STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Wolfeboro qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Brewster Memorial Hall in said Town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a town-clerk for the ensuing year, one selectman for three years, one selectman for one year, two Auditors, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Prosecuting Liquor Agent and Constable for the ensuing year, one Library Trustee and Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.

ARTICLE 2. To bring in your ballots upon the question as to whether the amendment proposed by the convention to revise the Constitution shall be approved.

ARTICLE 3. To elect one or more, not exceeding three, highway agents, or instruct the Selectmen to appoint one expert highway agent.

ARTICLE 4. To choose all other necessary Town officers and agents.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed at the January session of the General Court 1905.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate twenty-five hundred dollars for the repairs of Highways and Bridges in addition to that required by law.

ARTICLE 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the redemption of Town Bonds.

ARTICLE 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and pay each Fireman legally returned for the year 1923 in addition to that required by law.

ARTICLE 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Public Library in addition to that required by law.

ARTICLE 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay Harry Harriman Post No. 18, to defray expenses of Memorial Day, May 30th, 1923.

ARTICLE 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Expenses for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money necessary to pay Town expenses in anticipation of Taxes for 1923.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate three hundred and fifty (\$350) dollars for the maintenance of the East Side Trunk line, the State to appropriate seven hundred (\$700) dollars.

ARTICLE 14. To see what sum of money the

Town will vote to raise and appropriate to aid in the suppression of the Gypsy moth.

ARTICLE 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to be used in connection with the State or Federal money for the suppression of the White Pine Blister Rust.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate two thousand dollars, (\$2000), the State contributing a like sum to re-surface South Main Street.

ARTICLE 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to aid and assist the Huggins Hospital.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of forty-five hundred dollars to secure a like sum from the State for the Maintenance of State Aid Roads in said Town.

ARTICLE 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the free Public Band Concerts for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to put the street leading from South Main Street to the Railroad Station on the Easterly side of the bank building in condition for dancing for the accomodation of the public.

ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a Motor Fire Chemical, and to raise and appropriate money for the same, authorizing the commissioners to purchase the same.

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to establish the salary system for its Selectmen, Town

Clerk, Treasurer, Tax Collector and Water Superintendent, and fix the same, which shall include all necessary expenses.

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to buy that piece of land known as Harmony Grove with the growth thereon and raise and appropriate money for the same.

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to build a suitable public toilet and raise and appropriate money for the same.

ARTICLE 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

To the Board of Trustees of the Wolfeboro Town Library,

Gentlemen:

The eighteenth annual report of the Libraian is herewith presented.

No special feature has developed in our work during the past year. In the more than thirty years of its existance, the library has been closely allied with the educational interests of the town, and its value could never be fully realized unless its doors should be permanently closed.

To show something of its growth, let me give the figures for the average monthly circulation for each fifth year.

When one considers in addition to the books given out the amount of work done in the library room, our task is by no means an easy one.

The circulation for the past year has been 20,336 books, of these classes: fiction, 10,955; non-fiction, 3,251; children's books, 6,130. This is a gain of 1,406 over the preceeding year. 56 new books have been purchased for the Town library.

The larger space given to the children has proved a satisfactory arrangement, although not as yet fully completed. A special assistant is now employed for this room a part of the time, and we are trying to teach the children to use the library for themselves. During the past year, this branch of our work has increased one-third.

We find that more people would use the library were it not for the trouble of borrowing and returning the books. To those who live within a walking distance, this should be a pleasant diversion. For those outside the village precinct some arrangement should be made. In some towns a book wagon goes around at stated intervals distributing and gathering books. The same thing might be carried out here through the rural delivery mail carriers. The people at East Wolfeboro hope in the spring to establish a branch library in connection with their community house.

The patronage of the summer visitors is a delightful feature of our work, some coming a distance of ten miles. These people speak most appreciatingly of the fact that our library is open to all free of charge.
