TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Windsor, County of Hillsborough in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the North school house in said Town, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose one selectman for three years, one selectman for one year, town clerk, town treasurer, tax collector, highway surveyor and two constables for one year, one trustee of trust funds for three years, one trustee of trust funds for one year and all other necessary town officers or agents for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To hear the reports of Town officers to the auditors, the reports of auditors, agents, committees, or other town officers heretofore chosen or appointed and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to meet the current expense of the Town for the ensuing year.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept state aid for the permanent improvement of highways.
- Article 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairing of highways, bridges and culverts.
- Article 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for breaking roads.
- Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the purpose of co-operating with the

state and federal governments in the control of the white pine blister rust, or act in relation thereto.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a part of the public highway in said Town of Windsor leading by the easterly end of Black Pond, which part lies between the following points: From the entrance to the Art Colony to the southerly side of the entrance to the Manor House so-called, or pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Given under our hands this twenty-fifth day of February in the year of our Lord, nineteen hundred and thirty-three.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Windsor, N. H., this report of your Superintendent of Schools is respectfully submitted:

The question of opening a school in our own district was considered from every possible angle, and after consulting with the Commissioner of Education we decided that it was better to send the children to the Hillsboro School District as we have done lately. It would be a source of local pride to have a school of our own, but as the building would need to be remodeled as we had only four children for the school, and were not certain as to the length of their stay in town, we decided as we did.

Our children, with their age, grade and school attended, are given below:

The percent of attendance of our six pupils was 94.7% which is just a fair per cent. Our tardiness record was as good as it could be as there were no cases of tardiness for the whole year; but there is no honor roll.

as each pupil was absent for at least a day or two.

Windsor people are credited with eleven visits to the schools, but as these visits were all credited to the Chapman family, it is not a large number for the district as a whole.

The Superintendent visited the schools which are attended by the Windsor pupils 147 times during the year, or an average of 21 visits to each teacher, which is about two visits every three weeks, so he is in a position to know that the Windsor children did their work very well this year.
