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WITH GRATITUDE AND APPRECIATION

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE  
TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock, in the County of Hillsborough in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs: You are hereby notified to meet at the **FIRE STATION** in said Hancock on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next at eight of the clock in the forenoon until seven of the clock in the evening, for ballot voting of Town Officers and all other matters requiring ballot vote; and, to meet at said **FIRE STATION** in said Hancock, on Saturday, the thirteenth day of March next at nine of the clock in the morning, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,109,550 which represents the operating budget, inclusive of the Water Department operations. Said sum exclusive of all special or individual articles addressed; or take any other action relating thereto.
3. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to ninety-five thousand dollars (\$95,000) for the purpose of completing the upgrade of King's Highway from Old Town Road to Lake Nubanusit; and, to authorize the issuance of not more than ninety-five thousand dollars (\$95,000) of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act and to authorize the municipal officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon; or take any other action relating thereto. This is a non-lapsing article and will not lapse until the project is completed or in three years, whichever is less. Selectmen recommend this appropriation. {2/3 BALLOT VOTE REQUIRED}
4. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to twenty-two thousand five hundred thirty one dollars (\$22,531) to pay off the lease of a 1998 cruiser; and, to authorize the transfer of \$22,531 from the December 31, 1998 fund balance for this purpose; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
5. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Twenty-two thousand dollars (\$22,000) for the purchase of a one-ton pickup; and, to authorize the transfer of \$22,000 from the December 31, 1998 fund balance for this purpose; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
6. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) to replace the north side of the Fire Station roof; and, to authorize the

transfer of \$8,000 from the December 31, 1998 fund balance for this purpose; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

7. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to nine thousand dollars (\$9,000) to install under drains on Antrim Road starting at Old Bennington Road and running southerly approximately 1,150 feet; and, to authorize the transfer of \$9,000 from the December 31, 1998 fund balance for this purpose; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

8. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000) toward the purchase of self contained breathing apparatus units for the Hancock Fire Department; and, to authorize the transfer of \$5,000 from the December 31, 1998 fund balance for this purpose; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) for the purchase of a computer for the Police Department; and, to authorize the transfer of \$2,500 from the December 31, 1998 fund balance for this purpose; or take any other action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to six thousand dollars (\$6,000) to install a truck exhaust system in the fire station; and, to authorize the transfer of \$6,000 from the December 31, 1998 fund balance for this purpose; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

11. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for Dump improvements; and, to authorize the transfer of \$3,000 from the December 31, 1998 fund balance for this purpose; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

12. To see if the Town of Hancock will raise and appropriate up to three thousand dollars (\$3,000) to do road improvements on Davenport Road, in the area of the Davenport residence; and to authorize the transfer of \$3,000 from the December 31, 1998 fund balance for this purpose; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

13. To hear and act upon the report of the Fairfield Road Study Committee; or take any other action relating thereto.

14. Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 31:95-c to restrict revenues from the rental of town highway equipment to expenditures for the purpose of repairs and replacement of highway equipment? Such revenues and expenditures shall be accounted for in a special revenue fund to be known as the



Highway Special Revenue Fund, separate from the general fund. Any surplus in said fund shall not be deemed part of the general fund accumulated surplus and shall be expended only after a vote by the legislative body to appropriate a specific amount from said fund for a specific purpose related to the purpose of the fund or source of revenue. Selectmen recommend this article. (Majority ballot vote).

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$1,890.00 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of beach and ballfield equipment; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Recreation Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 Town Meeting to fund this appropriation; or take any other action relating thereto. {No budget impact} Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$1,935.00 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of police equipment and authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Police Equipment Repair/Replacement Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting; or take any other action relating thereto. {No budget impact} Selectmen recommend this appreciation.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$16,250.00 for the purpose of purchasing the necessary materials to construct an appropriate storage area for the town's vital statistics and all other town records required to be retained permanently; and, to record onto a medium (ie. CD ROM) for retention at an off-premise location; and, authorize the withdrawal from the Hancock History Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting; or take any other action relating thereto. {No budget impact} Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$546.00 for the purpose of repairs to the tennis courts; and, authorize the withdrawal from the Hancock Tennis Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 Town Meeting; or take any other action relating thereto. {No budget impact} Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$1,430.00 for the purpose of purchasing baseball equipment and doing maintenance and repairs to the ballfields, and authorize the withdrawal from the Hancock Baseball Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1997 town meeting; or take any other action relating thereto. {No budget impact} Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

20. To see if the Town will vote to modify the MEMBERSHIP, and PROCEDURES Sections of the Hancock Town Advisory Committee as established under Article 20 of the 1950 Town Meeting. MEMBERSHIP: to be modified to delete the school board member. PROCEDURES: re-word Section C to state that at least 25 days

prior to all town meetings involving consideration of money articles, the Selectmen shall hold a public hearing at which interested parties may appear and be heard (RSA 32:5-I); or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this article.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the principal and interest portion of the Delia Thacher Park Trust Fund that was originally contributed to the Fund by the Town; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this article.

22. To see if the Town will vote to create an expendable general fund trust fund under the provisions of RSA 31:19-a, to be known as the Kepner Memorial Field Maintenance Fund, with the Selectmen as agents of the fund, for the purpose of maintaining and operating the Kepner Memorial Field. and, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$28,800 to be placed in this fund or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this article.

23. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the authorized and unissued bonds or notes, in the amount of \$13,400, from Article 3 of the March 14, 1998 Town Meeting. This represents the balance remaining authorized but unissued for the purchase of the Garland property; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this article.

24. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to make the waters of the Powder Mill Pond in Hancock a wildlife sanctuary; or take any other action relating thereto. BY PETITION BALLOT VOTE

25. To see if the Town of Hancock will adopt the following ordinance: The treatment, storage, disposal, and/or land application of municipal sewage sludge, industrial sludge, and products derived from these sludges is prohibited in the Town of Hancock, NH. This ordinance shall not apply to any facility owned and/or operated by the Town of Hancock for the disposal of septage generated within the Town of Hancock, NH; or take any other action relating thereto. BY PETITION. Selectmen recommend against this article.

26. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) for the purpose of funding fireworks for the enjoyment of Hancock citizens on or about July 4, 1999; or take any other action relating thereto. BY PETITION

27. To see if the Town will vote to restore two way traffic to Depot Road, retaining a cut to slow northbound traffic from Route 123 entering Depot road; or take any other action relating thereto. BY PETITION

28. To see if the Town will agree to the following resolution, which, if passed, is to be forwarded to our elected


representatives to the General Court of New Hampshire and the United States Congress: WHEREAS smoking is the No. 1 preventable cause of death in the US today. WHEREAS a large and growing amount of evidence has confirmed that the tobacco companies have been targeting our children as their prime "replacement smokers:" WHEREAS the national Center for Disease Control states that nearly 24,000 of New Hampshire's youth, currently under the age of 18, will die prematurely of a tobacco-related illness; WHEREAS to pursue their ends the tobacco lobby has influenced the vote of most members of Congress by means of millions of dollars in campaign contributions to representatives of both major parties; WHEREAS in the past 10 years this tobacco lobby has ignored the will of the people and prevented passage of 99% of the Congressional bills (172 out of 174), dealing with tobacco use and public health; THEREFORE, recognizing that profits have been elevated not only above people, but above our children, we the citizens of Hancock join with other towns in NH to: Call upon the General Court to allocate a JUST part of NH's TOBACCO settlement funds to fund essential TOBACCO cessation and prevention programs for the youth of New Hampshire; and call upon our elected members of the NH General Court and US Congress, as a pledge of their commitment to our youth, to state publicly that: i) they will refuse to accept any campaign funding, direct or indirect, from the tobacco industry/lobby; and ii) they will support effective legislation to curb the spread of tobacco addiction; or take any other action relating thereto. BY PETITION

29. To see if the Town will agree to the following resolution, which, if passed, is to become town policy: WHEREAS smoking is the NO. 1 preventable cause of death in the US today. WHEREAS, in order to fill the ranks of those who die of tobacco-related illness or manage to quit, a large and growing amount of evidence has confirmed that the tobacco companies have been targeting our children as their prime "replacement smokers". WHEREAS the national Center for Disease Control states that nearly 24,000 of New Hampshire's youth, currently under the age of 18, will die prematurely of a tobacco-related illness; WHEREAS the tobacco industry's targeting of our youth has contributed to billions of dollars worth of healthcare and productivity costs that come out of taxpayers pockets. THEREFORE, recognizing that profits have been elevated not only above people but above our children, we, the citizens of Hancock, instruct the Trustees of the Town's Trust Funds, through our Selectmen, to join with other towns in NH to: a) examine the investment portfolio in which the town's various trust funds are presently held and to disinvest such funds as my be invested in tobacco stocks and/or tobacco bonds, such divestment to be done as prudently as possible, but to be completed before the town Meeting in the year 2000; to report to the year 2000 Town Meeting whatever action they may have been obliged to take in compliance with (a) above; to determine that a policy of non-investment in tobacco companies is followed henceforth, unless rescinded by a future town meeting; or take any other action relating thereto. BY PETITION

30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept the reports of auditors and committees as printed in the Town Report; or take any other action relating thereto.

31. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.



## SUMMARY 1998 TOWN MEETING MINUTES

ARTICLE 1. Town officers elected by BALLOT March 10, 1998.

ARTICLE 2. Voted to raise and appropriate \$1,048,849 which represents the operating budget, inclusive of the Water Dept. operations.

ARTICLE 3. Ballot vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150,000 for the purchase of the Garland property passed by a vote of YES-122, NO-17.

ARTICLE 4. Voted to raise and appropriate up to \$27,827 to upgrade South Elmwood. .

ARTICLE 5. Ballot vote to raise and appropriate up to \$18,800 to modify existing classroom for police dept. passed by a vote of YES-120, NO-6..

ARTICLE 6. Voted to raise and appropriate up to \$17,200 to install a lift at the highway garage.

ARTICLE 7. Ballot vote to raise and appropriate up to \$5,000 to start a staffed summer recreational program passed by a vote of YES-63, NO-56.

ARTICLE 8. Voted to raise and appropriate up to \$10,000 to upgrade bridge on Depot.

ARTICLE 9. Voted to raise and appropriate up to \$3,675 to modify elementary school for town offices..

ARTICLE 10. Voted to raise and appropriate \$4,100 to repair south side fire station roof.

ARTICLE 11. Voted to raise and appropriate \$1,500 to modify Depot Road.

ARTICLE 12. Voted to table Article 12.

ARTICLE 13. Voted to discontinue a Class VI portion of Old Town Road.

ARTICLE 14. Voted to authorize selectmen to work with Church for handicapped accessibility and sprinkler system for Hancock Meetinghouse.

ARTICLE 15. Voted to refer article to study committee.

ARTICLE 16. Voted to raise and appropriate up to \$900 for beach and ballfield equipment from Hancock Recreation fund.

ARTICLE 17. Voted to raise and appropriate up to \$4,941 for repair and replacement of police equipment from Police Equipment Fund.

ARTICLE 18. Voted to raise and appropriate up to \$10,000 for work on the genealogy from the Hancock History Fund.

ARTICLE 19. Voted to raise and appropriate up to \$1,200 for baseball equipment and ballfield maintenance from the Hancock Baseball Fund.

ARTICLE 20. Voted to rescind unissued bonds or notes in the amount of \$39,000 from Article 6, 1997 Town Meeting- purchase of pumper fire truck.

ARTICLE 21. Voted to rescind unissued bonds or notes in the amount of \$30,000 from Article 17, 1992 Town Meeting- repairs to Meetinghouse steeple.

ARTICLE 22. Voted to rescind unissued bonds or notes in the amount of \$25,000 from Article 6, 1993 Town Meeting- modifications to Hancock Water System.

ARTICLE 23. Voted to authorize Selectmen to accept reports of auditors and committees as printed in Town Report.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 1:50 P.M.

## SELECTMEN'S ANNUAL REPORT

This has been a very active year for Town affairs. One major event was finally relocating into the old elementary school as the new town offices. Under the able direction of Barbara Caverly and Wendy Brennan, the transition from the temporary quarters in the old Depot building went very smoothly. We are all very grateful to the Depot Association for giving us a home for more than a year until the elementary school was available. As I write this, the small school building has been relocated and is being converted into a new home for our Police Department. This will be the first time they have had an adequate facility in which to conduct their work. In converting this building, care has been taken to give it an appearance that matches the architectural features common to the village.

1999 HAS BEEN A YEAR OF SIGNIFICANT PERSONNEL CHANGES. Early in the year, Hank Query retired as Road Agent. In a successful recruitment effort, Kurt Grasset was selected as Hank's replacement. His 13 years experience with Amherst's Department of Public Works, coupled with a very impressive interview, made our task easy. The results can already be seen in the outstanding condition of our town roads. His approach of improving roads with minimal disturbance of the scenic aspects is greatly appreciated.

Late in the year, Ed Coughlan retired after 21 years as our police chief. His low key, effective ways, particularly with young people, were the hallmark of his tenure. In our recruiting efforts for a replacement, we were very conscious of his approach and how well it fit Hancock. A panel of six (three Selectmen, two residents, and a State Police Sergeant) interviewed seven candidates for the position of Police Chief. There was strong consensus that we had the ideal replacement in Michael Sielicki, who was Chief of Police in Colebrook at the time of his selection. As of this writing, he is due to take over as Chief in Hancock on January 18, 1999. He, his wife, and three children will be taking up residence in Hancock in the near future. We feel that Chief Sielicki and Sergeant Steve Baldwin will make a strong team as the basis for the Hancock Police Department.

As usual, our task this year has been greatly supported and aided by several ad hoc committees of volunteers exploring and proposing solutions to a number of important issues. These committees are listed by name on pages 3-8 of this report. We briefly list them here to recognize their contribution and to ensure that residents realize just how much we depend on volunteers.

The Kepner Memorial Park study group has been working diligently to define a program for common use of the former Garland property located along the shore of Norway Pond and Route 137. This committee will be making a first report of their activities at Town Meeting. Their work will be ongoing into the new year.

The Delia Thatcher Park Committee has completed an excellent effort which has found that some of the funds accumulating in the Trust in her name actually belong to the town and therefore we can, by vote at Town Meeting, use them for other recreational purposes. A warrant article to this effect is included in the Warrant.

The Sludge Study Committee has had a very frustrating year because the State of NH regulations are in constant flux. That Committee will have a status report and possibly some recommended action for us, but their work will continue into another year. This Committee deserves our thanks and support for taking on this cloudy and controversial subject.

A vote of many thanks goes to Dick Bell, Clay Sherman and Jack Roper for organizing and conducting the Hazardous Waste collection for Hancock at the Peterborough transfer station. Because of their efforts, Hancock residents were leaders in taking advantage of the program.

Another committee headed by Chief Coughlan studied parking in the village in an attempt to find ways to gain additional parking on what is becoming a very busy street. Their suggestions are being reviewed by the Selectmen for possible action in the coming months.

Finally, we have two ongoing committees working to raise funds and accomplish modifications to the Meetinghouse so that we can meet fire code and ADA requirements. The first is necessary in order to prevent the State Fire Marshall's Office from closing the building to public use. The latter modifications are not only to comply with Federal ADA Laws, but also as an effort to make life a little more pleasant for our disabled residents.

With regard to the 1999 budget, after holding the line for 8 years, we have finally found it necessary to propose one that requires a modest increase in taxes. Increases in departmental budgets plus several money warrant articles have combined to cause the increase. If the budget is passed as presented, the increase will represent an increase in the tax rate from \$4.67 to \$4.93, which after 8 years of a flat rate does not seem to be an unreasonable change.

We can't close this report without recognizing the work of the town's permanent staff and standing committee members, who truly keep the "wheels" of the town greased and running smoothly. We are deeply indebted to them for their continuing faithful, high caliber service. Every year they need to be augmented with new members to replace those who leave for various reasons. We would ask residents to make their availability and preferences for volunteer positions known.

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### *INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT*

To the Members of the

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of the Town of Hancock as of and for the year ended December 31, 1998 as listed in the table of contents. These general purpose financial statements are the responsibility of the Town's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these general purpose financial statements based on our audit.

Except as discussed in the following paragraphs, we conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Government Accounting Standards Board Technical Bulletin 98-1, *Disclosures about Year 2000 Issues*, requires disclosure of certain matters regarding the year 2000 issue. The Town of Hancock has included such disclosures in Note 6C. Because of the unprecedented nature of the year 2000 issue, its effects and the success of related remediation efforts will not be fully determinable until the year 2000 and thereafter. Accordingly, insufficient audit evidence exists to support the Town of Hancock's disclosures with respect to the year 2000 issue made in Note 6C. Further we do not provide assurance that the Town of Hancock is or will be year 2000 ready, that the Town of Hancock's year 2000 remediation efforts will be successful in whole or in part, or that parties with which the Town of Hancock does business will be year 2000 ready.

The general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the general fixed assets account group which should be included in order to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. As is the case with most municipal entities in the State of New Hampshire, the Town of Hancock has not maintained historical cost records of its fixed assets. The amount that should be recorded in the general fixed assets account group is not known.

*Independent Auditor's Communication of Reportable Conditions and Other Matters*

In our opinion, except for the effect on the financial statements of the omission described in the preceding paragraph, along with the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had we been able to examine evidence regarding year 2000 disclosures, as noted above, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Town of Hancock, as of December 31, 1998, and the results of its operations and the cash flows of its nonexpendable trust funds for the year then ended in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Hancock taken as a whole. The combining and individual fund financial statements listed as schedules in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Hancock. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly presented in all material respects in relation to the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.

## LIBRARY TRUSTEES REPORT

For the last 40 years libraries have aggressively remade themselves into cheery info-marts eager to loan out anything -- records, videos, paintings -- as if to apologize for having a lot of books on hand. The new libraries, painted in bright "Mod" colors, were happening places. And the new librarians, wearing buttons saying "There are no stupid questions," were quick as game-show contestants with answers about taxes, plumbing, and Burkina Faso.

The library was on the run from its old image: mausoleums with dusty busts of Milton and Spenser in the murky light, dead quiet except for the click of heels echoing down marble halls and the ssshhing! of library matrons who had pledged their lives to the Dewey decimal system.

But those old libraries have something that we are rediscovering as the digital information revolution advances. They had magnificent reading rooms, palaces for quiet thought, research, dawdling, daydreaming. They were grand spaces which recognized that reading is a kind of loitering. The recently completed restoration of the New York Public Library's reading room has been gratefully received. As parts of Boston Public Library's McKim, Mead & White building emerge from under the grime, it is like seeing the library for the first time. And at the University of New Hampshire, in Durham, architect Graham Gund has designed the new library with a series of reading rooms impressive for their grace. (A word no one would ever use to describe the old library.)

With the importance of reading rooms in mind we have opened the library more hours. We are now open five days a week. The new hours on Monday and Wednesday from 2 to 6, have been added to the old hours: Tuesday and Thursday 10-7, and Saturday 10-4. Why open 2 p.m. on Mondays and Wednesdays? That's when the middle school and high school kids come home.

To help you remember these hours, the library has been selling a refrigerator magnet with our hours as well as those of the town clerk and the dump. (Pick one up. But please don't call, as a few people have, and ask us to look up the clerk's hours on the magnet.)

These new hours were made possible, in part, by the generous donors who answered the 1997 fund-raising appeal. During that appeal we received an anonymous gift earmarked for the children's room, which has gone to improve that room with new shelving and work areas. Children's Librarian May Ann Hitchcock had 90 children busy in the summer program reading 1,890 books, so she welcomes the new space.

This year brought the sad news of the passing of a loyal library patron, Virginia Gleason. "Ginny" left the library \$25,000 to buy books. We have received other donations in her memory and these will pay for a glass display case to be built by Woody Huntington.

Also this year, we welcomed the youngest library patrons ever: Gina Saltonstall led a story hour and play group for two year olds. We leave to them, the Class of 2014, the task of restoring those "Mod" Go-go libraries.

## HANCOCK TOWN LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The trustees and staff of the Hancock Town Library strive to provide the residents of Hancock with the services they need and desire. As a result of surveys, we learned the town wanted the library to be open more hours. After completing a successful fund drive, eight hours were added to the schedule so we are now open thirty-two hours a week. The additional afternoons are being used more each month as the patrons become accustomed to the new hours.

The increased hours necessitated adding to the group of volunteers and there are now twenty-two men and women who give time each week to catalog, cover and label, card and shelve the books, answer questions and solve all the mysteries that arise in the library.

Another suggestion from the patrons was to provide internet access to the public and this goal should be achieved in the early months of 1999. With the use of the web and CD-ROMs we will be able to provide a wider range of up-to-date reference.

Interlibrary loan is available to all registered library users. This allows us to provide books that are not in our collection for the use of our patrons. In 1998 we borrowed 270 and loaned 91 books to other libraries in the state.

The Daniels Room provides a comfortable room for meetings of community organizations and groups. The Conservation Commission, Woman's Club, Hancock Education and Research Society, Historical Society and Great Decisions Discussion Group meet there regularly. During the period of time the town offices were located in the Depot, many town departments held their meetings in the Daniels Room.

The library is here for the residents of Hancock. Please let us know if there are services you would like to have available to you. We will continue to work to make this library one of the best small libraries in the state.

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## ROAD AGENT'S REPORT

1998 brought changes to the Hancock Highway Department. On January 31, 1998, Hank Query retired as your road agent after 8 years of dedicated service to the citizens of Hancock. On February 1, 1998, I was appointed road agent and given the "keys to the barn". My first eleven months have been the most challenging but also the most satisfying months of my career. I consider myself fortunate to have found a community that has accepted myself, as well as my family, in such a short amount of time. I have also been fortunate to inherit a staff that is dedicated to providing the town with the best possible service in a professional manner. In April of this year Dave Bilodeau took a position with D.D. Bean, I would like to wish Dave well in his new endeavor and thank him for his years of service to the citizens of Hancock. On May 1, 1998 Allen Young filled the vacant position, Allen and his wife Jill live in Bennington.

Mother Nature proved challenging during 1998. The January ice storm and the subsequent clean up required 425 man hours for the highway department. In late May, the town was hit with severe thunderstorms and high winds, this weather event required 115 man hours, as well as assistance from the fire and police departments to control and clean up. And because everything runs in three's, June saw some of the heaviest rainfalls this area has experienced in years. The department spent 165 man hours opening culverts, clearing ditches and water bars, and repairing washouts. All toll, the highway department spent just over 4 weeks handling special weather circumstances.

During the remainder of the year the highway department performed the normal maintenance town wide and special maintenance on the south east corner of town. During spring, summer and fall we ditched approximately 8 miles of paved and gravel road, we spot shimmed and sealed about 5.9 miles of paved road and we added 3 to 4 inches of crush gravel to about 3.5 miles of gravel road.

The highway department also replaced the undersized culverts on Depot Road, with an 8.5 foot by 6 foot pipe arch, this new structure should alleviate any flooding problems for many years to come. At the same time we installed a dry hydrant, provided by and with the assistance of the fire department, which will help to improve fire protection for the residents and homes in that area. We also completed the changes to the intersection of Depot Road and Route 123, as voted at Town Meeting. In September, the highway department began the reconstruction of the gravel portion of South Elmwood Road. Due to higher than anticipated ledge removal, we were unable to complete this project before the end of 1998, we will be completing the rest of the project in 1999. The end of 1998 has seen very little snow or ice so far, this open winter is allowing us to start a brush cutting program on the roads. We will be oiling next year. We are also planning on building a roof over the sanders to help keep the rain out during the off season, this should help to protect the life of our sanding equipment.

I would like to thank the Board of Selectmen for their guidance, the police and fire departments for their assistance, the citizens of Hancock for their support, and the highway department personnel (Albert, Roger, David and Allen) for their dedicated service to the citizens of Hancock.

## HANCOCK FIRE DEPARTMENT

1998 was the Fire Department's busiest year to date, we responded to 135 calls for service, 63 rescue calls, 28 mutual aid calls, 10 motor vehicle accidents, 8 automatic fire alarms, 8 storm related calls, 5 chimney fires, 4 brush fires, 3 structure fires, a vehicle fire, a stove fire, a smoke investigation, an electrical fire, a Carbon Monoxide investigation, and aided in locating a missing person. Department members have put in 1,359 hours of call time along with over 800 hours of training. We thank all of them and their families for the time they have given to our town. In addition, David Skerry and David White have each completed over 140 hours of training to earn their Emergency Medical Technician Certification.

Two of our members, Scott Lester and Jeff Robidoux resigned this year, we thank them for their contribution to the Department and the town. We welcome Kurt Grasset to our Department and look forward to working with him. Kurt comes to us with 14 years experience with the Amherst Fire Department.

We would like to thank Ed Coughlan for all that he has done for us over the last 22 years, it has been a pleasure working with him as Police Chief and wish him good luck in his retirement.

We would also like to thank the Ladies Auxiliary, Highway Department, Police Department, Barbara, Wendy, and the Board of Selectmen for all they have done for us - we appreciate your help.

And to all the residents of Hancock - THANK YOU for your continued support.

## REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Ranger, contact your local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required before doing ANY outside burning. There are ten Forest Rangers who work for the NH Division of Forests and Lands, Forest Protection Bureau. State Forest Rangers are available to assist communities with forest fire suppression, prevention and training programs as well as the enforcement of forest fire and timber harvest laws. If you have any questions regarding forest fire or timber harvest laws, please call our office at 271-2217.

The ice storm in early 1998 created a greater potential fire hazard as well as safety hazards to many areas of the state. If you need assistance or information dealing with ice damaged woodlands, please call 1-800-444-8978. The State of New Hampshire operates 15 fire towers, 2 mobile patrols and 3 contract aircraft patrols. This early detection and reports from citizens aid in the quick response from local fire departments. This is a critical factor in controlling the size of wildland fires and keeping the loss of property and suppression costs as low as possible.

## HANCOCK PLANNING BOARD

Although the Planning Board only approved one subdivision, we held 11 preliminary hearings, approved 2 boundary line adjustments, approved 4 voluntary mergers and approved an application for a site plan review for the Monadnock Area Cooperative School (MACS) on Forest Road, and a site plan application for an expansion of the Hancock Inn on Main Street.

The committee that was formed in 1997 to study home based businesses and home occupations presented their recommendations and a draft ordinance to the Planning Board. The proposed ordinance was discussed, revised, sent back to the committee to clarify and revise, and again worked on by the Board. The Planning Board met with the Selectmen for their input. A copy of the draft was sent to the Zoning Board of Adjustment for their review, and a joint meeting with the Selectmen, ZBA and Planning Board is scheduled for early February 1999. We expect to hold public hearings on this new ordinance by late spring of 1999, and are hoping for a large attendance as we need to hear from you. Check the paper for hearing dates.

## HANCOCK WATER WORKS ANNUAL REPORT 1998

1998 was a relatively quiet and routine year for the water system. We experienced no breaks on either mains or service lines so the maintenance costs were lower than normal. The major maintenance expense was for a specialty contractor to inspect and clean the intake screen at Juggernaut Pond. The screen was found to be in good condition.

There were no new service connections added this past year, but there were two 6" fire (sprinkler) mains installed. One to the new school and one to the Meetinghouse.

All testing for bacteria and chemicals were taken on schedule and all test results were within acceptable limits. We owe a special thanks to Russell Nylander for helping with our difficulty in meeting a new EPA requirement of raw water samples being at the laboratory within 8 hours of sampling. Russell takes our sample with him every Monday morning on his way to work and drops it off at the State Lab. It is a big help to us as well as a cost savings.

The new treating facility continues to function well.

## HANCOCK DUMP COMMITTEE

The Hancock Dump has had a very busy year in 1998. Hancock residents continued their enthusiastic support as approximately 35% of the solid waste that came to the Center was recycled. The following materials are being recycled at the Hancock facility: glass containers, plastic containers, newspapers, magazines, corrugated cardboard, kraft paper, mixed and office paper, aluminum cans, steel cans, scrap metal, tires, used clothing, household batteries, used motor oil, and compostibles. Scrap lumber and brush are deposited on the burn pile which is burned when weather conditions permit. Used household items are exchanged at the very active Swap Shop. Recycled oil is burned in a use-oil furnace to heat the Town Barn, thereby saving on fuel costs.

In general, as more and more communities have moved to recycling, the supply of materials has pushed prices lower and it has become more difficult to find reliable vendors who will accept loose materials in Gaylord boxes. During this year, two vendors cancelled agreements forcing a search for a third. A reliable vendor was found, but handling methods necessitated the purchase of plastic Gaylords for shipping the materials. However, the cost of disposal for unrecycled trash is \$72.00 per ton versus \$32.00 per ton for recyclables.

In October, Hancock joined with Peterborough, Jaffrey, Bennington, Dublin, Sharon and New Ipswich in a household hazardous waste collection at the Peterborough Recycling Center. This was a joint effort to collect and dispose of oil based paint, petroleum based products, insecticides, fertilizer, household chemicals, and other materials which are hazardous to the environment. This effort was very successful with participation by more than 80 Hancock households out of a total of 180 from the seven towns that joined in the effort. Many thanks to Suzie Mansfield and the Peterborough Recycling Center for assistance with coordination and execution of this collection.

This fall we all were saddened by the passing of Ken Blood. Ken was a dedicated and long time employee at the Hancock Recycling Center and he will be greatly missed.

Many thanks to Barbara Caverly, Wendy Brennan, the Highway Department, and the able staff at the Recycling Center who work hard all year to make the Hancock Dump a friendly and smoothly operating facility.

## THATCHER PARK STUDY COMMITTEE

We were asked by the Selectmen to look at the Thatcher Park Land and associated Trust Fund with two goals in mind: first, to develop a general conceptual plan for the use of the land for recreational purposes such as hiking trails and picnic areas; and to determine if some of the income from the Thatcher Trust Fund could be used for other Town recreation lands.

The Thatcher Trust Fund has accumulated a considerable sum since its creation in 1951. The Fund was established with a gift from Louis B. Thatcher, and a matching amount from the Town, for the purpose of developing and maintaining the land as a forest and park reservation for the benefit of the public. To date, none of the Fund income has been used.

We researched the rather convoluted history of the Thatcher Park Land and performed a title search to determine if there were any further encumbrances on the land. We also consulted with the Town Attorney and have concluded that since about half of the money originally establishing the Trust fund was contributed by the Town, about half of the income now in the fund could, with the approval of the Town, be used for other Town recreational land development and maintenance.

A very generous development plan for the Thatcher Park Land has been written and we have submitted a Warrant Article for approval by the voters to allow the Selectmen to use part of the Thatcher Trust Fund to develop and maintain other Town recreation lands.

## KEPNER MEMORIAL RECREATION AREA STUDY COMMITTEE (Mary Garland Property)

The committee met with Wetland Scientist, Rick Vandepoll and also with Helen Castles, District Conservationist as to possible uses for the Mary Garland land. The findings were that this land is not suitable for athletics (baseball and soccer fields). This land is just too wet.

As for an ice rink, the best location is probably behind the fire station, where it is presently wooded. It is also being recommended that there are two locations that would be good for a picnic ground; the higher land to the left or south of the fire station and the higher ground behind the fire station on the edge of the pond.

The committee also felt that this would be a good area for wetland trails and may a board walk.

Another concern was that the town keep the brush and trees that are growing up between the pond and road, cut down, so that the pond could continue to be viewed from the road. One suggestion was that this be a High School Community Service Project.

## SLUDGE COMMITTEE

This committee was formed on 17 February 1998 to investigate and recommend a Town Ordinance regarding the land distribution of sludge in the Town of Hancock.

In order to gain insight into this very complex issue, we reviewed a model ordinance written by the Rockingham Planning Commission, site plan regulations written by Southwest Planning Commission, and the State of New Hampshire Septage and Sludge Management Rules (Env-Ws 800) dated March 1996. We contacted Dr. Estes of the UNH Biology Department and Scott Sudweeks of the NH Health Department for their comments. We have read many articles, both pro and con, concerning the distribution of this waste material. In addition, we visited the Waste Water Treatment Facility in Franklin, NH to discover first hand how waste water is transformed into sludge. As part of our review process, we discovered that Env-Ws 800 was being revised to incorporate more strict requirements with regard to heavy metal loading, pathogen tests, setbacks, and ground water monitoring.

On 13 May 1998, we hosted a public hearing to explore the concept of a demonstration program for the spreading of sludge on William Weston's gravel pit as part of his reclamation project. Representatives from DES and Resource Management Incorporated (RMI) who proposed to spread this material, gave presentations and answered questions.

With regard to Env-Ws 800, 18 December 1998 was the last hearing for the new management rules for ground spreading of sludge and septage. The Joint Legislative Committee on Administrative Rules has 45 days to approve or recommend changes to these documents.

With regard to the gravel pit demonstration program, RMI has informed us that if the new Env-Ws 800 Rules are approved as expected, it would be cost prohibitive to conduct this demonstration due to ground water monitoring requirements.

The committee is currently waiting to review the approved DES rules before making a recommendation as to how to proceed with a Town Ordinance.

With regard to the imposed moratorium on spreading sludge in the Town of Hancock, on 20 February 1997 the NH Water Pollution Control Association recommended that all waste water treatment facilities enact a moratorium on accepting septage or other water related waste from towns which ban or overly restrict the recycling of biosolids or septage. It is possible that, in the future, Hancock town residents could expect increased hauling costs associated with the pumping of their septic systems.

## HISTORIC HANCOCK MEETINGHOUSE COMMITTEE

In 1992 when major problems with the Meetinghouse steeple gave cause for its removal and restoration, the Historic Hancock Meetinghouse Committee was formed as a joint town and church committee to raise funds for the restoration and to take responsibility for the reconstruction work. Because that effort was so successful, it was felt that two other projects for the Meetinghouse should be undertaken as soon as possible to bring the building into compliance with fire safety requirements and to make it handicapped accessible. For several years, the Office of the State Fire Marshall has been urging that fire protection in the form of a sprinkler system be installed in the Meetinghouse and community groups have been requesting that handicapped access be provided for everyone who wishes to attend functions there. So, in 1998, the Historic Hancock Meetinghouse Committee was resurrected and two joint town and church subcommittees were formed: fund raising and construction.

The fund-raising effort has been active since the summer of 1998, explaining the project to folks and sending letters requesting donations. Generous response to solicitation efforts resulted in the collection of nearly \$50,000 as of the end of January. This amount will cover the cost of installing sprinklers throughout the building and will get us started on the handicapped accessibility project.

As the community appeal for funds proceeded, the committee decided to proceed first with the sprinkler installation project, since this was important to ensure continued use of the building. This project consists of two parts; installing a six-inch water main from the town water system into the basement of the Meetinghouse and then installing the plumbing and sprinklers throughout the building. As soon as funds became available, the water main was installed and tested in November, with some landscaping and final repair to Main Street deferred until spring. The remaining design work and necessary approvals should be completed during the second quarter. Every effort will be made to minimize the impact of the installation on ongoing activities in the building. The completed sprinkler system, along with the existing electronic safety systems will finally provide excellent fire protection for the Meetinghouse.

The accessibility project as it is presently planned will be an unusual, but exciting, solution. No one wanted to see a ramp with railings leading to the front door or a less than first class entrance somewhere else in the building. Nor did we want to compromise the integrity of the building or have its beautiful classic lines changed by a new side entrance. Accessibility will be achieved by regrading the land at the front of the building to bring the ground level up to the present level of the granite landing at the front of the building. The landing will be raised to the level of the door threshold, one step above ground level. A ground level sidewalk will then be constructed from the street to the right hand side of the new landing, giving direct access for the physically handicapped to the foyer of the building. The grade of this walkway will be such that no railing will be necessary. Pedestrian or wheelchair traffic could proceed on the same level from the outside into the Meetinghouse.

We will be sending out another letter this winter asking for help in reaching the goal of \$65,000. Newspaper articles and other publicity will inform everyone of the progress of both the fund-raising efforts and construction; the thermometer by the building gives a visual status report. Gifts in the form of material, labor, and equipment use are very welcome, the value of which will also be reflected on the thermometer. Our plan is to finish raising money by early May so that work can begin on the accessibility portion of the project, with completion expected by this summer.

Ted Wells died Dec 28, 1998, at his Nashua retirement home at the age of 101. He had served as a World War 1 pilot and became a successful businessman operating the Seaboard Construction Co in Boston, MA.
