

### Town of Bedford New Hampshire 1996 Annual Report

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### <u>LIBRARY</u> Director: Frances M. Wiggin

On June 23, 1996, over 1000 people attended the dedication of the new Public Library. The \$2.7 million building was completed on time and within budget, a testament to the hard work and determination of everyone involved with the project. The new library blends traditional New England architecture outside with modern technology inside to create a public information center, rooted in tradition, yet designed and equipped for the twenty-first century.

The patience, perseverance and affability of patrons and staff alike facilitated the transition from the old fire station to the new Library. The staff contributed many free hours to ensure that the move and opening would be smooth and accurate.

By all measures, the citizens of Bedford appear to love their new library, and are using it more and more! Since the new library opened, circulation has soared by 33%. This huge increase in circulation statistics represents just the tip of the iceberg. The very way patrons use the library has changed appreciably. The new library is a people place - the core of a vibrant, growing town. Come, find out what's happening in your new library!

Entering the foyer, the colorful event notices on the community bulletin board attest to the vitality of the community. In the spacious lobby, two friends who just happened to meet, chat before checking out their books. A new resident is getting the scoop on Bedford organizations and services at the public information desk. Friendly volunteers help newcomers and old-timers alike navigate the library and the community. Behind the information desk is an official town bulletin board where public notices, minutes, and election results for the Town of Bedford are posted. At the circulation desk, another library volunteer assists with checkouts. An entrepreneur, who has just opened a new business in town, is completing an application for a library card. Anyone who lives or works in Bedford is eligible for a free library card. Over 1000 new cards have been issued since the new library opened in June, more than double the usual!

Bedford's new library received national attention at the annual American Library Association meeting in July. Over 16 groups of library officials from as far away as Pennsylvania have come to see the new facility. The Library Director is about to usher a group of visitors into the technical services, the electronic nerve center of the library where card catalogs and library paste have been upstaged by PC's, disc drives and servers. Amidst the high tech, more mundane tasks abound. Here one volunteer repairs worn or damaged books, while another prepares overdue fine notices. Over 55 volunteers provide critical support and service throughout the library. Despite the hefty increases in space, services and utilization, there has been no change in staffing.

In the center of the library, the reference desk serves as a hub of information. Here experienced professionals assist patrons to research information from a wide variety of print and electronic sources. Several patrons are utilizing the public computer workstations. A recent graduate is busily polishing her resume at the word processing workstation. A business consultant is using Corporate Affiliations on CD-ROM. Clustered around the public access Internet workstation, a volunteer is giving a retired couple an introductory lesson in Internet access and use. The library offers Internet access to persons 14 years of age and older. People who would like to learn how to use the Internet may sign up for a morning, afternoon or early evening, hour-long session. So far over 50 patrons have availed themselves of these "Internet Introductions."

Nearby, a sight impaired patron is using the Optelec machine to magnify and read a letter. Opposite this people are looking up titles at one of the seven public computer terminals which provide an instant on-line card catalog for the entire collection, not only of the Bedford Library (which boasts over 54,000 works of fiction and non-fiction on a variety of media from print to audio to video), but of eleven libraries in the greater Manchester area. One patron has discovered that the book he wants is currently checked New software allows him to enter a out. reserve on the title. When the book is returned, he will be notified, and the book held for him.

Away from the center, the library is hushed, despite the fact that nearly a dozen people are spread out at the various work tables and study carrels. Some are adults doing research for business or a hobby. Others are students studying and writing papers. One has a laptop computer with her and is taking advantage of one of the "wet" carrels to finish a business report. Several are enjoying the serenity and comfort of the reading nooks at each end of the room to read one of a dozen daily and weekly newspapers. In the quiet study room, a tutor is helping a youngster master a new concept.

Clearly the new library is much more than a place to borrow books. It is <u>the</u> information center of Bedford. But, the new library is even more. It is the community center for Bedford; a place for citizens to come together, where lives touch other lives.

Nowhere is this more evident than on the lower level. In the DeNicola Gallery several senior citizens are engaged in a leisurely discussion over a cup of steaming coffee and home-baked muffins at the coffee shop. Run by the Friends of the Bedford Library, the coffee shop is open weekdays from 9 AM to 3 PM. The DeNicola Gallery displays the artwork of local guest artists. The inaugural exhibition featured photographer Kazys (Charlie) Daugela. Subsequent exhibitions featured the calligraphy of Beverly Rattigan, paintings by Linda Obremski, and watercolors by Deborah Spencer.

The seniors look up and smile as several children skip through on their way to storytime in the Children's Library. The professional staff presents nearly 40 programs each month including preschool storytimes, a story and play activity where school age youngsters explore folk tales, and new this fall "Mother Goose Time" for 12 to 24month olds and their parents. Parents of older children generally take advantage of storytime to select books, read to younger siblings, or visit with other parents in the coffee shop. Everyone loves the delightful new story castle.

Attendance at children's programs has soared and nearly all programs have waiting lists. In November, 611 youngsters attended scheduled programs, a 33% increase over last year. In addition, the children's librarians host visits from local preschools and scout groups, and collaborate with Bedford's public schools. Each September all first graders from Peter Woodbury School tour the library and each student is issued his or her very own library card. Sixth graders from McKelvie Middle School toured the library in November as part of their social studies unit. And in December, "patchwork" book reports from a third grade class at Memorial School enlivened the walls in the Children's Library.

During the summer, the library hosted its most successful summer reading program ever! "Reading.....The Best Game Around" set a new record with 862 children reading 15,253 books during the program. This more than doubled the numbers from the previous summer and set a state record. Contributions from Bedford organizations and businesses and 52 volunteers who contributed 394 service hours helped to make the program a success. Yes, there's a lot of reading going on in the Children's Library. Helping the regular staff keep pace, a Junior Librarian is checking in some of the 160 children's books that are returned on a typical day. New this year, Junior Librarians is a community service program for teenagers who volunteer in the Children's Library on a regular basis during school vacations or after school.

Across from the children's room, a Girl Scout leader is setting up an activity for her troop in one of the two public meeting rooms on the lower level. Bedford Girl Scout Troop 804 is just one of many local organizations which meet regularly in the new library.

For more than 10 years, lack of space prohibited the library from offering book discussion groups and other programs for adults. Now, the meeting rooms make it possible to again offer these opportunities to the community. The first such program, made possible by a grant from the NH Humanities Council, featured Zuni artist, Alex Seowtewa, who presented a slide lecture on Zuni culture, mythology and legends. The Bedford Public Library was fortunate to be selected by the NH State Library as one of the sites for the first Book Bag Program from the new MacDowell Colony Writer's Series. In October the library hosted a series of four book discussions entitled "Fiction and the Historical Moment". Led by Professor Don Sieker from NH College, and Linda Morley, a folklorist and writer, the series was thought provoking and well attended. The series was funded by the NH Humanities Council.

The Trustees wish to thank the many individuals, organizations and businesses who have made donations to library programs or the Bedford Library Foundation in the past year. In particular, we gratefully acknowledge the many gifts received in memory of long-time library volunteer, Phil Osberg. The Bedford Public Library is very fortunate to have a talented and professional director and staff, a cadre of devoted volunteers, and a supportive Town Council. Most importantly, it is fortunate to serve a community which recognizes the value of an outstanding, free, public library.

1996 was another year of growth in Bedford. We are blessed with the ability to maintain a relatively low tax rate, which attracts more development, which if not controlled could rapidly increase those taxes. We are fortunate to have a good group of volunteers on our land use boards which constantly oversee the combined effect of all of these issues. While not everyone will be happy with all the results, it is the combined effort and thought to the entire effect which keeps Bedford's taxes down and maintains the lovely atmosphere of the Town.

The new Library was opened and is indeed a treasure of which all residents can be proud. Its contribution to the community was rapidly discovered when 900 people asked for library cards in the first week of operation. The purpose of a library is knowledge, and the new Library promotes the desire for knowledge. All of the volunteers and staff who worked so hard to get this state-of-theart facility completed within the approved budget deserve a round of applause.

The Town Council's road improvement plan was proven a success this year when a record terrible winter of snow and constant freezing and thawing produced fewer frost heaves than years with far milder weather. While those people living or traveling on roads which may not have seen the benefits of the drainage before reconstruction program had problems, the overall damage was down from years with far milder weather.

The Second Chance shop started as an experiment and proved to be so popular they needed a building to house the enterprise, which was built with monies earned and volunteer efforts. The amount of taxes saved from this endeavor is substantial and shopping there is not only economical, but fun.

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### TOWN OF BEDFORD - BUDGETARY TOWN MEETING MARCH 5, 1996 - MCKELVIE SCHOOL

The annual Budgetary Town Meeting was held on Tuesday, March 5, 1996. Moderator Eugene Van Loan, III opened the meeting at 7:10 PM and held a moment of silent prayer in memory of Earl Legacy. The Moderator then led the Pledge of Allegiance following which he introduced those seated on the stage. Present were Councilors William Bradlee, Richard Como, David Danielson, Paul Goldberg, Edward Moran, Thomas Riley and Richard Stonner; Artherline Robersen, Town Manager; Edith Schmidtchen, Town Clerk; Anthony Plante, Finance Director; and Martha Gaudes, Town Council Clerk.

Henry Cote, Commander of the Richard K. Harvell VFW Post 8401 gave commendations to several town employees including Lt. Thomas Burke, Police Dept.; John Gendron, Public Works Dept.; Capt. Donald Folsom (ret.), Fire Dept.; Fire Chief Ralph Wiggin (ret.); and Asst. Fire Chief Earl Isham (ret.)

There were approximately 85 people in the audience. Moderator Van Loan reviewed the rules of procedure governing the meeting. He indicated there is only one article to be acted on at this meeting.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.

Mr. Moran moved to approve \$8,330,431; motion seconded.

Mr. Moran gave an overview of the budget.

The Moderator then proceeded through each category in the budget.

Function 400: Boards & Commissions - \$69,670 Function 410: Agencies & Activities - \$119,497 Function 420: Administration - \$1,101,975 Function 430: Police - \$1,590,111 Function 440: Fire - \$1,000,917 Function 450: Public Works - \$2,581,525

Gary Hoffman, 64 Cider Mill Road, asked the adequacy of the road budget. He has lived here since 1988, and the roads he drives are abysmal. He would like to know if anyone really feels the highway maintenance budget is adequate. Mr. Moran would concur that this has not been adequate. but the Council is making a dramatic increase in the budget and the number of roads that are going to be improved. Mr. Riley said since 1992 the road budget has been increased 248% while the total budget has only increased 140%. He said the Council has increased the footage of roads repaired every year. This year the Council is committed to improving 52,700 linear feet of road.

Chris Schuetz said it is not a matter of just repaving. He feels some of the road beds were not installed properly. Mr. Stonner gave an example of West Drive which was rebuilt several times in the last 20 years. It was last rebuilt 5 years ago, and it looks today just like it did when it was rebuilt.

Michael Scanlon, 15 Caron Road, asked how they decide which roads are going to be rebuilt and when you are going to do it. He commended the Council for adding more money to the budget for roads but wonders if it is enough. Mr. Stonner said the \$125,000 added this year is in addition to what was added last year. He said the Council is trying to make Bedford affordable for everyone to live here. Mr. Riley discussed how the roads are classified. Mr. Scanlon said there is a lot of traffic on Liberty Hill Road and parts of it are caving in. He is con-

cerned with the amount of traffic and the condition of the road. Mrs. Robersen said the actual increase in road maintainence this year is \$200,000. The roads are determined by a computer program. Ed Kelly, Director of Public Works explained how the program works classifying the roads. He said they try to distribute it evenly throughout the Town.

Richard Dawley, 19 Kalmia Way, asked where Ministerial Road is on the list because it is falling apart. He asked if there is any estimate of the total dollars it would take to fix everything that is a problem. Mr. Kelly said if he could fix every road to current standards it would be 16 million dollars.

William Wickham, 6 Golden Drive, said he is not willing to sign up for 16 million dollars in road improvements. He said the Council is working on it, are doing a good job, and he appreciates that we have good road standards.

Sue Peyron, 287 Liberty Hill Road, appreciates that the Town is doing everything they can with the taxes. She travels Liberty Hill Road every day and has had extensive damage to her car. She wants to know if they can do a little more in the immediate future to take care of the roughest areas. She said some spots are extremely danger-Mrs. Robersen said there are some ous. places on Liberty Hill Road which have been cold patched, but not much can be done until the weather improves. Mrs. Robersen said it will take a year just to do the engineering on Liberty Hill Road because there are some major drainage problems and some ledge. The south end of Liberty Hill Road will be improved by a developer. A large piece of Joppa Hill Road from North Amherst Road to Route 101 will be done this summer, also by a developer.

Richard Mandeville, Hearthside Circle, asked if the rate of deterioration is being matched by the efforts to repair them. He asked at what point will we be caught up so we won't have to do these catastrophic jobs. Mr. Riley said roads last 20-25 years, and the goal is to get every road on a cycle. Mr. Goldberg said it is an on-going process. We have developers coming in certain areas, and they also have to repair roads. The Town is doing preventative maintenance. He thinks in 3-5 years we will see a dramatic change in the roads.

Richard Dawley, 19 Kalmia Way, asked how are we going to catch up on this cycle. Mrs. Robersen said we can't budget for the weather. This is the worst winter we could have had. We do not know how the roads will end up after it all settles. Michael Scanlon said he doesn't want the taxes to go up. He said the Council has done a tremendous job keeping the taxes low. The question is how long is it going to take. We have let the roads deteriorate. He does not want to travel the roads and have cars fall apart. He asked if there is enough in the budget to catch up. Mr. Stonner said he doesn't think we will ever be able to keep up with the roads. This is a fact of life in the northeast. The answer you want to hear does not exist. Bedford has 167 miles of paved roads.

### **TOWN OF BEDFORD 1997 WARRANT**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bedford in the County of Hillsborough in the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at McKelvie School in said Town on Tuesday, March 11, 1997 at 7 o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following Articles numbers 1 and 2. Polls are to close no later than 7:00 PM. Action on the Town Budget Article 3 and 4 will be held on Tuesday, March 4, 1997 at 7:00 PM at McKelvie School.

**ARTICLE 1.** To elect necessary Town Officers for the ensuing three years.

**ARTICLE 2.** To see how the Town will vote on the following zoning amendments.

(Zoning ordinances in their entirety are available for viewing at the Town Offices, 24 N. Amherst Road during regular office hours.)

### ZONING AMENDMENTS PROPOSED BY THE PLANNING BOARD:

<u>AMENDMENT NO. 1</u> To amend Article 45-2, DEFINITIONS, as follows:

By adding the following definition: Dwelling, Accessory Attached Apartment - An accessory dwelling unit, consisting of not more than 650 square feet, constructed within or attached to a single detached residence. Accessory attached apartments may be granted by a Special Exception from the Zoning Board of Adjustment and must meet all of the criteria listed in Section 45-4-2 (c) (2).

[This is a housekeeping measure. Accessory apartments were adopted by the voters in 1993; however, no definition was added in the Definitions section of the Ordinance.]

<u>AMENDMENT NO. 2</u> To amend Article 45-2, DEFINITIONS, by adding the following: Wireless Telecommunications Facilities - Any structure, device, tower, antenna, or equipment used to promote or facilitate wireless telecommunications. Wireless communications facilities are limited to the following: facilities used to send and receive signals for cellular telephones and pagers, wide area specialized mobile radio (SMR), digital devices and facilities known as personal communication services (PCS), radio broadcast antennas, amateur (HAMM) radio antennas, direct broadcast satellite (DBS) dishes, and television antennas.

AMENDMENT NO. 3 To amend Article 45-4, USE AND DIMENSIONAL REGULATIONS, Section 45-4-2 (a) Uses Permitted by Right, Section 45-4-3 Dimensional Regulations, and Appendix 45A: Table of Uses as follows: Wireless telecommunications facilities that are less than 6 feet in height -- mounted at ground level or mounted on a building -- and less than 200 square feet in area (such as residential satellite dishes and TV antennas) shall be permitted by right in all zoning districts, subject to the existing building setback requirements of each zoning district, and no building permit shall be necessary for erection of such a facility.

[This amendment is intended to allow homeowners and businesses to install small satellite dishes or TV antennas on their property without a building permit. Satellite dishes or TV antennas over 6 feet in height require a building permit. This does not negate private covenants.]

AMENDMENT NO. 4 To amend Article 45-4, USE AND DIMENSIONAL REGULATIONS, Section 45-4-2 (c), Uses Permitted by Special Exception, Section 45-4-3 Dimensional Regulations, and Appendix 45A: Table of Uses, as follows: by adding the following:

(4) Wireless Telecommunications Facilities - Wireless telecommunications facilities for commercial carriers exceeding 6 feet in height and 200 square feet in area may be permitted by Special Exception of the Zoning Board of Adjustment in every zoning district in the Town of Bedford, subject to existing standards set forth in Section 45-14-4(c) of the Bedford Zoning Ordinance, and if the following provisions are met:

### 1997 Zoning Amendments - Page 2.

a. Height - The height of any such wireless telecommunications facility must be less than 200 feet above the average existing ground level adjoining the structure, due to the presence of airport flight paths over the Town of Bedford. A favorable written recommendation from the Manchester Airport must be received by the Zoning Board of Adjustment if the proposed structure would be located within a 5-mile radius of this airport. Any request for a wireless telecommunications facility that exceeds 200 feet in height must obtain a variance from the Zoning Board of Adjustment, a favorable written recommendation from the Manchester Airport, and file a "Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration" with the Federal Aviation Administration.

b. Location - Each commercial carrier application for a new wireless telecommunications facility shall present the following to the Zoning Board of Adjustment:

1) A master plan of the company's ultimate transmission proposal for the Town of Bedford, including the number of facilities that will be needed to provide uninterrupted service within Bedford and general locations for future facilities;

2) A "view shed analysis," including photographs of a test balloon moored at the site indicating the visibility of the proposed structure from all abutting streets and other key locations as determined by the Zoning Administrator.

3) An "aesthetic impact mitigation proposal" which should include existing and proposed landscaping, siting considerations relative to surrounding topography, color camouflage, disguise mechanisms (such as disguising a monopole as a tall pine tree), or other mitigation techniques;

4) A location plan of other existing commercial wireless telecommunications towers or antennas within a 3-mile radius of the proposed site for a new facility, with complete documentation (including financial information) to justify why the proposed facility cannot utilize an existing antenna or tower within a 3-mile radius.

c. Co-location - Sharing of existing facilities is encouraged by the Town of Bedford, and no Special **Exception or Non-Residential Site Plan Review will** be required if more than one company chooses to utilize a single facility (a building permit will still be required). Each commericial carrier application for a new wireless telecommunications facility shall submit a written document to the Zoning Board of Adjustment specifying that the carrier agrees to design and construct the new facility to accommodate the equipment of at least 3 carriers, and that the applicant agrees to provide for shared use of the facility to maximum structural capacity at industry standard lease rates. The applicant shall also submit a "Shared Use Evaluation Form" which provides notice to all commerical carriers in the region that a new facility is to be erected and that an opportunity for co-location exists.

d. Abandonment of Facility - Each commercial carrier who receives approval for a new wireless telecommunications facility shall post financial surety (bond, letter of credit, or cash escrow account) to guarantee that the facility will be dismantled and removedwithin 90 days of notice from the Town - when it is no longer being used (after 1 year of non-use) for wireless telecommunications.

e. Other Permits - Each new wireless telecommunication facility that is in excess of 6 feet in height and/or exceeds 200 square feet in area shall be subject to Non-Residential Site Plan Review by the Bedford Planning Board and shall require issuance of a building permit from the Bedford Building Inspector (this regulation is intended to exclude small residential satellite dishes from the review process).

f. Signage - No signage of any type shall be permitted on wireless telecommunications facilities, including logos, banners, flags, or combinations of paint colors associated with corporate identification.

AMENDMENT NO. 5 To amend Article 45-5, WETLANDS, Section 45-5-2, Wetlands Defined, by deleting all references to "poorly-drained and very poorly-drained soils" parts (a), (b), and (c), and inserting the following: Methods for identifying and mapping wetlands shall utilize the publications <u>Corps</u> of Engineers Wetlands Delineation Manual 1987 and Regional Field Indicators for Identifying Hydric Soils in New England, 1995. Either a certified soils scien1997 Zoning Amendments - Page 3

tist or a professional wetland scientist shall perform wetlands delineation.

[This is a housekeeping measure. This amendment removes references to poorly-drained soils and the Hillsborough County Soil Survey, and instead adopts the definition and delineation method used by Federal and State of NH agencies.]

AMENDMENT NO. 6 To amend Article 45-5, WETLANDS, Sections 45-5-4, 45-5-5, and 45-5-6, by replacing all references to "poorly-drained soils" with "Hydric B soils" and to replace all references to "very poorly-drained soils" with "Hydric A soils".

[This is a housekeeping measure to ensure conformance with the changes in the definition of "wetlands" as described in Amendment No. 3.]

AMENDMENT NO. 7 To amend Article 45-9, U.S. ROUTE 3 PERFORMANCE ZONE, Section 45-9-8 (e) (4) Side and Rear Landscape Strips, as follows:

**b.** Location - Amend the last sentence in the first paragraph to read, However, in no case shall the required width of any side or rear landscape strip be less than ten feet (10').

Delete the second paragraph in its entirety.

d. Incentive Bonuses - Replace the existing paragraph with, "Healthy woodland provides for a dense landscape screen more effectively than new plants. Healthy existing woodland may be retained in order to fulfill planting requirements within Side and Rear Landscape Strips. The minimum width of woodland retained for the purpose of fulfilling Side and Rear Landscape Strip requirements shall be equal to the maximum proposed building height. However, in no case shall the required width of retained woodland be less than thirty feet (30').

AMENDMENT NO. 8 To amend Article 45-9, U.S. ROUTE 3 PERFORMANCE ZONE, Section 45-9-6 Permitted Uses, by deleting (p). Multiple Residential Dwellings, and footnote (2). Also, to amend Appendix 45A: Table of Uses by deleting Multiple Dwellings as a permitted use in the Performance Zone.

[The Planning Board has determined that a satisfactory balance of multiple unit housing has been reached in the PZ zone, and they are recommending that the voters now eliminate this use. Elderly housing will be permitted.]

AMENDMENT NO. 9 To amend Article 45-10, OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS, Section 45-10-2 (8) by adding the word "banks" to the category including retail store or shopping center.

[This amendment classifies banks as a retail use and requires banks to provide 1 parking space for each 250 square feet of gross floor area.]

AMENDMENT NO. 10 To amend Article 45-11, SIGNS, by deleting all of Section 45-11-3, Political Signs, except the following sentences to be retained:No sign shall be larger than twelve (12) square feet. No sign shall be posted on publicly owned land.

[Due to a 1994 U.S. Supreme Court case, <u>Ladue v.</u> <u>Gilleo</u>, the ability to regulate political signs is severely diminished.]

AMENDMENT NO. 11 To amend Article 45-13, ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT, Section 45-13-2 Building Permit Procedure, (b) Prerequisite Approvals, by adding the following: A building permit for a non-residential structure or building which is less than 800 square feet and is not intended for habitation, may be issued by joint approval of the Building Inspector and the Zoning Administrator, and shall not require a Planning Board Non-Residential Site Plan Review.

[This amendment is intended to streamline the permitting process for accessory uses such as sheds.]

<u>AMENDMENT NO. 12</u> To amend Appendix 45A: Table of Uses, Gasoline Stations, Footnote (12), by deleting the footnote in its entirety and substituting the following:

### 1997 Zoning Amendments - Page 4

(12) Gasoline service stations, with or without accessory service bays for repairs to automobiles, are permitted, but shall not include body or fender repair, painting, or used car sales or storage. A gasoline service station is not permitted to be located within two (2) miles of an existing station. Parcels of land used for gasoline service stations may also contain a convenience food store.

[This amendment is intended to: a) eliminate the requirement for service bays at gas stations; and b) allow convenience stores at gas stations.]

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1.5 million plus interest for the purpose of costs related to the final closure of the Chubbuck Road Landfill. Such sum to be partially funded by capital reserves and a State grant, and to authorize the Town Council to enter into financing under the State of New Hampshire revolving loan fund, and to take such other action as may be necessary to effect the financing as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Bedford, and pass any vote relating thereto.

**ARTICLE 4.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.




### SUPERVISORS OF THE CHECKLIST

As of November 14, 1996 the voting list recorded 2450 Democrats, 5781 Republicans, 2342 Independents, and 46 Libertarians for a total of 10,619 registered voters.

The Supervisors held eight sessions for registration, correction and/or party change; four all-day voting sessions (Presidential Primary, Budgetary Town Meeting; State Primary, and State General Election) and a school budgetary session for a total of 13 sessions.

Raising Efforts for New Library

### SOUTHERN NH PLANNING COMM. Moni Sharma, Director

The Planning Commission has a range of services available to help dues-paying members deal with many issues. Technical assistance is provided by professionals whose expertise is, when necessary, supplemented by consultants selected for specialized skills or services. Each year, with the approval of your representatives, the Commission staff designs and earries out programs of areawide significance that are mandated under State and federal laws or regulations, as well as local or site-specific projects which pertain exclusively to your community.

Technical assistance is provided at the request of your Planning Director, Town Manager, and department heads. The Commission conducts planning studies and carries out projects of common interest and benefit to all members, keeps your officials apprised of changes in planning and land use regulations, and offers training for Planning and Zoning Board members.

Services performed for Bedford during the past year include: 1) Co-sponsored the Municipal Law Lecture series which were attended by Bedford officials; 2) Conducted traffic counts at several locations in the Town; 3) The Regional Transportation Plan was updated, and the Transportation Improvement Program FY '97-'99 was prepared; 4) At the request of the Police Department, a short-term and low-cost solution was offered for alleviating a sight distance and accident problem at the intersection of Meetinghouse Road and Liberty Hill Road; 5) The Town was furnished with the "Suggested Schedule" for the March 1997 Annual Town Meeting; 6) Provided a video entitled "Zoning and the ZBA".

Bedford's representatives to the Commission are: Eugene Van Loan, Jr., Edward P. Moran, Jr. and David J. Danielson (Executive Committee Member).

### HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION D. Laurence Gott, Chairman

In 1996 the HDC conducted 23 hearings approving all but one application. The one not approved was withdrawn before the Commission voted. The hearings breakdown was: 8 commercial, 11 residential, 3 municipal and 1 new home.

The commission members were very pleased with the March vote retaining the Route 101 corridor within the Historic District. With the new sign regulations now in effect, we feel that the Commission and the commercial owners will be better able to work together in a more constructive way in the future.

The changes were an attempt to clarify some ambiguities in the regulations. Past Chair, Marilyn Otterson, is to be congratulated for her efforts in updating the regulations.

In the past few months, we have attempted to better inform the public about the Historic District Commission. This hopefully will increase the public interest in the Town's history as we prepare for our 250th birthday in the year 2000.

We were sorry to lose Bob Dewey as a member, but were happy to welcome Jon Levenstein to the Commission in 1996.

For those interested, the Commission meets the first Tuesday of the month at 7:30 PM in the Town Office Building. We are always happy to hear any input from the public.

Growth has continued for 1996 with the total number of parcels increasing 111 from 6454 to 6565. The town experienced a net valuation increase in the amount of \$35,856,720 for a total of \$1,315,999,904 after exemptions and tax credits. The following is a listing of property by class:

For example, both the elderly exemption and the Tax Deferral for Elderly and Disabled carry with it age, asset and income limitations and/or a verifiable financial inability to pay.

The Assessor's Office is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Within the lobby there is public access to individual parcels by owner name, map/lot number and street address. Tax maps are also available for viewing. Detailed information is available by viewing individual property record cards and copies are available for a nominal fee. ### <u>RECREATION COMMISSION</u> <u>& DEPARTMENT</u> Scot Pollock, Chair Brian Ross, Recreation Director

1996 was another exciting and successful year for the Recreation Department; thanks to our many supporters, sponsors and participants. A highlight of the year was the broadcasting of The Phil Donahue Show from the Town Hall on February 9th. Within 24 hours the Town Hall was transformed into a television studio for the taping of two shows about the Presidential election. This was Phil Donahue's last remote broadcast before his retirement.

Construction of the Earl Legacy Park began in June with work on the soccer and softball fields. Serious ledge was encountered and with assistance from Maine Drilling and Blasting, on behalf of Bedford Little League, the blasting was completed at a major savings to the town. Our contractors, JGE and Jenkins Construction have been very cooperative in helping us make the project a success. The soccer and softball field will be completed next Spring. Three miles of cross country ski trails have been completed and are ready to use during the 96/97 winter season. Car Components Technology in Bedford has committed to donate \$29,000 over the next two years towards the project (more donations from corporations and Bedford organizations are needed). The land for the skateboard park has been cleared and work will continue in Spring with hopes to open in the summer.

The first mile of Bedford's Heritage Trail was completed with construction of two bridges this past Spring. 80% of the money for the bridges came through a Federal Grant in the Transportation Enhancement Program. Plans are underway to extend our Heritage Trail to the North and South making it a four mile trail. On June 6th the Trail Committee held its second business luncheon cookout on the trail for employees who work in the Route 3 area. It was a great success with over 150 employees participating.

The Family Night series was started in February.

Two events were held in 1996 with the format of a pizza dinner followed by family entertainment. The purpose of Family Night series is to provide an opportunity for families to spend some quality time together with some positive, family fun entertainment. The program is sponsored by the Recreation Department, Bedford Drug Free Program, SAAD, Bedford Police Department and Dare Program and various Bedford businesses. More Family Nights are planned for 1997.

The '96 Summer season was again a very busy one. The pool had a daily average of 136 and a total of 768 children in swim lessons. Total revenue for the pool was \$27,000. The Passaconnaway Summer Camp program had 95 campers per week for an 8 week season. It was another great camping season thanks to our staff and campers and the Bedford School District.

Overall, 1996 was a banner year packed with programs and special events for the entire community. **Participate in Recreation - The Benefits are Endless!!!**

### Bedford Police Department Chief: David C. Bailey

As the town continues to grow, so does the activity of the Police Department. Through December, calls for service, were ahead of last year. Although, total number of accidents were down and we increased enforcement of motor vehicle laws by stopping 50% more cars in 1996 than in 1995, we still had three fatal vehicle accidents compared to none in 1995. We plan to emphasize motor vehicle enforcement even more in 1997 to further reduce the number of accidents and to combat the increase in traffic and what appears to be an increase of certain motor vehicle violations, such as red light violations.

We also initiated several new proactive programs such as trading cards for the kids, mountain bike patrols, and "Cops & Jocks". The programs overseen by our community policing officer, were very successful and we plan to continue and expand them. We are also putting a major emphasis on training and the number of training hours has increased significantly. We also added a police dog to the force. The officer and dog have just completed fourteen weeks of training at the Boston Police K-9 Academy, and we look forward to the increased services that this team will provide to our residents.

The staff and employees remain committed to give you the best trained and professional police department in the state. We thank all employees for their dedicated service and support in 1996. Our success is also made possible through the continued cooperation of all other town departments, and of course, you the citizens of Bedford.

### PLANNING DEPARTMENT Director: Karen White, AICP

For the third year, the Planning Director has been occupied almost exclusively in reviewing new construction proposals. The number of commercial and residential development plans in 1996 again exceeded the record for the previous year. Bedford's low tax rate and location make it a desirable area for all types of development. Over the past several years, the planning review process has been streamlined in preparation for a resurge in growth.

### **New Development**

Bedford is experiencing a renewed interest in both single-family and multi-family housing construction. The Planning Board approved 170 new house lots in 1996, and many more plans have already been submitted for review in 1997. Iron Horse Park was approved as a 204-unit apartment project. The Route 3 corridor has exploded with new and re-use commericial development, and the new square footage approved in 1996 is more than double the amount approved in 1995.

### **Zoning Administrator**

Accommodating telecommunications towers became a new challenge in 1996. The U.S. Congress passed a new act which requires local communities to allow these towers. A set of zoning amendments to regulate towers has been drafted for approval by the voters. Zoning enforcement activity has become much slower in 1996 due to the new development demands, and many violation reports have been re-assigned to other staff.

### **Geographic Information System**

Since 1990, the Planning Department has been working to integrate computerized mapping and data collection for a variety of departments. This year efforts were focused on developing an easy-to-use GIS program than every department can use to store and share data relating to parcels of land. Finance & Personnel Department Keith R. Hickey, Director

For the Finance Department, 1996 was a year of change. Tony Plante, the Finance Director over past eight years left to become Town Manager in Windham, Maine. Also, the Finance Department added two new part time staff members: an office assistant and computer network administrator.

The new MUNIS financial software went on line to start the year. The system is a vast improvement from the previous software which allows department heads on line budget information to assist in the financial management of their departments without risking the integrity of the information they are accessing. Although the entire system is not in place, it is expected that the rest will be in 1997.

There is one new proposal in the Finance Department budget to establish a records retention program. This program would satisfy two needs. The first would be to link common property information such as valuation and permit activity to a database which would allow access to all activity for a selected lot. The second would be establishing a program to retain records in a more orderly manner for better accessibility and to maximize storage space.

Bedford continues to see an increase in welfare applications from people who are unable to meet the needs of their household. Continued change in state and federal legislation puts a greater burden on the local communities to provide assistance to those who are in need.

I look forward to meeting as many residents as possible over the next year. I invite you to either stop by or call with any questions or concerns that you might have.

### PLANNING BOARD Paul Drahnak, Chairman

The number of plans submitted in 1996 confirmed there is a new commercial and residential building boom occurring in Bedford. In addition to reviewing plans for several large single-family subdivisions, the Planning Board approved 1 multi-unit development and accepted applications for two others in the Route 3 Performance Zone. This trend towards new housing is expected to carry forward into 1997, and is a indicator that the economy has recovered. The Planning Board anticipates Bedford's population will increase substantially over the next few years.

Your Planning Board is dedicated to the promotion of quality development which will have lasting value, both economically and aesthetically, for all of the property owners and residents in Town. Towards this end, we have been honored to serve the Town.

### BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT Sandra LaMontagne, Chairman

In 1996, the Zoning Board of Adjustment heard 44 applications for variances, special exceptions, and administrative appeals. Ten commercial and 28 residential requests were approved. No commercial and 6 residential requests were denied.

The Zoning Administrator handles inquiries from the public regarding zoning questions, and advises citizens on the Board's application procedure. The Board hears evidence for and against a variance, appeals from administrative decisions, and approvals of special exceptions. After hearing the evidence, the Board discusses the requests and votes in public session. Zoning Administrator, Karen White, attends our meetings and, provides information to Board members on the applications.

When an applicant makes a presentation before the Board for a variance, the following five criteria must be addressed:

- 1. No diminution in value of surrounding properties would be suffered.
- 2. Granting the variance would be of benefit to the public.
- Denial of the variance would result in unnecessary hardship to the owner seeking it.
- 4. By granting it, substantial justice would be done.
- 5. Use must not be contrary to the spirit of the ordinance.

Applicants not present at a meeting who wish to have someone speak for them must give written authorization for the representative.

Scheduled applicants wishing a postponement must do so within <u>seven</u> working days before the meeting and must pay for notification of abutters of the change, or the applicant will not be heard for <u>six</u> months. Anyone may appeal a Board ruling in writing within twenty days. The Board then has thirty days to determine if it will grant a rehearing based on new information in the request.

### PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT Edward S. Kelly, P. E., Director

The Department has four Divisions: Administrative, Highways (street and traffic maintenance), Solid Waste (Transfer Station and Landfill), and Wastewater (sewers). There are 20 full-time and 2 part-time employees.

### **HIGHWAY DIVISION**

Paul Belanger, Superintendent

During 1996, the Highway Division tended to 27 snow/ice storms, requiring crews to be dispatched 34 times. In retrospect, the overall weather for 1996 embodied "SNOW". The 100 year snow accumulation records were shattered with 120 inches. The 100 year, 24 hour maximum precipitation record of 4.9 inches was set on October 20th. We topped off the year with the December 7th-8th storm which reeked havoc with the downed power lines, leaving some families without power for five days. The Department continues to monitor the database established for costing storms separately and collectively in our on-going effort to provide safe/reliable service in a cost-effective manner.

The major project in 1996 was reconstruction of Strawberry Hill Road. The Town crews spent the summer on more general maintenance and drainage projects in preparation for reconstruction. Other roads that were paved include: Arbor Lane, Birkdale Road, Blueberry and Butterfield Lanes, Christmas Tree Circle, County Road, Davies St., Fox Run, Freedom Way, Hall St., Heather Dr., Kahliko Lane, Lark Lane, Lynn Dr., MacIntosh Lane, Mulberry Lane, New Merrimack Road, Oak Dr., Pasture Lane, Pine Dr., Plummer Road, Ridgewood Road, Royal St., Rumford Lane, Servant St., Stephen Dr., Swan Ave., Twin Brook Road, Wayside Dr., Woburn-Abbey Dr. A portion of the following were shimmed with asphalt (drag leveling): Chubbuck, Nashua, N. Amherst and Wallace.

The major project targeted in 1997 <u>phased</u> construction is Liberty Hill Road, estimated at \$640,000. As stated, construction will start in 1997, with the final (asphalt) wearing course to be placed in the year 2000.

### MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE DIVISION

The Transfer Station has 18 months of online service. The facility has proved to be a prudent design and remains a cost-effective operation.

The sampling of the monitoring wells at the Chubbuck Road Landfill as well as those on Nashua Road (underground storage tanks) continues to meet the standards established by EPA and DES. The final Landfill Closure plan continues to be reviewed by the state, with Phase One Closure targeted for implementation in mid to late 1997.

### WASTEWATER DIVISION Stephen R. Crean, Superintendent

The Bowman Brook sewer, that services the Bedford Village Inn and Constitution Drive has been on-line for 12 months. Other projects completed include: working with the State, School Board and Peter Thompson Assoc. to extend the sewer line to Peter Woodbury School. This project was a result of the schools septic system failure. The project went from design to operation in less than five weeks. Other connections include: NH Housing & Finance Authority, Outback Steak House, Ray's Country Store, Village Green, UNUM Life and Harmony Learning Center.

Designs for a Route 101 (Village Shoppes/Vista) project were done and assuming the construction estimates are within the participants budget, construction could commence in 1997. Other 1997 projects include: Greenfield Farms, Iron Horse Park, major apartment and townhouse developments on South River Road.

### **BEDFORD COMMUNITY TELEVISION**

On March 19, 1996, Assistant Superintendent of Schools, Ross Lurgio, assembled a group of five volunteers, forming the Bedford Community Television Committee. Their purpose was to discuss and formulate a working plan for the continued development of a Public Access television channel. These five were: Mike Abbene, Joe Biedrzycki, Lauren Horton, Dave Kirsch and Bill Robersen. In early May, Mary Danielson joined the committee.

Throughout the spring, the committee researched existing PEG access operations from towns including Goffstown, Londonderry and Concord, and met with the directors of similar systems in Manchester and Newport, NH. Their first official task was to create a set of policies and procedures which would lay the foundation for the operation of Bedford Community Television-BCTV. The first edition of this document was completed in May and presented to the Town Council at their June 14 meeting. It was approved.

The ad-hoc committee's next task was to put itself out of business as a town committee by forming a permanent body, a Board of Overseers, to direct and administer the operation of Channel 40. The by-laws of the Board were presented to, and approved by, the Town Council on July 19, 1996. Also at that meeting the six members of the existing ad-hoc committee were approved by the Council as the charter members of the Board, with the addition of a member of the school committee (Linda Camarota), and a member of the Town Council (Tom Riley or Ed Moran). Assistant Superintendent of Schools, Ross Lurgio, and the Town Manager, represented by her appointee, Fran Wiggin, joined the Board as non-voting, ex-officio members. In addition, the Town Council appointed this Board as the "Access Provider" for the purpose of operating and managing the use of PEG access channel and the facilities on the cable system.

At the Board's meeting of July 30, a slate of officers was elected to include Joe Biedrzycki as Chair, Lauren Horton as Vice Chair, and Mary Danielson as Secretary. These appointments are subject to reconfirmation by the Board in May of 1997. In August, the Board worked on establishing continuity with the Community Bulletin Board on the channel and began videotaping select meetings of the Town Council and School Board, fulfilling the education and government goals of a PEG channel. Late in the month, the eleventh member of the Board of Overseers was selected following a public search, Joyceann Fitzgerald-Guill. Also at this time a part-time technician was hired to manage the operation of the channel.

In September, the Board had a half day retreat to establish a "master plan" and set priorities for continued development of the channel. A timeline was established to chart the progress of items including staff, budget, facilities, programming and training.

Throughout the fall months, BCTV continued to refine the format and effectiveness of the Community Bulletin Board, and continued to add programming, including some shows "bicycled", or borrowed from Manchester's MCTV, Channel 40. The Board also submitted a budget proposal to the Town Council for calendar year 1997, and projected budgetary needs through the year 2000.

At year's end, the Board advertised for a full-time Station Coordinator, and following an interview process, selected Roger Richard of Goffstown, who will begin this position effective January 20, 1997.

Among the goals for 1997 are the remodeling of the old fire station annex for relocation of the channel to a permanent facility there in early March. BCTV will also continue to supplement its equipment and technical capabilities.

Continued training of community volunteers is a priority, as this will ultimately result in increased programming on the channel. And it will fulfill the objective of the project: "to help bring about the democratic use of on-air cablecasting by helping the Bedford community gain access to and effectively use television for non-commercial communication at the local level.

### LANDFILL CLOSURE FINANCING ON WARRANT

ARTICLE 3 to be voted at Budgetary Meeting and needs a two-thirds vote for approval. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1.5 million plus interest for the purpose of costs related to the final closure of the Chubbuck Road Landfill. Such sum to be partially funded by capital reserves and a State grant, and to authorize the Town Council to enter into financing under the State of New Hampshire revolving loan fund, and to take such other action as may be necessary to effect the financing as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Bedford, and pass any vote relating there to.

The Chubbuck Road Landfill was developed in 1970 to accept domestic solid waste from the Town of Bedford. During its 25 years of operation, over 200,000 tons of solid waste has been landfilled at the site. Over its 25 years of operation, the Town has taken many steps to protect the quality of the ground water in the area of the Landfill. In 1984 the Bedford Conservation Commission and Normandeau Associates installed ground water testing wells around the landfill. In 1990 TWM Northeast prepared a hydrological investigation of the site. From 1986 to the present the Town has had a program of testing ground water wells around the Landfill. In May of 1995, the Town opened the new Transfer Station and stopped accepting solid waste at the Landfill.

Over the last eight years, the Town has been working with the State of New Hampshire, Department of Environmental Services and private consultants to develop a plan to permanently cap the Landfill. The final cap involves placing a plastic liner much like a swimming pool liner over the 10 acre site. The main function of the cap is to prevent rain water from flowing through the solid waste and contaminating the ground water. If the State approves the Town's plan, construction could begin in 1997. The cost is estimated at \$1,500,000 and will be paid by a combination of future taxes, state grants, state loans, and money set aside by the Town over the last several years.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1.) Closure costs of \$1,500,000 will be financed through the State revolving loan program for which application has already been made. Interest for ten years is calculated on 1/2 of the going rate for general obligation bonds. Interest for five is 1/2 of the ten year rate, and twenty years is calculated at 1.5% of the ten year rate. First year interest is 1%.

2.) A State grant of 20%, 370,000, of total costs will be received in ten installments.

3.) Total cost of the closure including engineering, wells, and preliminary shaping will total \$1,850,000.

4). Reserve of \$383,525 saved by the Town will be used in installments to assist in the payment of the loan with the reserve balance continuing to accrue interest at approximately 4%.

### <u>NH MUNICIPAL ASSOCIATION</u> John B. Andrews, Executive Director

1996 has been a very successful year for NHMA. Membership includes 233 of New Hampshire's 234 towns and cities. We trained over 4,000 local officials and employees in workshops, seminars, job site visits and our annual conferences. Some sessions have been Standing Room Only!

We implemented much of the feedback we got from members in last year's survey to evaluate current services and tell us how to improve them for members. Where the results required additional staff (such as another attorney), we phased positions in by asking for only a partial year of funding. The 1997 budget carries those costs for a full year. In addition, the 1997 budget provides for a second full-time position to represent municipal concerns at the Legislature. Initially this position will work exclusively on legislative matters relating to the deregulation of electric utilities, the taxation of utilities (especially since the loss of taxation of poles, wires and switching equipment) and the regulation/taxation of new technologies such as wireless communication systems. For nearly 10 years we've had only one staff person working on municipal legislative issues and, it's not sufficient to do the job given the number and complexity of bills and their impact on communities.

NHMA has taken a leadership role in electric rate deregulation before the PUC by engaging outside counsel and a utility valuation expert. This effort is being partially funded by some of our operating reserves in order to "get the ball rolling", but we'll shortly be sending out a separate request for 7¢ per capita to help pay for this critical effort (Minimum of \$100....Maximum of \$5,000).

The Association's Health Trust has grown, in spite of competition, to serve over 25,000 local government and school employees. Property-Liability risk management declared another record dividend of \$1,900,000 with most Trust participants receiving many times their annual dues as dividends.

This 1997 budget request comes at a time when New Hampshire has a strong economy and when it is more critical than ever that all communities unite on major issues. ### CEMETERY TRUSTEES

Chairman : Robert Sundeen Ralph Wiggin & Doris Peck Spurway

The Cemetery Trustees have been working this past year on the expansion of the Center Cemetery which lies beyond the bounds of the stone walls at the top of Cemetery Hill. Land was left for this purpose to the Town by the Burleigh Family. The land has been surveyed, test boring made for burial suitability, etc. In 1997 tree clearing will begin and the roadways laid out.

This year the Trustees sold 12 lots of which six were 4-place lots and six were 2-place. Over the year there has been 10 full burials and four cremations; three deeds or transfers were replaced where the originals were lost. For information, cemetery rules state that the in-ground planting of plants, shrubs or trees is prohibited on cemetery lots. Live vegetation is permitted if placed in an urn or pot, and more than two requires permission from the Trustees. ARTIFICIAL FLOW-ERS OF ALL TYPES ARE NOT AL-LOWED.

The four cemeteries in Bedford are cared for by a superintendent under the direction of the Cemetery Trustees. Any inquiries or questions should be directed to a Trustee.

### FIRE DEPARTMENT Chief: Robert A. Fabich, Sr.

As constant changes in fire and rescue services occur, Bedford maintains current training and equipment to meet them. This year Bedford received a Ford Type I Ambulance equipped to handle storage and room requirements for the changing world of emergency medical services. Bedford also purchased a 12 Lead Heart Monitor Defibrillator. This purchase of \$14,255.10 was shared by Optima Health Care, Bedford Firefighters Association, Rescue Fund and the Town of Bedford. The unit has the capability to transmit telemetry from the patient's home to the emergency room physician.

In February, 12 members of the Department attended an 80 hour Hazardous Material Technician Class receiving state certification as Hazardous Material Technicians. In other areas of training the Call Department continues to advance in training levels.

Personnel changes for the year include the retirement of Captain Leroy Burbank with 24 years of service as a full-time member and 16 years as a Call Firefighter. New Call Firefighters include John Ackerson, Thomas Green, Steven Goupil and James Squires. New Part-time Firefighters include William Greenwood, Gregory Bolduc and Scott Tice. The Department continues to increase call volume. In 1996 we were fortunate to keep property loss to \$170,000 with only one major structural fire. The Department was taxed with a couple of weather related storms resulting in power outages for three to four days generating numerous fire responses.

The Bedford Fire Fighters Association again sponsored the Norman Richards Memorial Scholarship to Robert S. McMillan, Matthew W. Schnaars, Derek J. Vandegrift and Sarah Przybyla. To date, more than \$53,000 has been awarded to high school students seeking education in the emergency service field.

We have been fortunate this year to add an inspector to our staff to help serve the community in a more efficient manner. With the increase in construction activity in commercial, industrial and multi-family construction as well as, the continued steady. activity in residential construction, we found that the work load for a single inspector was excessive. The new inspector has taken the majority of the workload for residential construction, thus allowing us to respond to plan review, inspections and response to complaints in a timely manner.

The Town is self-inspecting which means the Town's Health Officer is responsible for the public health in all food service establishments, nursing homes, preschools, foster homes, daycare center, public kitchens and temporary food services. In 1996, there were 75 food service establishments licensed. Each unit is licensed annually and inspected twice per year to assure compliance with the State Health and Sanitation Code.

Although the primary function of this office is food handling inspections, we also respond to complaints regarding failed septic systems, housing complaints for rental property and review drawings submitted for all new food service establishments and remodeling of existing facilities in all food service establishments, nursing homes, preschools, foster homes, daycare centers, public kitchens and temporary food services.

### TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS Loyd Dollins, David Matta, & Roy Stewart

The Trustees of the Trust Funds are charged with the responsibility of managing funds that have been set aside by individuals, Town Departments, and by the School District, for specific purposes. The largest number of accounts have been set up by individuals for the perpetual care of certain Town cemeteries and graves. We also have individual trusts for other purposes including the Presbyterian Church, the Library, and a prize fund for an annual speaking contest at McKelvie School. However, the largest dollar amounts are funds deposited by the Town and the School District. These include accounts for purposes such as the landfill closure, the purchase of heavy equipment, and capital and maintenance costs.

The funds deposited with the Trustees have grown steadily over the last few years due to significant amounts set aside by the Town and School District. This has caused the Trustees to make some investment changes in order to better manage them. The most significant change in 1996 has been to transfer most of the balances from commercial and savings bank accounts to the New Hampshire Public Deposit Investment Pool in Concord. This investment fund has been set up to assist public entities in New Hampshire to obtain higher market rates of return on their accounts through professional fund management and to ensure that the balances are invested in securities that have very low risk and comply with regulatory requirements regarding permissible investments. Additional benefits include liquidity of the funds and significant assistance with state required record keeping.

The following reports detail all of the funds in our custody and the activity for the year ending December 31, 1996.
