You are hereby notified to meet at Woodrow Residence in said Windsor on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Art. 3. To hear reports of Auditor and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges.

Art 5. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways, and raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100 for White Pine Blister Rust.

Art. 7. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 8. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector deeds.

Art. 9. To see if the town will raise \$100 to restore Trust Funds and interest of \$32 used by town.
