TOWN OF LISBON TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New 1 a^{r} -shire qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lisbon Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the eleventh day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon; at which time polls shall open and not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects except 1 & 2 to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To see if the Town will vote by ballot on the question, "Shall the provisions of Chapter 287 of the Revised Laws relative to playing beano be adopted in this city or town?"

3. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.

5. To see if the Town will vote to expend a portion of funds received through Revenue Sharing (State and Local Assistance Act of 1972) in the amount of fourteen thousand one hundred ninetyeight dollars (\$14,198.00) plus interest of one thousand two hundred forty-three dollars and sixty-seven cents (\$1,243.67) for a total of fifteen thousand four hundred forty-one dollars and sixty-seven cents (\$15,441.67) for summer and winter Town Road Maintenance.

6. To see if the Town will vote to expend the balance of funds received through Revenue Sharing (State and Local Assistance Act of 1972) in the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) for Town sidewalk repairs in accordance with RSA 252:3.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriations for the same as set forth in the following budget:

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) from surplus funds to reduce the amount to be raised under Article 7.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds in accordance with New Hampshire law.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds through the State Disaster Coordinating Office and to expend the funds so received to repair the damage to Town Roads and/or bridges caused by any declared emergency and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums as may be necessary to defray the cost of repairing damage in anticipation of Federal Disaster Funds to be received through the State Disaster Coordinating Office.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) for insulating the Town Hall and three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) for repairing entrance roof and flashing on original roof, and for repairing the bottom panel of the Fire Department door and painting the Water Street side of the Town building, where required, said money to be taken out of surplus funds.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed eighteen thousand dollars (\$18,000.00) for the purpose of repairing the Bowles Road Bridge; consisting of repair work on existing cement abutments, removing present steel, sandblasting, painting and reinstalling with two (2) new thirty ton (30) beams in running area, and for installing concrete deck with iron side rails, said money to be taken out of surplus funds.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed two thousand two hundred dollars (\$2,200.00) for the purpose of purchasing and installing storm windows on the Library, said money to be taken out of surplus funds.

14. To see if the Town will vote to elect the Road Agent by Ballot. This vote to take effect at the annual Town Meeting in March 1981. (This article is by petition.)

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to act as the "Franchising authority" for the Town in franchising and regulating cable television systems in the Town with the authority and powers set forth in R.S.A. Chapter 53-C; and further, to ratify and confirm any prior actions of the Selectmen relative to cable television franchises.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for the White Mountain Center for the Arts in order to provide tickets to the Town through its Recreation Department for a special Sunday afternoon Children's Series.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for a comprehensive soils survey with reports and maps, money to be taken out of surplus funds.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000.00) for the purpose of developing a ground water supply and additional storage capacity with transmission lines for the Lisbon Water Department. Two hundred fifty-six thousand dollars (\$256,000.00) of the above sum to be in the form of a grant from the Farmers Home Administration, a division of the U.S. Government plus any other additional federal grants in aid that might be available to the Town. And further, to authorize the Selectmen to raise as the Town's share of the project an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) of said sum by the issuance of Serial Bonds or notes in said amount to bear interest in an amount not to exceed five percent (5%), under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act or other enabling authority, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds or notes as shall be in the best interests of the Town; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on a

short-term basis for the aforesaid purposes to meet expenses of the project until funds can be realized from the sale of said Serial Bonds or Notes and from the receipt of federal grants under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act or other enabling authority, and to authorize the Selectmen to take such actions as may be necessary relative to said shortterm borrowing as shall be in the best interest of the Town. All payments and expenses including interest will be reimbursed to the Town from the Lisbon Water Department through the application of user fees.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in R.S.A. 31:95-b.

20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

We hereby submit our annual report to the citizens of the Town of Lisbon:

During the year 1979 your Selectmen were again faced with a wide variety of problems. The roads from last year's flooding have been repaired and this year we are trying to catch up on that work lost due to flood repair. It will take another year or two to catch up on all the work.

The use of the Town Hall has been extensive this year with the Senior Citizens, Upstage Players and basketball. During November the hall was in use 18 days, 19 days in December and 14 days during January. This, of course, has added to the heat and electric bills. The Selectmen are happy that the townspeople are using the hall, but ask you to realize that it costs to heat and light it.

The Town building office areas and toilets have had the walls insulated. We hope that this will aid in keeping the hall warmer and result in the smaller use of oil.

Both the Sewerage System and the Landfill Operations have proceeded satisfactorily. The Selectmen have been commended on the cleanliness of the landfill operations.

The bridge over the Ammonoosuc at North Lisbon should be completed this summer. It is expected that bids will be out by the time this report is printed.

TRIBUTE — The Selectmen would like, especially, to pay tribute to Lillian Finley for the long and exemplary service she has provided the Town of Lisbon. For the past 26 years Lil has served as Town Treasurer, a position she has filled with honor to herself and service to the community. Lil was always ready to help the Selectmen in the financing problems of the Town. Again, to Lil Finley, our most heartfelt thanks and appreciation for a job well done.

THANKS —Special thanks from the Selectmen go to the Senior Citizens who have contributed much time and effort in the finishing of the stage and for their contribution of money to help in the insulating of the building.

Our thanks, also, go to Barbara Jesseman for making a map of the Town, listing all streets and lot numbers obtained from the work done when the tax maps were developed. This is a great addition to the Town. The maps are on display in the Planning Board Room.

Your Selectmen have gone over the proposed budget and feel that they have done their best in estimating what will be needed to operate the Town business during the year. There are several items in the warrant which you will need to consider before you vote at Town Meeting.

We want to thank you all for the cooperation received during the year.

LISBON PLANNING BOARD AND BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

Four subdivisions were approved by the Lisbon Planning Board. The Board of Adjustment granted two variances; a request for permission to remove loam was withdrawn at the hearing; and one special exception was granted to locate a mobile home in the Pearl Lake watershed after much debate and with assistance from the State Water Supply and Pollution Board, the U.S. Soils Conservation Commission, and the Lisbon Water Department.

The North Country Council is assisting the Planning Board in updating our comprehensive plan. The Board is surveying the town to determine what goals the citizens would like to reach by 1990. A Town Plan is a prerequisite for many types of state aid and can be successful only if it reflects the needs and wishes of the majority of the people.

Results of the Downtown Improvement Project were published and some progress has been made on those recommendations.

The new state excavation law is being implemented and enforced, as mandated by state law, by the Planning Board.

Regular meetings are the fourth Tuesday of each month except when held in conjunction with public hearings, which are advertised in the newspaper. All meetings are open to the public and all records are available for public inspection.

It gives me great pleasure in reporting, that for the second year in a row, the Town of Lisbon had a fatality free year on our highways. Also we did not have any motor vehicle accidents where there was serious bodily injury. Our accident rate was down to 62, which is the lowest year since 1975. This is a record that the members of the Police Department are proud of, because it shows that not only the citizens of Lisbon but other citizens using our highways are driving very defensively.

Last year we saw a increase in our juvenile case load. I would like to thank Judge Peter W. Smith of the Littleton District Court and Mr. Daniel Fowler of the New Hampshire Probation Department, for the many hours of conversation, advice, and the many hours of investigation, in helping these young people to become useful citizens of the future.

I would like to thank our dispatchers for all their help, patience, and the excellent job they have performed over the past year.

In the year 1979, we saw our overall court case load come down to 100. This is the lowest since the year 1973. I sincerely hope that this trend will continue.

This department has received far too many complaints in regard to speeders in the daytime, especially on School Street, and when children are playing after school. Contact is being made with these individuals, and they are receiving verbal warnings. I would like to remind these individuals that we do have a speeding ordinance in Town, and the Police Department will have no other recourse but to follow up the complaints with court action or a letter to the Department of Public Safety.

The members of the Lisbon Police Department join me in thanking the citizens of Lisbon for their continued help and understanding during the past year.

LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT - 1979

Your Fire Department activities for the year focused on training for new members, updating techniques and equipment, and continuing in a service capacity. Three men completed an 18 hour training course to become members; they are Robert Daniels, Bradley Presby, and George Stevens. Fourteen of our members are now trained in the operation of the Hurst Tool, commonly called the "Jaws of Life;" this apparatus is now housed in our station and available for use in any emergency in the North Country area. The department was called three times requesting the Hurst Tool but it was never put in operation.

Eighteen of our men attended the Forestry school held here in Lisbon in February, the school being conducted by Bob Stuart, of Bath. Eight members completed the training courses at the annual Twin State Mutual Aid Association school at Ox Bow School in Bradford in September.

The March flood and ice problems occupied the time and attention of the whole department for a couple of days moving both people and equipment.

The Twin State Mutual Aid system continues to function smoothly and to the mutual advantage of its members. In January an open house was conducted at the Grafton County dispatch center where the equipment and service available was displayed and explained.

Our parade equipment appeared at the Haverhill Fair, the State Fire Convention in Lancaster, and at the Littleton Labor Day Parade.

Fund-raising for money to be used in completing fire station renovations and purchasing tools and other equipment consisted of three dances, grass burning, and the help of generous interested citizens who contributed funds. One of our most important additions was a Lumber Jack made possible by one of these private donations for which we are very grateful.

The biggest single item occupying time, attention, and money was the ordering of the new fire truck authorized at the Town Meeting. Many hours of dedicated service resulted in the receipt of eight bids on the specs we published. The order was given to the low bidder, 3D Metals, Inc., Bonduel, Wisconsin. The order was submitted in June and the apparatus should be ready in April or May.

It is with a feeling of deep gratitude that I again mention the assistance rendered by our dispatching services, the Police Department and the department personnel who give unselfishly of their time.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST FIRE SERVICE

Prevention and control of forest fires is handled through a cooperative effort between town/city fire organizations and the State Forest Fire Service.

Since 1903, when the first forest fire laws were passed by our Legislature, the State Forester has appointed someone in each municipality as a Forest Fire Warden and charged him with the responsibility of forest fire prevention and control within his town/city. This person may ask the State Forester to appoint as many Deputy Forest Fire Wardens as may be necessary to efficiently carry out his charge.

The State Forester has divided the State into ten forest fire districts with a full time District Forest Fire Chief in each district. The State organization is charged with assisting the municipal forest fire organization in any way possible.

State personnel conduct fire training schools, assist with forest fire suppression, fire cause investigation, prosecution of fire law violators and forest fire prevention programs. Forest fire suppression equipment is purchased through State bulk purchasing ability and sold to local forest fire organizations at one-half cost. Excess military property is obtained and turned over to town/city fire departments at no cost to local departments for conversion into fire suppression units. This cooperative arrangement between State and municipality has resulted in one of the best forest fire records in the United States with less than one-half acre of woodland burned in each fire reported.

TOWN OF LISBON

To the Citizens of Grafton County:

In an effort to communicate more directly with the taxpaying citizens of Grafton County, we, the Grafton County Commissioners, are writing to you through your individual town or municipal reports.

Last year (1978-79) the total county tax raised was \$1,977,142.00. These monies were appropriated by the County Delegation and administered by the Commissioners. Some of the ways this money was spent was in maintenance of our courthouse, nursing home, county farm, sheriff's department, jail and house of correction, social welfare, etc.

The average number of patients in our nursing home is 140. The average daily census of the Jail/House of Correction is 25. We had a total of 349 inmates in the Jail and 114 inmates in the House of Correction during our fiscal year.

In addition to providing food for the nursing home complex and agricultural services for the community, the farm also continually shows a profit. In our fiscal year 1979 the farm profit was \$60,654, due in part to sales of pigs at \$5,500, cows at \$27,000, wood at \$1,800, hay at \$2,100, milk at \$135,444 and produce at \$48,129.

We have completed Phase II-Design of the sewage project and anticipate beginning construction under Phase III in the spring. The total overall cost of the project is approximately \$540,000, of which \$400,000 is federal grant, \$110,000 State share and \$30,000 County share.

We are making an effort to conserve energy, particularly in the courthouse building, and are taking a hard look at any modifications in this so called "modern" facility that will make it a less expensive consumer of fuel.

A trial dispatching service was instituted for 16 area fire departments and probably will be made a permanent function during the latter part of 1979. A yearly fee is charged for this service.

Grafton County employs 230 people of whom we are very proud. It is because of these people that Grafton County continues to operate efficiently and within budget.

There are many other concerns that we, the Commissioners, deal with. We invite the citizens of Grafton County to take part in any of our regular meetings held each Monday morning at the courthouse in North Haverhill.

North Country Home Health Agency provides services to people in their own homes who have health-related problems. Nursing visits are provided for the chronically ill, for care following hospitalization or for acute care in lieu of hospitalization. Physical Therapy and Speech Therapy are available to homebound patients. The Homemaker/Home Health Aides work with the nurses and therapists to assist with personal care, light housekeeping and meal preparation, and other health-related services aimed at keeping people independent in their own homes for as long as possible.

This year we added a program aimed at reducing child abuse through personal contact by Family Assistants with families which are not coping.

Our Public Health activities are aimed at prevention of disease, and include child immunization clinics, well-child conferences, handicapped children's clinics, adult health screenings and child dental screenings. Monthly well-child and immunization clinics are now held in both the Littleton and Haverhill areas, and three times a year in Lisbon and Lincoln. Health promotions for the assessment of problems and newborn visits to infants and mothers are also made. There is no charge for any of the clinics, health promotions or newborn visits.

North Country Home Health Agency serves 15 towns in a 1200 square mile area. Its main office is 60 High Street, Littleton, and there are satellite offices in Lincoln and Woodsville.

Services included to residents of Lisbon are: 718 Nursing Care visits; 9 Physical Therapy visits; 252 Home Health Aide hours; 227 Homemaker hours; 61 Health Promotions; and 20 Newborn visits. Residents may attend the clinics in any location.

TOWN OF LISBON from the North Country Council

In Lisbon, North Country Council provided assistance to the Town in carrying out recommendations contained in the Downtown Improvement Program, such as acquisition of open space. The Council also provided information to the Planning Board and Selectmen regarding improvements to the water system, gravel pit regulation, recycling and historic preservation.

This past year of 1979 saw a mixture of planning and action for the North Country Council, Inc. Major contributions were made in rural and economic development, local planning, and transportation.

In rural development, the Council assisted approximately twenty-five communities in taking positive steps on such concerns as housing, downtown revitalization, water supply, and solid waste. The council has helped communities obtain needed housing resources. Working with appropriate state and federal agencies, the Council assisted targeted communities by preparing applications and by providing information so decisions can be made. In economic development, the Council assisted two communities with steps toward the creation of parks which will provide a necessary place for additional jobs. Energy development activities have encouraged the development of indigenous resources such as wood and hydro power. NCC has also been active in helping local companies with loan applications and business counseling, and in assisting a targeted community with a revolving loan fund. Additional business development services will be provided during the coming year to encourage existing area and other in-state businesses to expand or locate so that more jobs can be provided in the North Country. An industrial brochure has been published which promotes the quality of life in the region and the resources available for small companies.

Local planning assistance, such as master planning, subdivision regulations, zoning and review of development proposals continues to be a major function of the Council. This activity will take on greater significance with the NH Supreme Court's emphasis on local master planning as a basis for local regulations.

Technical reports have been prepared on Mt. Washington Valley's Seasonal Population and on wetland evaluation and management. Brief and informative fact sheets on community investment strategies, land capability and wetlands are also available.

To advocate North Country transportation needs at the state and federal level, a Transportation Committee has been organized with representatives from different communities and transportation sectors.

The Council acts as a "regional spokesman" with membership on the Governor's Advisory Committee on Growth, the NH Environmental Law Clinic, and the State's Forestry Resources Committee. By sponsoring forums and conferences on growth in the forest industry, agricultural development, and regional land use, the Council has brought together people, ideas, and resources to generate appropriate solutions.

We believe that the Council has a program that can assist its rural communities in meeting the challenges and opportunities of the 1980's.
