



# WARRANT FOR MARCH MEETING.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the town of Eaton, in the county of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

I. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

II. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

III. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money to pay on debts of the town.

IV. To see what action the town will take for the use and care of the Town Hall, and pass any vote or choose any officer for such purpose.

V. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended on highways and bridges as a summer tax.

VI. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to let out the breaking of the roads in sections to the lowest responsible bidder, said bids to be sealed and delivered to the selectmen on or before Nov. 1, 1910.

VII. To see if the town will vote to raise the amount necessary to pay all road breaking bills at the next annual town meeting.

### REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

Laying out school lot, District No. 1, agreeable to the vote of the school district March 9, 1909, the school board located and fenced a school house lot at Eaton Center, No. 1, as follows:

Beginning in the center of the road near the foot of the Hill, thence north thirty-eight degrees, west  $7\frac{1}{2}$  rods to the iron rod in the big rock in the brook, thence east 53 degrees north  $10\frac{1}{2}$  rods, thence south 38 degrees, east  $7\frac{1}{2}$  rods to center of road, thence west 53 degrees, south  $10\frac{1}{2}$  rods to point begun at. This includes school buildings and land inside fence, it being a part of lot No. 3, formerly located by selectmen June 9, 1818, per town record, page 503.


