School Report.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT KNOWLTON

To the School Boards and Citizens of Bartlett :

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen :—

I have the honor and privilege to submit to you my first annual report of the public schools of Bartlett for the year ending March 1, 1913, it being the second in the series of such reports.

I entered your field of service last August, and have endeavored to pick up the threads of administration of my predecessor, Mr. E. C. Witham, thus to carry on the work with as little break as possible. We feel that this has been fairly successfully accomplished through the valuable assistance rendered by members of the Committee.

For a school report to be of value to the citizens, it is necessary for it to contain some local school history that progress may be noted as well as the plans and aspirations of the future.

Rank cards have been made out for all the schools. These are so arranged as to take the place of promotion cards at the close of the school year. Duplicate reports are kept so that the loss of a card does not mean the loss of a child's record.

Along with these cards, we have introduced a partial set of the National School Record System used by all up-to-date school systems and approved by the U. S. Commissioner of Education. We did not use a full set of records as our system is not sufficiently large. This system gives on one card the record of the child from the time that he enters school till he has graduated from high school and what he does when he has left school. These records are made out in duplicate.

The State Course of Study has been followed as closely as possible in our schools. We are in hopes to follow it more

closely and extensively as time goes on.

BOOKS AND SUPPLIES.

The regular supplies have been purchased consisting of paper, pencils, crayon, ink, pens, etc. We have endeavored to have these used economically. There have been no changes in text books. Those purchased have been to supply classes using books already introduced. A few supplementary readers have been purchased and some dictionaries. More are needed.

We would recommend that a pupil entering the sixth grade be given a new geography, arithmetic and grammar and that he shall use the same books for as long a time as he shall remain in the elementary school. When he shall have completed the course satisfactorily, these same books are to become his property. If the child destroys these books before he has completed the elementary course he shall replace them. The average life of a school book is three years, much less in the hands of some children. We believe that this will not materially increase the cost of books and will keep the books in much better condition, and further, the child will have some books for reference when he has left school. There should be some regulations as to the use of books and supplies.

TOWN DISTRICT

The following teachers have been employed in town for the past year:—Ada I. Hackett, spring term, Glen; Elizabeth Hurd, winter term, Lower Bartlett; Ermina A. Gushee, winter term, Glen; Inez M. Jackson, fall and winter, Hill Town; Arthur G. Lord, spring, Hill Town, fall and winter, Goodrich Falls; Hazel M. McDonald, spring term, Goodrich Falls; Carl H. Oliver, fall, Lower Bartlett; Mabel Rounds, spring, Lower Bartlett, fall, Glen. Of these the following are Normal graduates:—Ada Hackett, Arthur G. Lord, Inez Jackson, and Miss Gushee has taken a partial course.

We are sorry to report so many changes in teachers. It is detrimental to the schools to make changes so often. The changes made have been unavoidable. Our ambition is to get trained teachers as far as is possible. It is said, "As

is the teacher so is the school." It is well to bear one thing in mind, however, namely, that a normal school diploma or a state teacher's certificate does not carry with it a guarantee of a good teacher. They must be tried in the furnace and found not wanting. Other things being equal a trained teacher is much preferred.

The teachers employed for the past year have done some good work but there is still more work to do and we want the best of workmen.

HIGH SCHOOL

The following pupils who have completed the course of study offered by our district are attending schools elsewhere:—Ray Cannell, Arnold H. Browning, Mildred Mead, Deborah Pitman, Mabel Blais and Ora Richardson. All but one are attending the North Conway high school. All pupils desiring to enter any high school in the state should notify the school board of the high school or academy that they have decided to attend if they expect the district to be responsible for the tuition.

REPAIRS

I understand that decided improvements were made in the school building at Goodrich Falls. Some slate boards have been put into other schools.

NEEDED REPAIRS

Hill Town school should have some modern adjustable desks. These cost a little more than some other patterns but when the comfort and health of the pupils are considered, the difference in cost would not be considered for a moment. When the old plank seats are removed, a suitable hard wood floor should be laid over the one now there. There should be a book closet made to keep the books in and a desk purchased for the teacher. More slate boards are needed for the Glen and Lower Bartlett schools.

BARTLETT SPECIAL

The following teachers have been employed for the past year:—E. Charlena Herbert, spring term; Hazel R. Pease, spring term; Annie A. Williams, spring, fall and winter terms;

Mr. S. W. March, spring term; George E. Hayes, fall and winter terms; Ruth Bickford, fall term; Ethel B. Reed, fall term; Blanche E. Foster, winter term; and Nina F. Bean, winter term.

All the teachers employed, except Miss Reed and Mr. March, are Normal graduates. If we expect to get and keep normal trained teachers in our schools, we shall have to pay better salaries.

The district is to be congratulated upon the quality of the work accomplished in these schools. The schools need the co-operation and support of the parents. We all should take an active interest in the education of our children.

We would like to see the course of study enriched by the introduction of music and drawing under the direction of a special teacher. We believe that arrangements can be made whereby this can be accomplished for a small sum. We feel that this would be a move in the right direction. The studies will help round out the lives of our children giving them two more means of expressing themselves. The training received from these subjects will make their lives broader and richer.

HIGH SCHOOL

The following pupils who have completed the work of our eighth grade are attending high school elsewhere:—Fred-erick Briggs, Henry E. Cole, Virginia V. Currier, Cash Ludgate, Christie Ludgate, Wilfred Mead, Holland Mersereau, Gordon J. Ryan, North Conway high school; Alice Stanton, Mattie Stanton, Lancaster; Helen Henry, Lincoln; Stephen Perkins, Earl Webb and Hazel Lawliss, Fryeburg.

All pupils desiring to enter any high school in the State should notify the School Board of the high school or academy that they have decided to attend if they expect the District to be responsible for the payment of the tuition.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion, I wish to take this opportunity to thank the teachers for their faithful work in their endeavor to carry out our suggestions and for their co-operation and support. In union there is strength.

I also wish to thank those parents who have taken an

active interest in our schools and who have labored with us for their betterment and success. We trust that all will unite on this one important question of the education of our boys and girls, so that our schools shall grow in thoroughness and efficiency.

We hope to see the coming year, less tardiness, better attendance, a closer study of pupils by parents and teachers as to physical hindrances to success and those hindrances removed just so far as is possible, full co-operation of parents, teachers and pupils, more trained teachers, fewer changes in teachers, better results in writing.

To you members of the School Board, I wish to extend my sincere thanks for your assistance, suggestions, support and hearty co-operation in my varied duties to the Bartlett Town and Special School Districts.
