Seventy-five official visits have been made. Promotions and classifications have been made at the beginning of each term, under the personal supervision of your committee, the position of each class noted, and at the end of each term the classes have been examined to the point of review of advance made, a record has been kept of each class, and the progress noted. We are pleased to report a highly satisfactory advance made by each class in town.

The parents and friends have manifested much interest in attending the examinations at the close of the terms, and it has been gratifying to note their words of commendation.

The Roll of Honor is very large, and reflects great credit upon the parents and scholars. Such attendance cannot be brought about without persistency and self-denial.

No. 2 school was kept in the Academy building the spring and fall terms. The winter term was opened in the new school house, erected a short distance south of the old one. Grammar department in the upper room, and Primary in the lower. The advanced scholars in districts No. 3 and 6 were given the privilege of attending the Grammar department, and several availed themselves of the advantages offered. The school in district No. 1, owing to the small number of scholars, was closed for the winter term, and the scholars conveyed to the schools in district No. 2.
