
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

To the inhabitants of the Town of Errol in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Errol on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
 - Art. 3. To elect a delegate to constitutional convention.
- Art. 4. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for public library.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for care of cemetery.
- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State road.

- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to repair approachment to Androscoggin bridge and raise money for same.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for payment of town note.
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to build siding on Clear-stream above bridge and raise money for same.
