SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

July 15, 1922 to Feb. 1,, 1923

As a superintendent must become familiar with the needs of the schools before he can accomplish any constructive work, there can be little of great importance to report when one has been in the field only six months.

In this age of rapid progress, education cannot be allowed to stand still or retrogress, so there is constant need of constructive work in our schools. We all need to work for the future good of the children.

Our greatest need at the present time appears to be better attendance. The only legitimate excuses for absence are sickness, inclement weather or impassable roads. A child who is absent for several days loses interest in his work and finds it hard to keep up. Irregular attendance is one of the chief causes of non-promotion and is also an economic loss to the district.

I have made 127 official visits to Stewartstown schools since the opening of the fall term, have observed the work of the pupils and have tried to work with the teachers for the welfare and progress of every child.

Our teachers are earnest and sincere in their work and deeply interested in the progress of the pupils. I appreciate this loyalty and wish to thank them for their cooperation.

It is the duty of a superintendent to work for the interests of the children and see that their education is of such a nature as to train them for fair minded, efficient American citizens. Education is necessary to the stability of our nation. It is the foundation of progress and the safeguard of democracy.

It is my purpose to work for the welfare of the children, and in carrying out this purpose I ask the support of the citizens of Stewartstown.

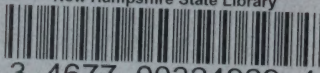
