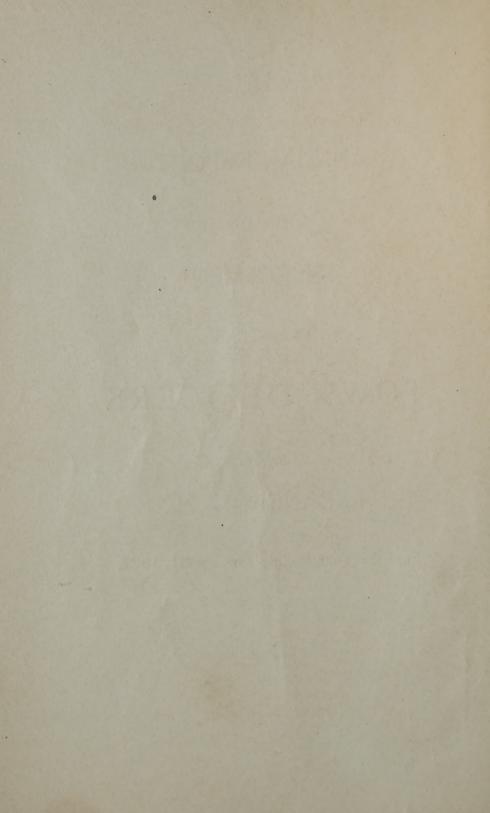

WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

The State of New Hampshire

(L. S.) To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Second—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Third—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the construction and repairs of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Fourth—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town.

Fifth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Sixth—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Hospital.

Seventh—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association.

Eighth—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library.

Ninth—To see what sum of money the town will

vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library.

Tenth—To see if the town will appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars to control the White Pine Blister Rust.

Eleventh—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

Twelfth—To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes, if paid before specified dates.

Thirteenth—To see if the town will continue the inspection of milk and raise money therefor.

Fourteenth—To see if the town will vote to give prescription permits from May first 1928 to May first 1929 according to Section 99, Laws of 1919, to druggists who are registered Pharmacists doing business in Lebanon, to sell liquors for medicinal, sacramental, scientific or mechanical purposes.

Fifteenth—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars for the benefit of a playground at West Lebanon.

Sixteenth—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground.

Seventeenth—To see if the town will vote to employ a firm of certified public accountants to audit the accounts of the Town, for the year 1928.

Eighteenth—To see if the town will vote to accept Federal Aid on the Dartmouth College Road.

Nineteenth—To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the provisions of Chapter 35, Laws of 1905, in relation to improved highways, and of Chapter 133, Laws of 1911, Section 27, in relation to the maintenance of the roads.

Twentieth—To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 87, Section 1, of the Revised Statutes, on a section of the Mascoma Valley road, so-called, and appropriate, or set aside

from the amount raised for the highway work the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for this purpose.

Twenty-first—To see if the town will vote to repair and improve Prospect Street and appropriate money therefor.

Twenty-second—To see if the town will vote to repair and improve Hough Street and appropriate money therefor.

Twenty-third—To see if the town will vote to issue bonds to the amount of \$50,000. fifty thousand dollars to refund the notes given the First National Bank of Boston in 1925 due to the closing of the Peoples Trust Company. To be payable \$5000. five thousand dollars yearly for ten years.

Twenty-fourth—To see if the town will vote to extend the sewer on Farnum Avenue to a point past the residence of B. J. Lawrence, a distance of 200 feet.

Twenty-fifth—To see if the town will vote to extend the street lights from Peter Monica's around the Heater Road.

Twenty-fifth—To see if the town will vote to build a sewer from a point near the house owned by the Boston Excelsior Company at Riverdale in said Lebanon running thence westerly along the highway to the Mascoma River and to appropriate money therefor.

Twenty-seventh—To see if the town will vote to send its pumping engine out of town on request, and to establish the price therefor.

Twenty-eighth—To see if the town will vote to pay the Firemen per hour for services outside the Precinct limits, and to establish the price therefor.

Twenty-ninth—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of twenty thousand dollars for the enforcement of the prohibitory law within the limits of the town by the employment of the necessary additional police officers and by every other lawful means.

Thirtieth—To see if the town will vote to raise fifteen hundred dollars to purchase an automobile for the use of the police officers of the town.

Thirty-first—To see if the town will vote to pay the regular police officers five dollars per day and the Chief of Police five dollars and a half per day; to allow all regular officers one day off in eight and two weeks vacation with pay.

Thirty-second—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to employ all police officers at a fixed wage rate per hour of labor and to prohibit the acceptance of any fees in addition to their regular wage rate.

Thirty-third—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to allow all restaurants and public eating places to keep open twenty-four hours a day.

Thirty-fourth—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to permit the all night parking of automobiles in all places where they are allowed to park in the day time.

Thirty-fifth—To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to make a written lease of the Opera House and moving picture fixtures in the Town Hall to the Lebanon Improvement Society for moving picture and theatrical purposes for a term not to exceed five years upon such terms and conditions as the Selectmen deem expedient for the best interests of the town.

Thirty-sixth—To see if the town will vote to authorize and direct the Selectmen to lease the Opera House, in the Town Hall, for operating moving pictures to the highest responsible bidder. Rent to be paid monthly in advance.

Thirty-seventh—To see if the town will vote to authorize and direct the Selectmen to recover from the Lebanon Improvement Society, by proper proceedings, all monies heretofore received by said society to date in operating moving pictures in the Opera House in the Town Hall, less the actual necessary overhead expenses in operating said moving pictures.

Thirty-eighth—To see if the town will vote to authorize and direct the Selectmen to demand and receive at once, from the Lebanon Improvement Society, a full, complete, accurate, itemized statement of all monies heretofore received by said society in operating moving pictures in the Opera House in the Town Hall to date, including a full, complete, accurate, itemized statement of all disbursements made by said society, from the money received by it in operating moving pictures in the Opera House in the Town Hall, to whom paid, when, for what, and the amount of each payment.

Thirty-ninth—To see what action the town will vote to take in regard to lowering rentals of the Opera House, Lower Hall, Banquet Hall and Kitchen, to all Churches and local Societies of the Town of Lebanon.

Fortieth—To see if the town will vote to authorize and direct the Selectmen to take such steps as may be necessary to recover all money heretofore paid by them to lawyers not employed by the Selectmen, for services in proceedings before the Public Service Commission in 1926, against the Boston & Maine Railroad.

Forty-first—To see if the town will provide for Municipal collection and disposal of garbage.

Forty-second—To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Forty-third—To choose one Selectman for the ensuing three years, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Forty-fourth—To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds of the Town for three years.

"To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates-at-large, Alternate Delegates-at-large, District Delegates, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States."

COMMENTS

Receipts:

In auditing the receipts listed above, we first tried to determine the amount of money that should have been received in the case of each class of receipts and then checked this amount against the amount recorded in the books of the Town Treasurer and Selectmen. In accordance with this procedure, the amount of money turned in for tax collections was verified by a detailed analysis of the Tax Collector's record of collections taking into account the date of all collections and the discounts that should have been allowed. Funds received from the State and County were verified by direct correspondence with the State Treasurer and County Commissioner. Receipts from other departments as the Town Clerk and Municipal Court were verified by means of an audit of the records of each department.

Disbursements:

Proper vouchers in the form of cancelled checks and purchase invoices were found to support the disbursements listed above. We assured ourselves in all cases that funds disbursed had been properly authorized and correctly distributed in the books of record.

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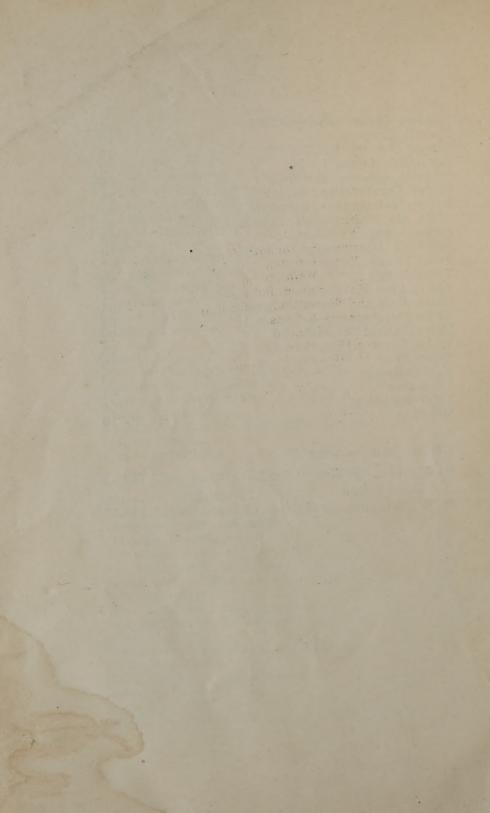
