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**ANNUAL REPORT**  
OF THE  
**BOARD OF EDUCATION,**  
OF THE  
TOWN OF SEABROOK.

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The board organized soon after election by choosing D. W. Colcord chairman and F. L. Weare secretary and treasurer. Owing to pressure of other business, Dr. D. W. Colcord, the chairman of the board, tendered his resignation at the end of the first term and Mr. William H. Walton was appointed to fill the vacancy.

The whole number of children between the ages of five and fifteen reported by the selectmen was 371..

Whole number of different scholars between five and fifteen registered during the year, 338.

Whole number between five and fifteen registered, 1st term, 308; 2nd term, 316; 3rd term, 269.

We would call attention to the fact that during the first term there were 63 children between five and fifteen years of age who did not attend school at all; during the second term there were 55; and during the third term there were 102. The falling off in attendance during the last term was largely due to the inclement weather.

We would especially commend the large number of scholars whose names are on the Roll of Honor. Scholars who are absent even one day lose something that cannot be made up; hence the importance of being present *every* day in the term.

The schools have been kept an average of between twenty-nine and thirty weeks.

The members of the Board have made sixty-six visits to the schools.

We wish that parents would make more visits to the schools during the term ; the children will work better when interest is shown in this way and it will also be an encouragement to the teachers.

The schools as a whole have made very commendable progress and the work has been thorough, a matter of great importance.

Believing that teachers, who are acquainted with the schools and have done good work should be retained, both for the good of the schools and as a mark of appreciation, wherever possible we have re-engaged them. In schools No. 3, 4 and 5 we were able to do this at the beginning of the year, and the previous reputation of the teachers was well sustained.

Ill health prevented Miss Flanders teaching after the first term and the teachers in Nos. 2 and 6 having resigned, it was necessary to engage new teachers for those schools. These teachers did good work in the fall term and were retained for the winter term.

As the school house in No. 2 was unfit for use, arrangements were made with the trustees of Dearborn Academy by which the school was put into that building for the fall and winter terms. We feel that we are greatly indebted to the trustees for this privilege, as the only cost to us was the expense of running the school. As the school was so large an assistant teacher was hired and although this of course added to the expense, the advantages gained more than compensated for the extra expense incurred.

A new schoolhouse ought to be built at once in this part of the town and we trust that at the coming annual meeting an appropriation will be made for this purpose. There should also be an appropriation for repairs upon the various school houses and outbuildings.
