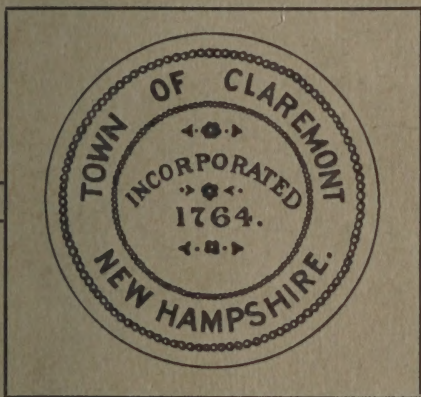

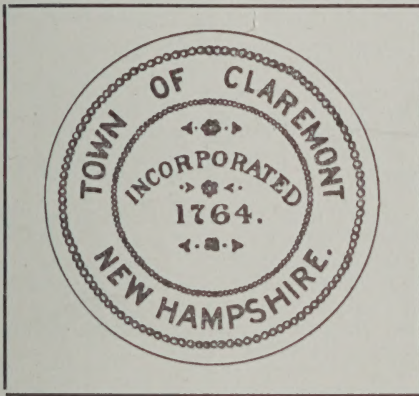

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TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(SEAL) To the inhabitants of the Town of Claremont, in the county of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the lower assembly room and the room above said assembly room, both in the Town Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday the eleventh day of March, next, at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To elect one Selectman who shall serve for three years.
3. To elect one Assessor who shall serve for three years.
4. To choose delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
5. To choose one member of the board of three trustees who have the custody of all the trust funds of the town, to serve three years.
6. To elect one Sewer Commissioner who shall serve for three years.
7. To elect one Water Commissioner who shall serve for three years.
8. To choose three members of the Board of Trustees of Fiske Free Library to serve for a term of three years.
9. To see if the Town will choose or appoint a committee of citizens to act as a Committee of Finance, whose duty it shall be to investigate all proposed appropriations, previous to the next town meeting, and report their recommendations at said meeting.
10. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Moderator to appoint a committee who shall bring before some future meeting a simplified plan for zoning for the Town of Claremont.
11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Moderator to appoint a committee who shall make a revision of the by-laws of Claremont relating to building, and report at some future meeting.
12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay Town Officers for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1931.
13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Incidental Expenses of the Town for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1931.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the salary and expenses of the Police Department for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1931.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of Highways and Bridges including State Aid Maintenance and Trunk Line Maintenance.

16. To see if the Town will vote to construct a cement walk with curb along Broad, Summer and Middle Streets, adjoining the Stevens High School Lot, and raise and appropriate money therefor.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for the purpose of building new sidewalks and repairing those now in use.

18. To see if the Town will vote to construct a cement road on Prospect Street from Pleasant Street to Tyler Street, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000 therefor.

19. To see if the Town will vote to construct a cement road on Central Street, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000 therefor.

20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Oiling and Cleaning Streets and Highways of the Town for the year ending January 31, 1931.

21. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Highway Agent to oil the Bible Hill road, and raise and appropriate the money therefor.

22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department for the year ending January 31, 1931.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or borrow on the credit of the town, a sum of \$6,500 to purchase a new motor driven Combination Chemical Fire Truck.

24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of Hydrants for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1931.

25. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate in aid of the Claremont General Hospital.

26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lighting for the year ending January 31, 1931, and pass any vote relating thereto.

27. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the Debts of the Town, including bonds of School District maturing during the fiscal year, and interest on same.

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500 for the support of Fiske Free Library agreeably to the contract with Andrew Carnegie and Samuel P. Fiske.

29. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500 to make burials; take care of, and beautify the cemeteries of the Town.

30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 for the maintenance and development of Moody Park.

31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500 for the support of Monadnock and Barnes Parks and Playgrounds.

32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 to purchase and install a new set of town scales.

33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or borrow on the credit of the Town, a sum not to exceed \$10,000 for the installation of an incinerator, for burning garbage and rubbish.

34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to help carry on the work of the Red Cross Public Health Nurse.

35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 to be expended in cooperation with the State Department of Forestry in continuing the White Pine Blister Rust Eradication Work.

36. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the collection of garbage and refuse and raise and appropriate money therefor.

37. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Band Concerts by the American Band for the ensuing year.

38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 for Memorial Day.

39. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for installing traffic signals.

40. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Poor for the fiscal year ending January 31, 1931.

41. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for the purpose of leasing the landing field of the Claremont Airport Corporation (not including the hangar and rights of access thereto) for the period of one year for the free use of the public in landing and taking off with airplanes, subject to the laws of air safety of the U. S. Department of Commerce and the regulations of the Claremont Airport Corporation.

42. To see what action the Town will take in regard to taking over the privately owned sewers in said Town, and also to see what, if any, charge shall be made by said Town for the use of said sewers.

43. To see if the Town will vote to purchase the bonds for the Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Town Treasurer.

44. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue Ellis road, so-called from the Railroad to Jarvis Hill road, so-called.

45. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the old road or right of way, now unused, leading from the Nott place to the Walker place on Washington street.

46. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for use in Tree Warden work.

47. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200 for the care of the Town Dump for the ensuing year.

48. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for the purpose of purchasing and erecting a fence around the Town Dump, with suitable gates thereto.

49. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate the sale of a strip of land in the rear of the Claremont National Bank, now occupied by the old lock-up, and make conveyance of the same as agents of the Town.

50. To see if the Town will vote to pay highway laborers 45c per hour.

51. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to refuse the use of the Town Hall to the Chamber of Commerce or the Outing Club or any member thereof.

52. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the purpose of publicity through promoting winter sports in connection with the annual Winter Carnival.

53. To see what action the Town will take in regard to fixing the rentals of Offices in the new Court House.

54. To determine the rate of discount the Town will allow persons paying their taxes within such periods as the Town may designate.

55. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

There was so much travel that the road become very dusty and the commissioners feel that for the comfort and pleasure of those enjoying the park there should be a coating of oil to lay the dust. The commissioners are therefore asking for \$500 more than last year in order that the road may be properly oiled and the park kept in fairly good condition.

The year 1929 shows a steady increase in the use of the library in spite of the fact that the library was closed during February and March because of the fire that seriously damaged both the building and contents.

There was a circulation of 65,930 books, a gain of 1,836 over the previous year.

One thousand six hundred and fifty-two books have been added of which 300 were gifts. Several additions have been made to the reference department. The new Britannica, and the latest editions of the New International and Americana encyclopedias; Modern Eloquence the Dictionary of American Biography; the latest edition of Webster's Unabridged Dictionary and Cram's Atlas of the World. A new edition of the World Book and the New Human Interest Library have been placed in the children's room. The increased appropriation has made it possible to have these valuable reference books.

All of the books destroyed by fire have been replaced by new copies or books of a similar nature.

The damage caused by the fire has been entirely repaired and several additions and re-arrangements made which add greatly to the appearance and usefulness of the library. The installation of oil heat adds much to the cleanliness and comfort of the building.

Since April 1st the library has opened at 10 o'clock in the morning. This was done with the hope that more people might be reached. That this was a wise move is shown by the increasing number of people who use the library during the morning hours.

Books are being sent regularly to the Sullivan Machinery Company and the the Frances J. Tolles Home. The Hospital is also to be supplied with books. We hope to be able to send books to some of the out-lying parts of the town before the year is over.

The library has always been ready and willing to place sets of books in the rooms of teachers who wish them. During the past year, Miss Morrison of the North Street Junior High School has had a book and magazine table in both the 7th and 8th grades. This has proved to be very helpful to the children. We hope

that more teachers will avail themselves of the opportunity this year.

Among the gifts that have come to us this year is a collection of autographs given by Miss Mary L. Deans of Ogdensburg, N. Y. It contains autographs of several presidents and other well known men. A beautifully illustrated collection of Folk Songs by the Fuller sister was given by Mrs. Robert Barrett of Cornish.

Chief Engineer's Report

To the Board of Selectmen:

The year ending January 31, 1930, showed a slight increase in the number of both bell alarms and still calls over the previous twelve months. A total of 22 bell alarms were answered during the year just past, together with 209 still calls, or a total of 231 summons to which the department has responded. As in past years, quick notification and response in the case of still calls has averted serious blazes which would have necessitated calling out the entire department.

HYDRANTS

Three new hydrants have been installed during the past year, adding still further to protection available for the town's property owners. These installations have been on Dunning street near the Claremont General hospital, on Ridge avenue near the L. H. Bartlett place, and at the corner of Lincoln and North streets.

FIRE ALARM SYSTEM

Two fire alarm boxes purchased during the previous year were linked up with the fire alarm circuit during 1929, these being No. 65, on Moody avenue near Washington street, and No. 66, at the corner of Washington and Second streets. Much work has been accomplished on the system as a whole during the year, particularly in the matter of changing wires from old poles to new, but much still remains to be done. New elements for the battery room will be needed this year, replacement being indi-

cated to keep the system at its present grade of efficiency. The elements now in use have served for a five-year period, the limit of time for which they were designed.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Department's chief need this year is for a new motor chemical to replace the apparatus in use for the past ten years, which has paid for itself many times over in the amount of money saved the taxpayers of the town and should be supplanted by a new and up to date chemical before it is entirely worn out. The motor chemical, which is sent in response to all still calls, has on innumerable occasions saved the town the expense of a bell alarm by checking small fires in their incipiency. I would recommend purchase by the town of such a piece of apparatus.

REMARKS

Fire loss during the past year has again been held at a comparatively low level, indicating both the adequacy of the department's fire fighting equipment and the faithfulness and energy of its personnel. The largest fire loss during the year was sustained by the Public Library. In the case of practically all other fires either the property involved has been comparatively small in value or fortunate discovery and quick work has enabled the department to keep the fire damage to a low figure. Board of Health

To the Honorable Board of Selectmen, of Claremont:

I herewith submit the following report of the health department of the town of Claremont, for the year ending January 31, 1930.

The number of contagious diseases reported have exceeded that of the preceding year, owing to the prevalence of scarlet fever during both the early part of the year and a recurrence of the disease during the latter portion. Fortunately in both periods the disease has been in a very mild form, with no serious results.

Effort has been made in every case of contagious disease reported, to ascertain if possible its origin and to maintain an effective quarantine during the period of illness.

A total of 222 cases of communicable diseases were reported, as follows:

The work for the prevention of disease has been carried on throughout the year through the agencies of the medical in-

spector, public health nurse, infant welfare nurse, tuberculosis nurse, and school nurse.

Again we would call to your attention the fact, that the success in the accomplishment of this prevention work depends to a large extent upon hearty cooperation of parents and the general public in the furtherance of the project.

Diphtheria, while showing a decrease in the number of cases and less fatality, owing to the preventative measures now being adopted, is still a distinct menace to life and health of the child. An average of 22 children died every day from diphtheria in the United States during 1928. Children need not have diphtheria, as it can be prevented by a simple, harmless treatment with toxin-antitoxin.

There is no guess work about toxin-antitoxin, it is safe and proven preventive. The greatest obstruction today in diphtheria elimination, is the delay in using this means of prevention.

Do not wait until the child goes to school. The little children need this protection even more than the child who is going to school.

GENERAL SANITATION

This division of health work which includes routine inspection of all food and confectionery stores, restaurants, hotels, meat markets, ice cream parlors, barber shops, etc., has been given careful attention.

These inspections are usually made in company with a state inspector. Other inspections are made from time to time as conditions demand during the year. In general the stores handling food-stuffs show very satisfactory conditions, so far as complying with the food laws and sanitary regulations are concerned.

A large number of complaints have been received during the year in regard to the dumping of rubbish and the improper disposal of sewage. Many complaints are made by aggrieved persons, that do not come within the province of this department. All complaints are investigated and suggestions for the correction made whenever possible.

The question of sewage disposal, probably presents the most serious problem for consideration, as in certain localities it is almost impossible for the house owner to dispose of sewage in a sanitary manner, at a reasonable cost. Quite a large number of septic tanks have been installed, which is a method of disposal far superior to the ordinary cesspool, but at the same time is far from being an ideal means of disposal of sewage, in the more thickly populated parts of the town, where it is difficult to properly care for the overflow from the tanks without creating more or less of a nuisance. Allowing septic tank effluent to run out on the surface of the ground or into street drains is the cause of many just complaints and is something that should not be tolerated.

Public ownership of sewers, is probably the only solution of the problem confronting us relative to the abatement of this nuisance of improper sewage disposal.

Report of Milk Inspector

To the Selectmen of the Town of Claremont:

This has been a very busy year. We held two very lively meetings in regard to pastuerizing the entire milk supply, appointed committees to investigate costs, etc., but the people of Claremont did not seem ready for it, so it was dropped. However, we have one supply pastuerized where those who wish it can procure that product, and in case of an epidemic the whole supply can be treated there.

I wish at this time to make myself clear in regard to pastuerization. I believe in it. I believe that the milk supply of the whole United States will be pastuerized in time, and my idea was to be ahead of some epidemic rather than too late and I wish at this time to also state that whether I am Milk Inspector in years to come, or not, if the people of Claremont and the producers ever do wish it they will find me ready to help.

Cattle have been tuberculine tested as usual and reactors removed and slaughtered where found.

Licenses have been issued and barns inspected as often as was deemed necessary. Some milk has been poured in the sewer due to improper handling, and two supplies stopped due to contagious disease in the family of the producer.

One supply was delivered one morning when a contagious disease existed in the producers household and we went to his customers and destroyed the milk so none of it was used.

Milk samples have been taken more often this year due to some bad results the first of the season, but a great improvement has been made since then.

Under a new method, started this year, after the barn and equipment have been made satisfactory to the inspector a permit

is issued to the producer or dealer and he in turn goes to the Selectmen's office to procure his license.

State Forester's Report

As will be seen by the financial statement, the State increased the town appropriation 25 per cent. The necessary supervision of the crew, the time employed in laying out the work and deciding on the control areas, as well as many other details, was handled by the district Blister Rust Agent. As he is said by the Federal Bureau of Plant Industry, no charge for his services was made against either town or state monies. Thus, the town appropriation and the state aid was used solely in the location and destruction of currant and gooseberry bushes, the plants which spread disease from infected to healthy pine trees.
