TOWN WARRANT

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Merrimack in the
County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote
in Town Affairs:*

(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Merrimack on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town officers' salaries.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town officers' expenses.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the police department.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the fire department.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fighting forest fires.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the health department.
9. To see if the town will vote to receive state aid for construction of Class II or Class V road.
If State Aid Construction is desired, it must be expended on the road in the village from Daniel Webster Highway to Amherst road, and the State will contribute \$2,041.00, providing the town raises \$2,041.00.
If Class V assistance is desired, the town must raise \$824.93 and the State will contribute \$3,299.71.
10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the removal of snow.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the electric street lights in the village of Reed's Ferry, or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and supplies of town hall or take any action relating thereto.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public library.

16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of parks and playgrounds.

17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

18. To see if the town will vote to accept and take over the maintenance of the road leading from main highway past Morse's Store and by depot at South Merrimack now owned by Boston & Maine Railroad or take any action relating thereto.

19. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount for early payment of taxes and make appropriation for same, or take any action relating thereto.

20. To see if the town will vote to observe Old Home Day, and raise and appropriate money for same.

21. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action relating thereto.

22. To see if the town will vote to purchase oil to be used on the highway, and raise and appropriate money for same.

23. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control or take any action relating thereto.

24. To see if the town will vote to pay Transportation Labor on moth or take any action relating thereto.

25. To see if the town will vote to close the road at Thornton's Ferry leading down under the Boston &

Maine Railroad tracks, known as the North Ferry Road, or take any action relating thereto.

26. To see if the town will vote to repair the dam at Stump Pond, South Merrimack, and raise and appropriate money for same.

27. To see if the town will vote to buy the Power Grader now owned by Guy B. Watkins and raise and appropriate money for the same.

28. To see if the town will vote to put in a hydrant at Thornton's Ferry on the Daniel Webster Highway near the school; piping it from Maxfield's Pond and raise and appropriate money for the same.

29. To wit:

Is it expedient to revise the Constitution.

30. To see if the town will vote to install a water system at Thornton's Ferry and raise and appropriate money for the same or take any action relating thereto.

31. To see if the town will vote to revalue all property in town and publish the same in the next town report or take any action relating thereto.

32. To hear the reports of the town officers, and transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting, raise and appropriate money for the same.

At the beginning of the school year there was one change in the teaching staff in the primary grades at Reed's Ferry, Bernice Bookstrom, a graduate of Keene Normal School being selected to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Martha Lord.

Attention is called to the small enrollment at No. 7 and at Reed's Ferry. Unless more children move into these districts before next September, some adjustment will have to be made.

Intelligence tests have been given in all of the schools and an effort is being made to adjust the work to the need and ability of the individual child.

The school program at McGaw was interrupted by the fire on November 12. The major portion of the damage was in the laboratory and the cooking room, and so the program was only interrupted for one day. The damage was estimated at \$1189, and was fully covered by insurance.

As a result of the fire the laboratory and main room down stairs have been improved and refinished, new modern lighting equipment has been installed throughout the building, the cooking room has been nearly doubled in size and completely refinished with celotex ceiling and wall, and

new floor, and two small rooms not previously used are being made available for the girls for practice in decorating, after which one will be utilized as a dining room for the use of the cooking classes and the other a general utility, fitting and storage room for the classes in sewing.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF MAGAW NORMAL INSTITUTE

In June 1936 there were seven pupils graduated, of whom three are now in college, one in Junior college and one in Dunwoodie Institute, in Minneapolis.

When school opened there were twenty-two members in the entering class, eight in the Sophomore class, nine in the Junior class, and seven in the Senior class. Since then one Sophomore and two Juniors have left school. Since my last report two pupils have left town and there were seven who failed to return when school reopened, making the present enrollment 43.

There are at present nine graduates of the school who are attending colleges and one who is at Keene. The colleges represented in this group are the University of New Hampshire, University of Vermont, Norwich University, and Vermont Junior College.

Early in the year the headmaster received a letter from the Dean at the University of New Hampshire saying that because of the quality of the work being done there by its graduates the school had been placed on the honor roll. Also the school is now eligible to be listed with the New England College Board as soon as a graduate attends a college on their list.

During the fall term the play "Thirteen Plus" was given under the auspices of the Ladies Aid Society.

On November 12th fire broke out in the kitchen of the Home Economic department and was discovered by the headmaster at about 6:15 a. m. Quick and efficient work by the fire department prevented the fire from spreading and confined the damage to a relatively small area. Some smoke and water damage resulted. Repairs were begun immediately and although the school was closed the following day, which was Friday, it reopened as usual on the following Monday. New wiring and lights were installed throughout the school part of the building and the work of remodelling the kitchen is nearly completed. It has been rather difficult to carry on the school while the repairs were being made, but we have tried to make the best of it.

Plans are being made to present the annual Senior play in April.

The Home Arts Club is being continued this year under the direction of Miss Cross, and the school paper, the "Mc-Gaw Buzzer," is being published under the supervision of Miss Wood. From funds realized from the sale of the paper a new mimeograph machine has been purchased.
