conditions. It became necessary also to provide facilities that would give a minimum *uniform* temperature of 68 degrees F. A stove jacket was provided for all one room buildings, save one, which had already been equipped. Ceilings and walls were also repaired according to regulations. A close approximate of the repairs totals \$2,000.00.

Medical Inspection

Through the generosity of the Lebanon branch of the Red Cross a school nurse was provided for the Lebanon-

Grantham district. The inspection has been greatly facilitated by her work and many corrections obtained through her efforts that would otherwise not have been secured. I sincerely recommend that we join with the Union District in appropriating money for services for the year 1921-22. We can well afford to economize even to books and supplies if need be, in order to maintain the high grade and efficient service which Miss Emery has so well rendered.

Home

Each year brings new problems in securing places for teachers to live, especially in the rural districts. With the increasing cost of food material and fuel, few people feel that they can afford to take an additional individual into their home.

Evening School

According to custom the Town school district has joined with the Special district in maintaining an Evening School. Over 190 students have been registered since October 11th, the date of opening. The general session was brought to a close February 21 but one class will be continued for several weeks if labor conditions tend to improve, otherwise the school will be terminated as our people will be obliged to seek labor elsewhere. The evening school has been very successful and I recommend that next year we prepare for a bigger and better school, regardless of state aid.

Noon Lunches

We have tried to supply children who do not go home to lunch with one nutritious dish at the noon hour. There has been very little expense connected with this work as the children have either contributed a penny or two or neighboring families have sent in food at the noon hour, also the teachers have supplied some material on their own resources. In some instances the children have brought milk, sugar or cocoa from their homes. Hot cocoa or soups have constituted the ordinary extra dish however. The noon hour discipline has been improved and simple lessons in preparation and serving have been taught both sexes.

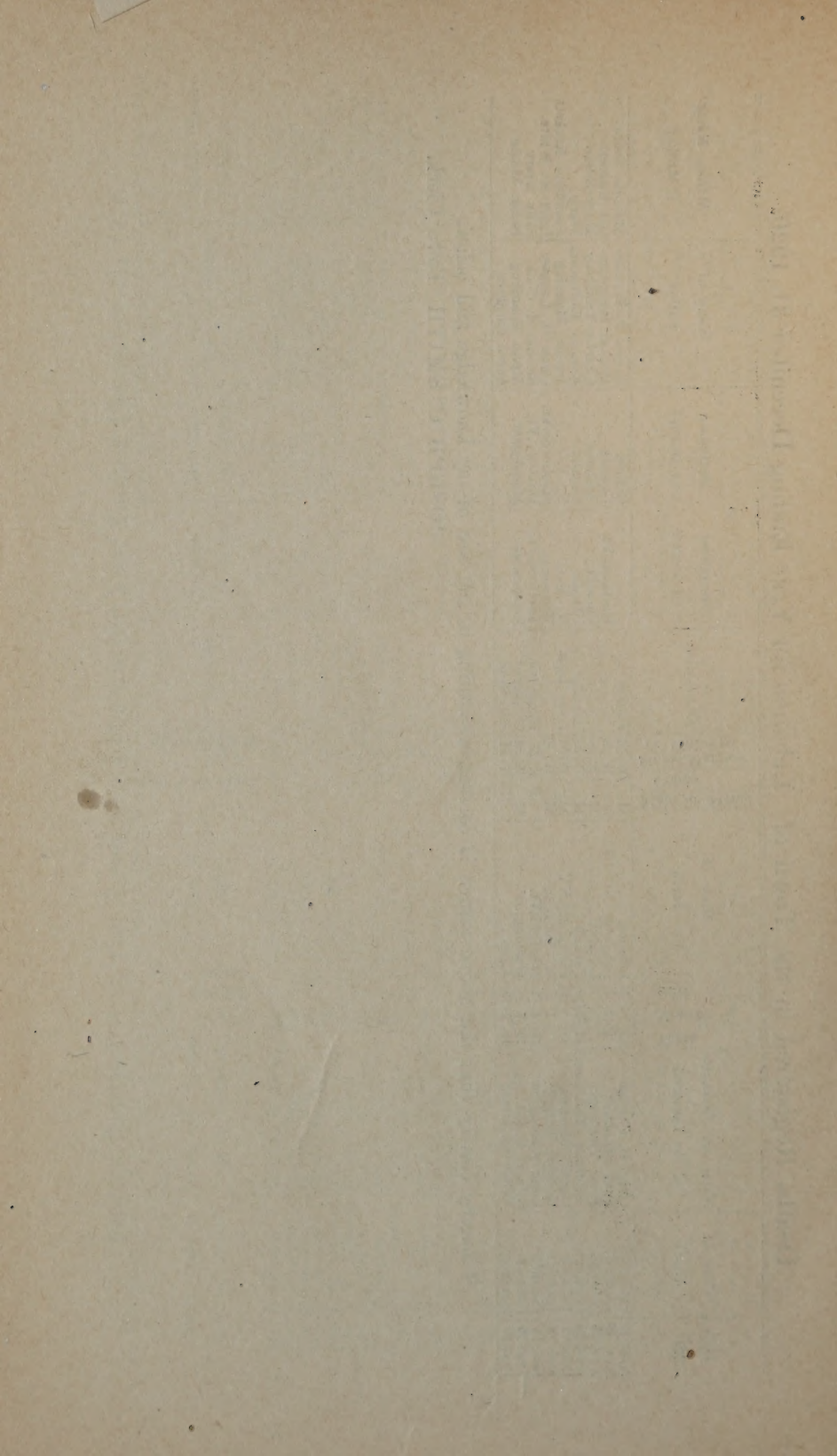
