TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lisbon Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the thirteenth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon; at which time polls shall open and not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects except 1 & 2 to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote on the question, "Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Laws relative to playing beano be adopted in this city or town?"
- 3. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate thirty-three thousand six hundred five dollars and nine cents (\$33,605.09) for Town Road Maintenance and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund and Anti-Recession Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972. (\$28,461.00 Revenue Sharing, \$1,245.09 Interest, plus \$3,899.00 Anti-Recession)
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriations for the same as set forth in the following budget:

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) from surplus funds to reduce the amount to be raised by taxes under Article 6.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell property acquired by Deed of the Tax Collector.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds through the State Disaster Coordinating Office and to expend the funds so received to repair the damage to Town Roads and/or bridges caused by any declared emergency and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums as may be necessary to defray the cost of repairing damage in anticipation of Federal Disaster Funds to be received through the State Disaster Coordinating Office.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) for the purpose of buying a new pick-up truck for the highway department, money to be taken out of surplus funds.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed six thousand (\$6,000.00) to purchase a new Police Cruiser, money to be taken out of surplus funds.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fourteen thousand six hundred dollars (\$14,600.00) to repair the foundation wall on the Town Hall Basement, install a concrete floor in the same area and install three carrying beams (this will give the Fire Department extra space), money to be taken out of surplus funds.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to pay the Board of Selectmen at a rate of \$7.00 per meeting and \$15.00 per day.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) to purchase and install a new boiler and oil burner in the Lisbon Public Library.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new fire engine for the Town of Lisbon, which will meet the specifications of and be approved by, the New Hampshire State Board of Underwriters, cost not to exceed \$55,000.00, said purchase to be on bids, selection to be by the Selectmen on consultation by them with and the advice of, the officers or a committee of the Fire Department.

- 16. If the vote on the above is in the affirmative, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$55,000.00 and for said purpose to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon the credit of the Town, a sum of money not to exceed \$55,000.00, and to issue serial notes of the Town for the cost not to exceed said sum, to be negotiated by them through a bank; the dates, maturities, denominations, the interest rate, and other details of said notes, to be delegated to the descretion of the Selectmen as may be for the best interests of the Town, and as may be necessary, in accordance with the laws of the State; and to authorize the Selectmen to execute said notes and any other papers necessary for the purposes of this article.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

We hereby submit our annual report to the citizens of the Town of Lisbon:

During the year 1978 your Selectmen were once again faced with a multitude of problems. Many of these problems were due to flooding, caused by the heavy rains in June. In order to take care of the flood damage to our roads, we have used over \$24,000 for road repair. Normally these funds would be used for improvement of the roads; how-ever, since the state of emergency could not be declared for this area, we were unable to receive any additional assistance. We estimate that it will be three or four years before we are able to get roads back into the same condition as they were before the flood damage.

SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT

The Sewage System is working well, but the cost of operation has increased, due to the rise in the cost of electricity, insurance, and supplies. Considerable damage was done to this system, such as filling of pipes and storm drains, plus washing away of land around the pumping stations. We were able to get an extension of the contract through Federal and State Funds, to the tune of about \$63,000. This will enable us to complete repair of damage done to the system. Of the total amount to be spent, the Town's share will be 5%.

SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL

The Solid Waste Disposal system is working well, and we very much appreciate the co-operation we have received from citizens using the facility. We are finding, however, that, due to restrictions on burning, the area is filling up faster than we had anticipated.

OTHER ITEMS

In last year's report, we asked for the purchase of a new compactor to be used at the Landfill. This compactor is proving very satisfactory, and has been helpful, as well, in doing other work, mostly on the roads. The new highway truck is also giving us good service.

The grant given to the Senior Citizens of Lisbon, to build the room on the Town Hall stage, is nearing completion. This area will make a valuable addition to the Town Hall as an all-purpose room which the town can use. It is anticipated that this project for the Seniors will be completed in the near future. Because use of the Town Hall has increased, the cost of operation (fuel, electricity, etc.) likewise has increased. We feel we must ask for additional funds in order to keep these activities going.

Your Selectmen have gone over the proposed budget, and feel that it represents fairly just what we will need to operate the business of the town during the coming year. There are several items in the warrant which you will be asked to vote on at Town Meeting. We leave these decisions up to you.

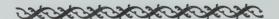

ANNUAL REPORT OF LISBON POLICE DEPARTMENT Year Ending December 31, 1978

Last year we put into effect a new parking ordinance on Main Street which limited parking to one hour. This was met with success due to the help and understanding on the part of the merchants and the citizens of Lisbon. We hope to achieve the same success this coming summer at the height of the tourist season.

The Police Department received far too many complaints on dogs running at large. I would like to remind the owners of dogs that we do have a dog ordinance in Town, and the Police Department will have no other recourse but to follow up the complaints with court action.

The Lisbon Police Department received a General Electric Portable radio last year. This piece of equipment was made possible with the funding by the Governor's Commission on Crime and Delinquency. This new portable allows us to receive radio coverage from the New Hampshire State Police, the Grafton County Sheriff's Department, and our own base while working away from the cruiser.

I would like to thank Fire Chief Harry Andross and members of the Lisbon Life Squad for their continued help over the past year during accident and medical emergencies that have arisen.

The members of the Lisbon Police Department join me in thanking the citizens of Lisbon for their continued help and understanding during the past year.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND FOREST FIRE WARDEN

For more than 80 years, a cooperative effort between the State of New Hampshire and local forest fire authorities has created a forest fire prevention and suppression program that is recognized as superior throughout the United States.

Since the first forest fire laws were written in 1895, the state and local community governments have worked together to prevent and combat forest fires.

Today, 249 forest fire wardens and more than 1,800 deputy wardens are appointed every three years by the State Forester to work with the members of the State Forest Fire staff in this effort. State funds are used to pay one-half the cost of forest fire suppression costs incurred by local forest fire organizations, within pay rates established by the Governor and Council. State funds matched by local funds are used to purchase hand tools to suppress forest fires, to train local forest fire crews and in forest fire prevention work.

All outside burning, when the ground is not covered with snow, is permitted only after obtaining a written fire permit from your local Forest Fire Warden. Penalty for burning without a permit when one is required is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine up to \$1,000 or a jail term of up to one year or both.

LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR 1978

Your Fire Department gained one new member during the year, and we are still looking for interested, qualified members. New members must be 18 years of age, complete a training course prescribed by the Department, and serve a six-month probationary period.

Thanks to members of our department who gave up many hours of their spare time, we now have a meeting room downstairs in what was the location of the old coal bin. We invite the public to come and have a look at it.

In observance of National Fire Prevention Week, we took part in a <u>Twin State Mutual Aid</u> hose drill. Fire Departments from Bath, Franconia, Landaff, Littleton, Monroe, Sugar Hill, and Woodsville joined us in laying two lines of four-inch hose to Plymwood Furniture and drawing and pumping water from the center of Town. This was the first exercise with the large hose; we used six 1,000-gallon pumpers and other Mutual Aid equipment and men to demonstrate the potential use of this valuable assistance for fighting large fires. The hose drill was also the first test of the communications system of our several Mutual Aid departments in a combined effort. The traffic problems were handled by the Littleton Fire Police.

Other Mutual Aid exercises included two days of practice using the new communication system set up with the Grafton County dispatcher. The drills simulated calls to Littleton on November 11 and to Haverhill on November 12. All of these drills were conducted in a very professional manner, and we are proud to be a part of the Twin State Mutual Aid organization. It is to be hoped that the time never comes when full mobilization of the service is necessary, but it is a comfort to know that such assistance is only a radio or phone call away. We are also glad to do our part to help our neighbors when they require the assistance.

The \$60,000 Warrant request is for the second of the two pieces of fire equipment mandated by the New Hampshire Board of Underwriters several years ago. The first of these is now ten years old!

Our ladder truck Parade entry made appearances this year at the State Convention in Ashland and at the Haverhill Fair.

New equipment that has been added this year includes:

Air Chisel, purchased with budgeted funds $1\frac{1}{2}$ -ton chain fall, purchased with donated funds Set of tools for LFD and Life Squad Trailer for rescue work using either our boat or a snow sled The last two items were made possible thanks to some generous donations and use of our own funds.

We raised funds by sponsoring two public dances in the Town Hall and burning grass. Plans are already made for the first dance for next year to be held on February 17.

We have added a slide presentation on wood-buring stove installation to our library, and would be glad to show it to any organization at any time.

In addition to our regular training sessions, all Department members took part in a CPR mini course. The following Fire Fighting schools were attended:

April 22-23, Lyndon State College, 3 men June 10-11, Lakes Region, 8 men, 1 woman September 23-24, 3 men New Hampshire Vocational-Technical, Laconia, officer training, Chief and Assistant Chief

My personal thanks to all officers and firefighters, the Lisbon Police Department, and our dispatchers, for their cooperation and efforts in making our Lisbon Fire Department such a good unit.

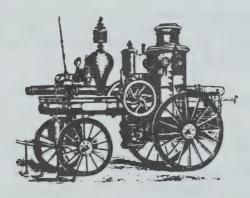

LISBON LIFE SQUAD REPORT FOR 1978

Lisbon Life Squad, in its first full year of service to the community, responded to 134 calls. These calls resulted in the volunteering of over 550 hours of time by members of the Lisbon Life Squad and the Lisbon Fire Department. This figure does not include training and meeting time. 39 of these calls were non-emergency responses for stand-by and civic type duties. The most common emergency call was for respiratory and cardiac problems totaling 19 responses, followed by 18 responses to automobile accidents.

The Lisbon Life Squad is available to respond to medical emergencies in the Lisbon area by calling the Lisbon Fire Department telephone number 838-2211.



LISBON PLANNING BOARD AND BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

The Lisbon Town Map was completed on schedule and delivered to the town. Representatives of the John E. O'Donnell Corporation of Auburn, Maine were present at public hearings to answer questions and make corrections.

Eleven subdivision plans were submitted for approval and one is pending. Ten were approved, two still pending.

Notices of Intent were reviewed as requested by the Selectmen.

One member attended Forum I, a state-wide planning session at the Waterville Valley conference center. The "Sounding Board" method of planning was demonstrated. It requires a group of dedicated citizens representing a broad cross-section of the community who are willing to devote 12 to 18 months of their spare time assessing the needs and problems of the town, seeking solutions, setting goals, and putting the plans into motion. Where tried, this plan has produced impressive results in financial benefits as well as improving the appearance and organization of the town.

The Planning Board participated in the Downtown Improvement study initiated by the Chamber of Commerce. The resulting information will be useful in updating our comprehensive plan. Several town improvement projects are planned for spring and summer.

Regular meetings are the fourth Tuesday of each month except when held in conjuction with public hearings, which are advertised in the newspaper. All meetings are open to the public and all records are available for public inspection.

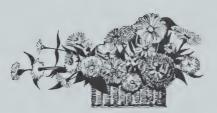

NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL, INC.

BOX 40, FRANCONIA, NH

In Lisbon, North Country Council assisted the town in completing a Downtown Improvement Program for Lisbon-Landaff. Arranged a meeting with state officials to discuss outdoor recreations fund, and historic preservation. NCC is available to help the town follow-up on the program's recommendations.

The North Country Council continued to make substantial progress in 1978 by providing services in the following areas:

<u>Planning Services</u>: Providing local technical assistance to member communities continued to consume a good amount of Council time. Areas of assistance include: master planning, subdivision regulations, zoning, reviewing development proposals, mobile homes, grantsmanship, etc. Through a grant from the Farmers Home Administration, NCC will have the services of a project planner and planning engineer to further assist communities in water supply, solid waste and review of development proposals.

Economic Development: NCC updated its Overall Economic Development Program, a requirement which entitles the North Country to EDA grants and loans. The Council also completed a Wood Energy Study and a Downtown Improvement Program for one town. Through the resources of the University of New Hampshire, a business counseling program is being developed. Federal and state agencies use the Council's work as a guide for future public investments.

<u>Preparation of Regional Plans</u>: In 1978, the Council adopted and published both the Land Use Element and the Housing Element. Both of these documents provide a broad framework for action in these two areas. In the area of solid waste, the Council has coordinated a number of meetings with the NH Air Pollution Control Commission, Division of Public Health and sponsored a meeting on solid waste disposal in January 1979. The Council has continued to make progress in the Public Transportation Program. NCC also coordinated with the NH Department of Public Works and Highways in the annual meeting to receive local input on needed highway improvements. Much of the Council's time is spent responding to requests from Selectmen on various planning matters. Fact sheets have been prepared on soils and community planning, wetlands, and master planning. Other educational documents will be prepared in 1979.

<u>North Country Perspective</u>: NCC continues to respond to opportunities to provide a North Country perspective to federal and state policies. NCC represented the area in a 3-day workshop as part of the Farmers Home Administration's national assessment of rural community facilities. Council members represent the North Country on the State's "208" Water Quality Program, solid waste program and other areas. The Council testified before the NH House subcommittee on Growth.

Education and Information: For the third consecutive year, the North Country Council co-sponsored the six municipal law lectures. A special workshop was held on the development of small hydro sites. NCC also sponsored a North Country meeting of bankers, real estate agents, local officials, and other development interests to inform them of the opportunities under the NH Housing Finance Agency's mortgage program. With the advent of <u>Planning Profiles</u>, the Council's monthly newsletter, NCC is making an effort to keep local officials and interested persons up-to-date on Council programs and other related planning activities. In a further effort to solicit local input on planning projects, the Council has been holding a series of subregional meetings around the North Country.

In 1979, the Council expects to provide more services to local officials to help them carry out the goals of their own towns. The newly-funded Area Development Assistance Program will provide greater assistance to communities. NCC will be working on an energy program to determine the practicality of developing indigenous energy resources. Requests for community planning services will increase.

Membership in the Council over the last five years has increased from five members in 1973 to forty active members in 1978. A good deal of service has been provided in that period and it is hoped that more can be provided in the years ahead. Ideas on how the Council can be of greater assistance to towns are welcomed. The Board of Directors and all the members of the North Country Council greatly appreciate the support received from the towns. This support has enabled the Council to provide its planning services for the region and local communities.

1978 Report

North Country Home Health Agency, from its main office at 60 High Street, Littleton, and satellite offices in Cottage Hospital and Linwood Medical Center, provides health care services aimed at both prevention and treatment of disease. The Agency serves residents of 15 towns in the North Country.

In 1978, the following services were delivered:

<u>6173 Skilled Nursing Care visits</u> to patients in their homes. These are for the chronically ill, care following hospitalization or acute care in lieu of hospitalization.

507 Health Promotion visits for the assessment and evaluation of a person's needs and/or problems.

<u>160 Visits to Newborns</u> and their mothers for assistance and reassurance. No charge is made for either health promotions or newborn visits.

200 Physical Therapy visits to homebound patients.

22 Speech Therapy Visits to homebound patients. This is a new service added in November.

<u>8130 Homemaker/Home Health Aide visits</u> for assistance with personal care, light housekeeping and meal preparation, and other healthrelated services which enable people to remain in their own homes.

Public Health activities, aimed at prevention:

A total of 29 clinics for children were held throughout the area, as well as 4 adult health screening clinics co-sponsored with Lions Clubs. Follow-ups as needed were made on problems discovered in the clinic settings. 739 children received services ranging from immunizations to orthopedic evaluations. 501 adults attended the health screening clinics in four towns. Clinics are available to all residents without charge.

This Agency is approved by Medicare and the New Hampshire Department of Public Health as a certified provider of home care services. The Board of Directors is composed of volunteer members representing the towns served. It is a non-profit agency. Services to residents of Lisbon include:

- 852 Skilled Nursing Visits
 - 51 Health Promotion Visits
- 14 Visits to Newborns and Mothers
- 23 Physical Therapy Visits
- 699 Homemaker/Home Health Aide Visits

187 children attended clinics held in Lisbon, and 96 adults attended the Adult Health Screening. Lisbon residents may attend any of the clinics held in our service area.
