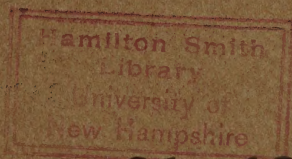

The State of New Hampshire

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Merrimack in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Merrimack on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the town officer's salaries.

4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town officer's expenses.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the police department.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the fire department.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fighting forest fires.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the health department.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure state aid for the permanent improvements of highways, or take any action relating thereto.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the highway department.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for electric street lights in the village of Reed's Ferry, or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and supplies of town hall or take any action relating thereto.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for public library.

16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of parks and playgrounds.

17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to pay the interest on town notes and trust funds used by the town.

19. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount for the early payment of taxes and make appropriation for same, or take any action relating thereto.

20. To see if the town will vote to observe old home day and raise and appropriate money for same.

21. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to hire in anticipation of taxes, or take any action relating thereto.

22. To see if the town will vote to accept from International Shoe Company, McElwain and Front Streets, or take any action relating thereto.

23. To see if the town will vote to accept from Fessenden and Lowell the streets from the Daniel Webster Highway east of the office building and south to Corliss house or take any action relating thereto.

24. To see if the town will vote to straighten the road at Dickey Hill so called, raise and appropriate money for same, or take any action relating thereto.

25. To see if the town will vote to purchase the Hardy property on Daniel Webster Highway, raise and appropriate money for same, or take any action relating thereto.

26. To see if the town will vote to place a marker at the site of the old town hall, and will raise and appropriate money for same, or take any action relating thereto.

27. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under Chapter 99 Section 22.

28. To hear the reports of the town officers, and transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting, and raise and appropriate money for same.

Report of Headmaster of Mc Graw Normal Institute

Year Ending January 1, 1934

Last June there were six pupils who were graduated from McGaw, one of whom has entered the Springfield, Mass., Hospital as a student nurse. Since the last report one of the pupils who was graduated in 1932 has entered St. Anselm's College.

At the beginning of the school year there were forty-two pupils regularly enrolled and one post-graduate student. Since then two have left because of having moved out of town; one left to enter Nashua High School; and five others have left for other reasons. The classes are at present divided as follows: five Seniors, eight Juniors, ten Sophomores, and eleven Freshmen.

Last May two boys were sent to Colby College to enter the Lyford Prize Speaking Contest and one girl was sent to the contest at the University of New Hampshire.
