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
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

Warrant for March Meeting 1909.

The State of New Hampshire.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Eaton, in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2nd. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3rd. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money to pay on debts of the town.

4th. To see if the town will vote to change from the present highway system to one highway district having one or more highway agents not exceeding three.

5th. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway leading from O. N. Currier's, northerly to the Henry A. Atkinson house so called.

6th. To see what action the town will take for the use and care of the town hall and to pass any vote or choose any officer for such purpose.
