Generative AI and Research Integrity Workshop

Explore the ethical implications of generative artificial intelligence on research at an in-person workshop Thursday, October 31, 12:40-2 p.m. in Dimond Library 421.

The rapid rise of generative artificial intelligence (AI) technologies is transforming the research landscape, offering unprecedented opportunities for innovation and efficiency. These advancements, however, also present challenges for research integrity. This workshop explores the ethical implications of integrating generative AI into the research process generally, as well as specifically in research involving human participants.

This workshop is designed for researchers at all career stages who are navigating the evolving role of generative AI in research and are committed to fostering a culture of integrity in their field. Participants will gain insights into the responsible use of generative AI tools, addressing issues such as data privacy and confidentiality, plagiarism and authorship. Attendees will learn

Did you know? CHIPS and Science Act: Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program

The [CHIPS and Science Act of 2022](#) requires that each federal research agency establish a policy requiring that covered individuals (including senior and key personnel) certify that they are not part of a “Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program” (MFTRP) in the proposal submission and annually thereafter. Pursuant to the CHIPS and Science Act, covered individuals who are a current party to a [Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program](#) are not eligible to serve as senior/key personnel on federal awards.
