

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Orford on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To choose one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds, and one Library Trustee for three years ensuing.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to apply for State Aid in building and maintaining permanent highways; and what sums of money it will vote to raise and to appropriate for that purpose in addition to that required by law.
- 5. To see how much money the town will voteto raise and to appropriate to insure Orford Bridge and other town property.
- 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and to appropriate for the use of electric lights.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to continue the work of eradicating Pine Blister Rust, and to raise and to appropriate money for the same.

- 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and to appropriate for Orford Social Library.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to dispense with the distribution of the inventory blanks until the selectmen appraise the property.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 11. To hear the Budget of the town and to raise and to appropriate any money recommended therein, or to pass any vote relating thereto.
- 12. To choose an Agent of the town for the purpose of transferring real estate belonging to the town; and to see if the town will vote to instruct said agent to transfer the town's interest in any real estate bought for taxes when payment for the same is made to the satisfaction of the selectmen.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to build a sidewalk on the side of Orford Bridge; and to raise and to appropriate money for the same.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to build a bridge across Jacob's Brook, so called, on Baker's Pond Road, and to repair the abutments, and to raise and to appropriate money for the same. Provided State Aid can be obtained for said purpose.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to scrape the snow from the Trunk Line Roads in said town during the winter; and to raise and to appropriate money for the same.
- 16. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, or committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto; and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

We have examined the reports of the selectmen, treasurer, road agent, trustees of trust funds, and trustees of libraries, and believe them to be correctly vouched and cast.

ELLA L. HUCKINS, LOUIS C. CONANT, Auditors. To the Inhabitants of Orford:

We hereby submit our annual report for the year 1924.

The year has been notable on account of a larger expenditure of money, principally for maintenance of Dartmouth College Road. While the results obtained have not been entirely satisfactory even to the selectmen, yet we feel that judgment should be reserved until the project is completed and tried out, for, like the proverbial singed cat, it may be better than it looks.

The severe storm in September again washed the Quinttown road, causing so much damage that the selectmen thought it unwise for the road agent's appropriation to bear all the expense of its repair. Accordingly they paid part of it out of the general funds causing an overdraft in the item of "General Expenses of the Department."

We wish to call attention to one or two articles in the Warrant: It has been suggested for several years that a sidewalk ought to be built on Orford Bridge to accommodate pedestrians using it. This is the more evident since the great increase in the number of automobiles crossing the bridge, especially in the evenings when entertainments are held in Fairlee. Under Article 14 we wish to remind you that the bridges on Baker's Pond Road, east of Orfordville, are inadequate for the traffic that they have to bear. This is particularly true of the one near the "Clover Mill Corner," so called, and of the one near the residence of Asa O. Sanborn. The "Clover Mill" bridge is in poor condition, and one abutment of the Sanborn bridge was damaged last September and the other appears to be weak. It would seem to be economy to replace one of these bridges before and damage results therefrom. It is understood that the State will contribute to this work about one-half of the cost.

The decease in the surplus was caused by the vote at the last annual meeting to appropriate the Surplus of \$2,589.75, reported in 1924, together with the Savings Bank Tax, which amounted to \$433.14, and the \$1,000 raised, for the repair of Highways and Bridges. Therefore the year began without a surplus.

We would again express our appreciation to the people of Orford for their support and forbearance during the past year.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Orford:

The general aim of Education is to train all children in those qualities of life and character which will make them good and efficient citizens in the community, state and nation.

The specific aims are to develop in the child:

- 1. Ability to earn his own living.
- 2. Willingness to contribute to the welfare of others.
- 3. A knowledge of how to use his leisure.
- 4. A knowledge of how to care for his health.

All the efforts put forth by those concerned must be directed toward these ends. The school that does not, in some way approximate these aims, is not properly functioning as a school at the present time.

During the present school year, schools have been in session in four different buildings. The teachers this year are as follows: East Orford, Beatrice Merrill; Mt. Cube, Josie Fadden; Orfordville, Hazel Williams; Orford Grammar, Annie Barrett; Orford Primary. Verna Greenly. I feel that we have a good teaching force and that fine progress is being made.

There were 93 different pupils enrolled during the past school year. The attendance averaged 91.8 per cent of the membership. This is an improvement over the previous year, but still below the state average for this period. The average for the state was 93.6. The table which follows and the attendance records are for the year ending June 1924.

An attendance contest has been conducted this year. Each contest lasts for four weeks, and thus making nine for the year. An Honor Banner is hung

on the wall of the winning school. The children have shown much interest in the contest and improved school attendance has been the result.

A revised calendar has been adopted by the School Board for the year 1924-1925. This calendar will save three or four days lost because of holidays, and consequently gives that many more days of school without additional expense. It also provides more frequent, but not too long vacations, allowing a week at Thanksgiving, two weeks at Christmas and a week of vacation after every seven weeks of school for the remainder of the year.

The medical inspection and follow up work is again being done by Miss Underhill, the district nurse. Good results are obtained from this work. The examination of men for army service at the time of the World War, showed that one man in every three was uncapable of military service because of physical defects. It was also found that a very great number of these defects could have been remedied in childhood by medical attention. Physical defects when discovered should receive prompt attention.

We have hopes that a dental clinic can be held at Orford before the end of this school year.

For the teachers and the School Board and myself as well, we express the common desire that a larger number of parents and friends visit the schools. If parents will come to see their children at work, what they are doing, and what they are given to do with and how their work is directed, it will give them first hand information concerning our schools.

In closing I wish to express my appreciation of the courtesy and cooperation, of the School Board, the teachers, and the community.


